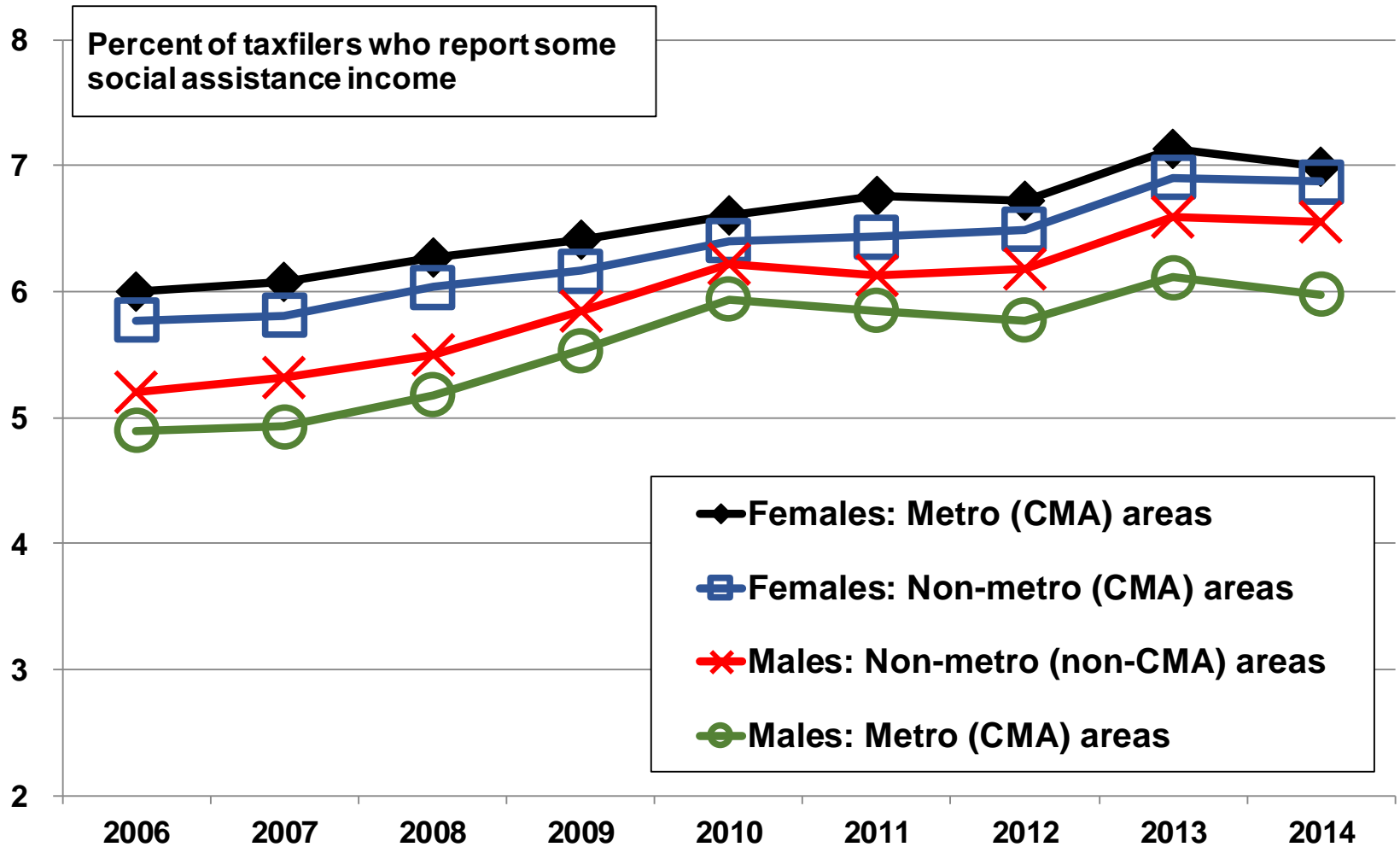

