





In non-metro Ontario, the percent of female partners in couple families¹ reporting some Employment Insurance benefits was 10% in 2014







In non-metro Ontario, the percent of parents in lone parent families with income who reported some Employment Insurance benefits was 12% in 2014




























The percent of couple families¹ reporting some Employment Insurance benefits: Chatham-Kent CA²




