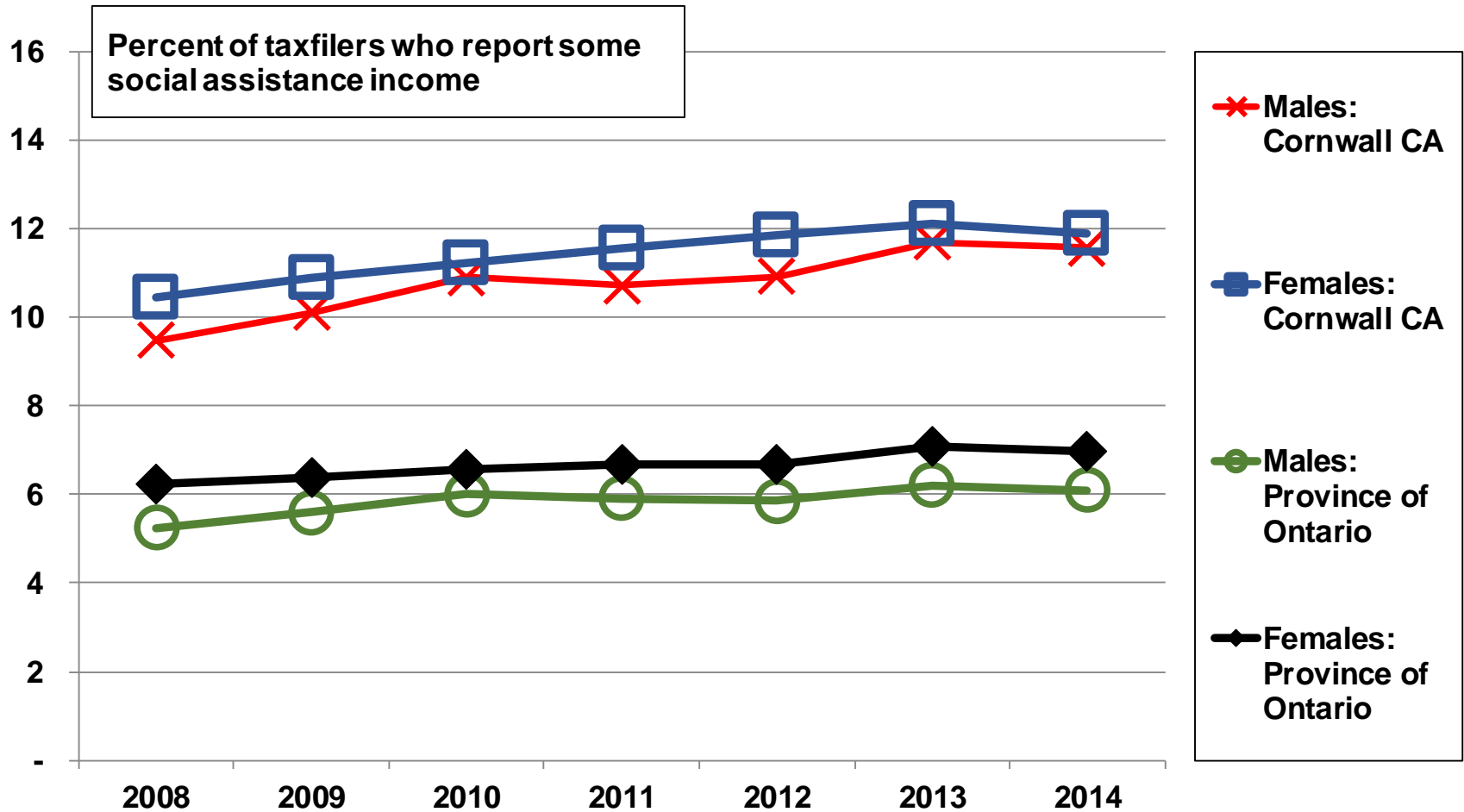

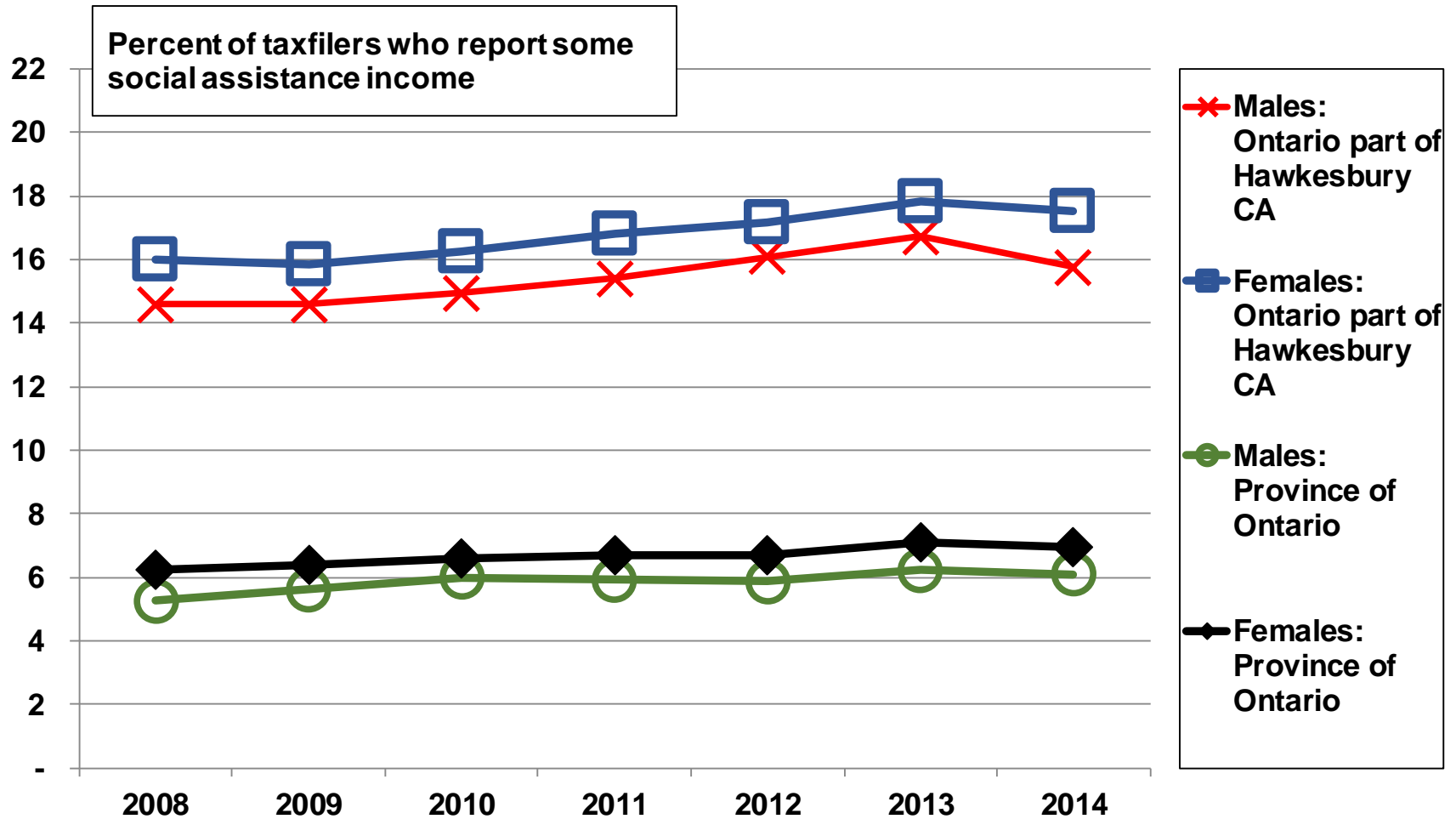

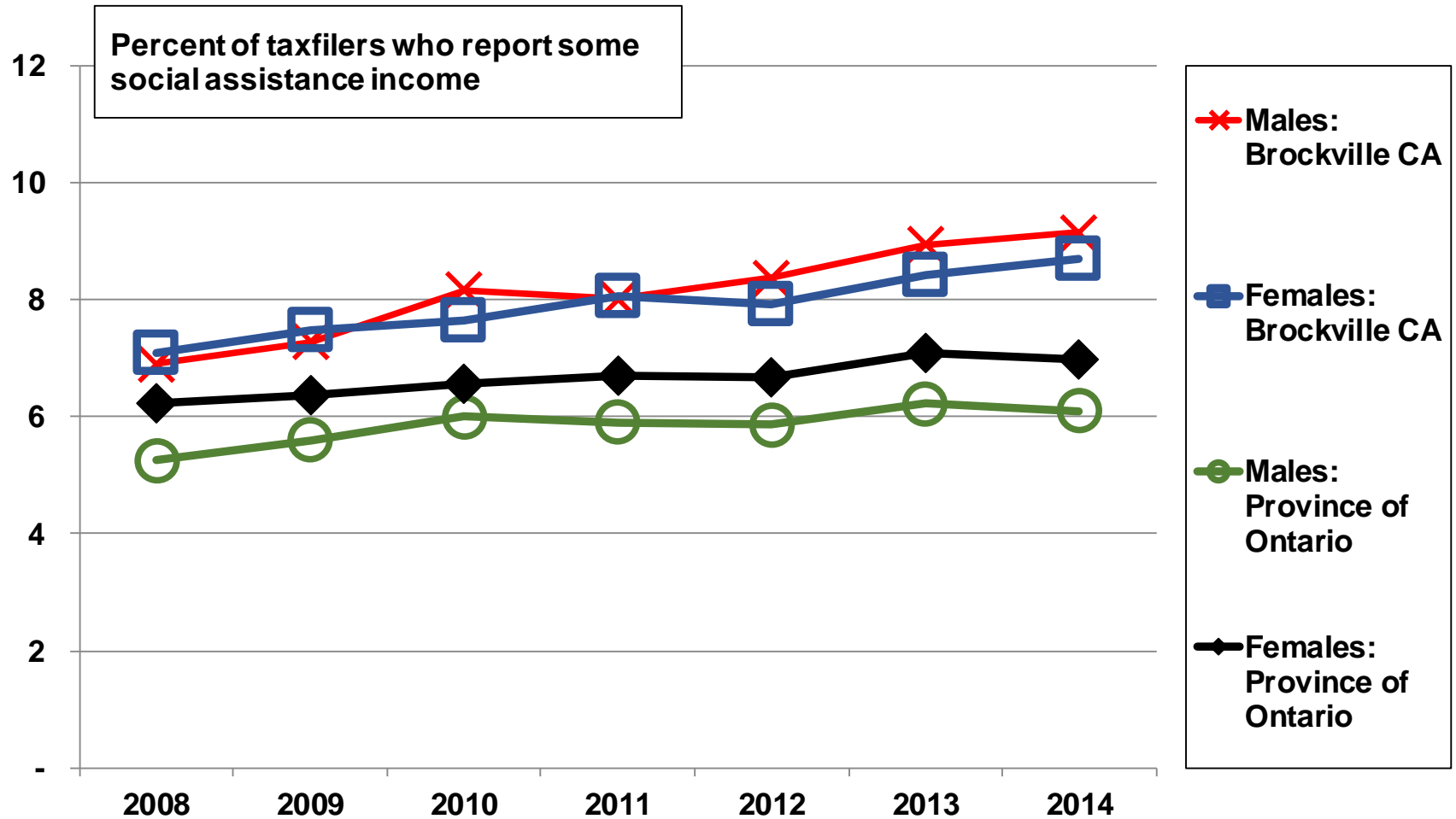

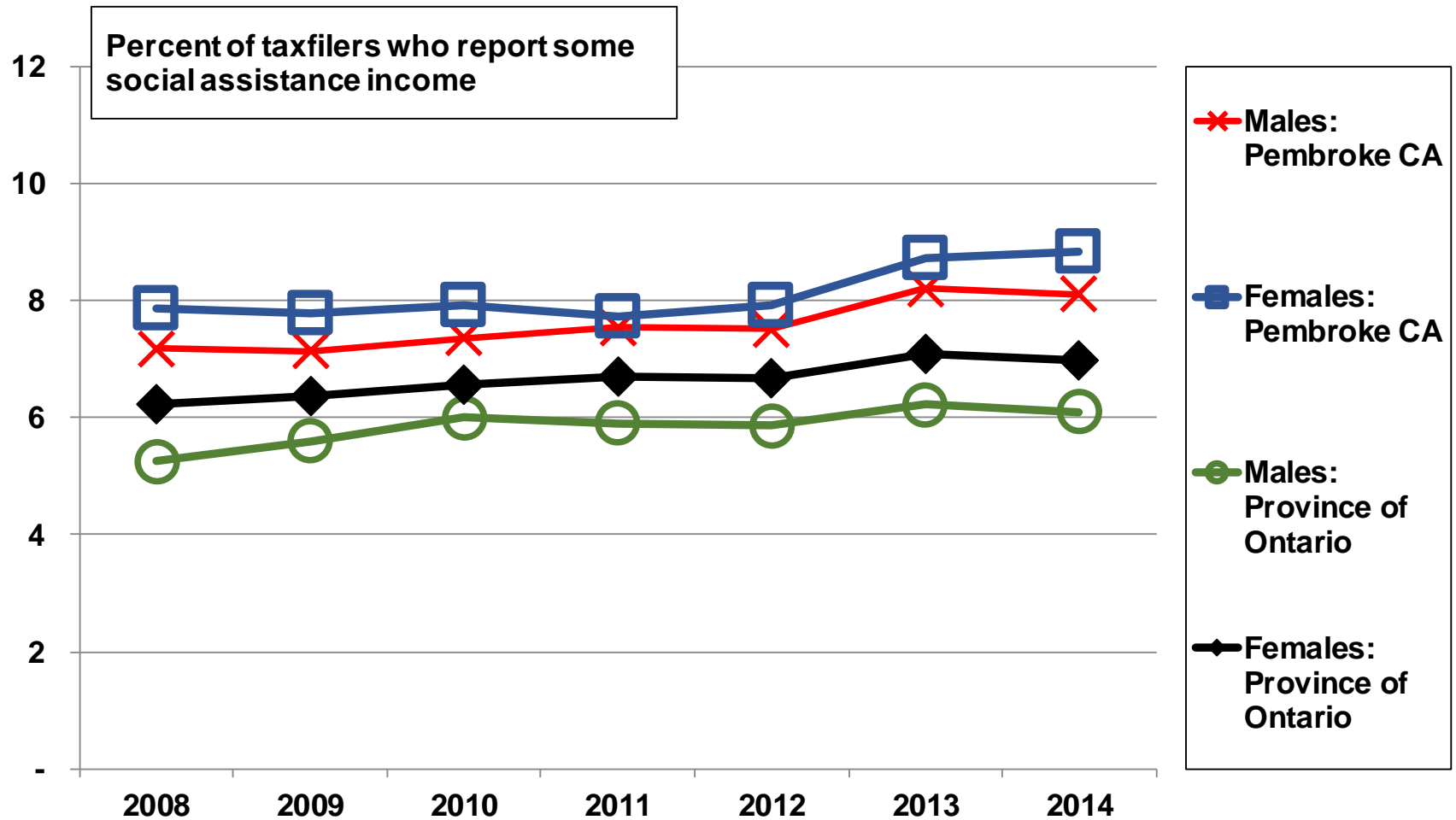

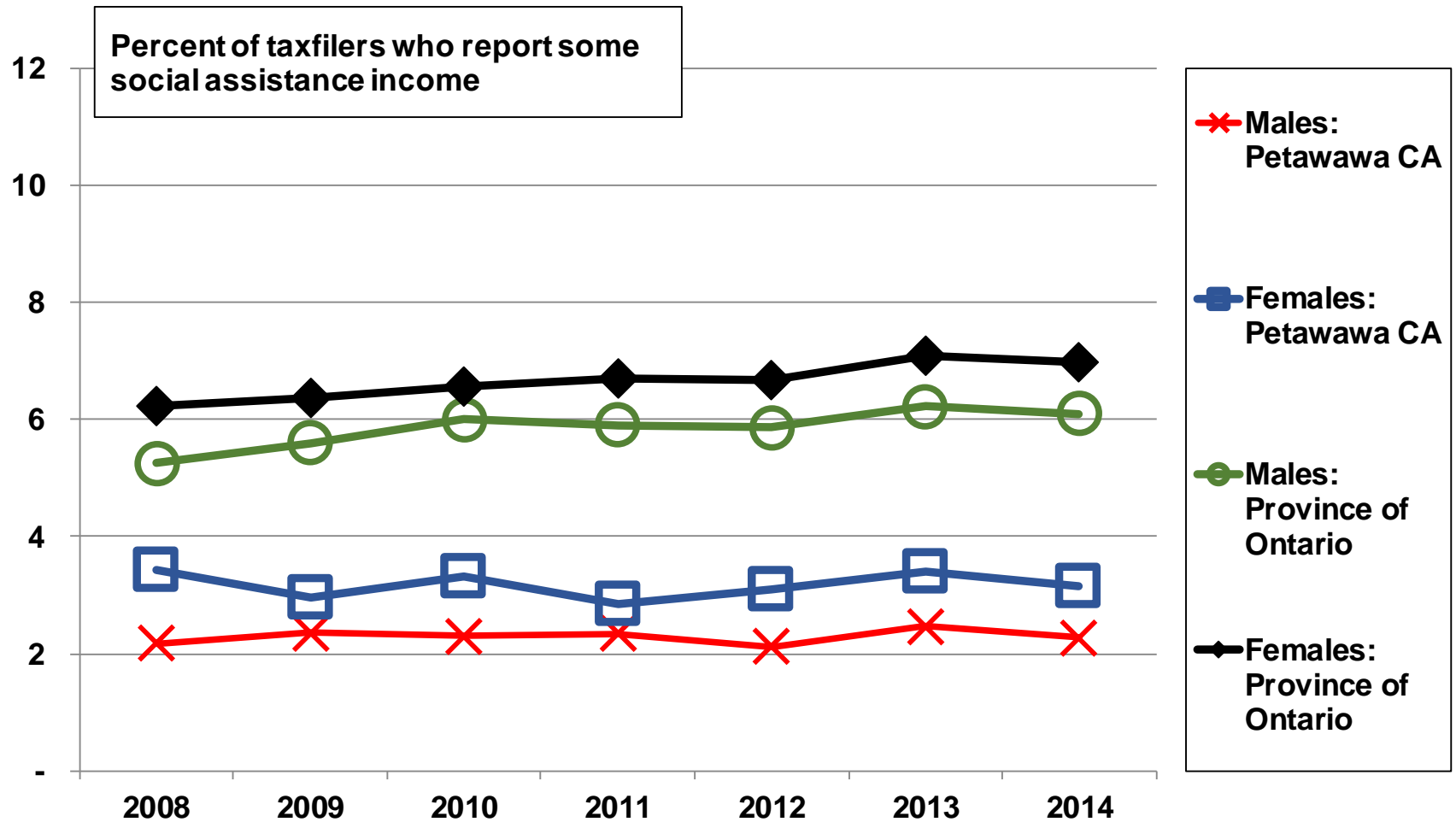

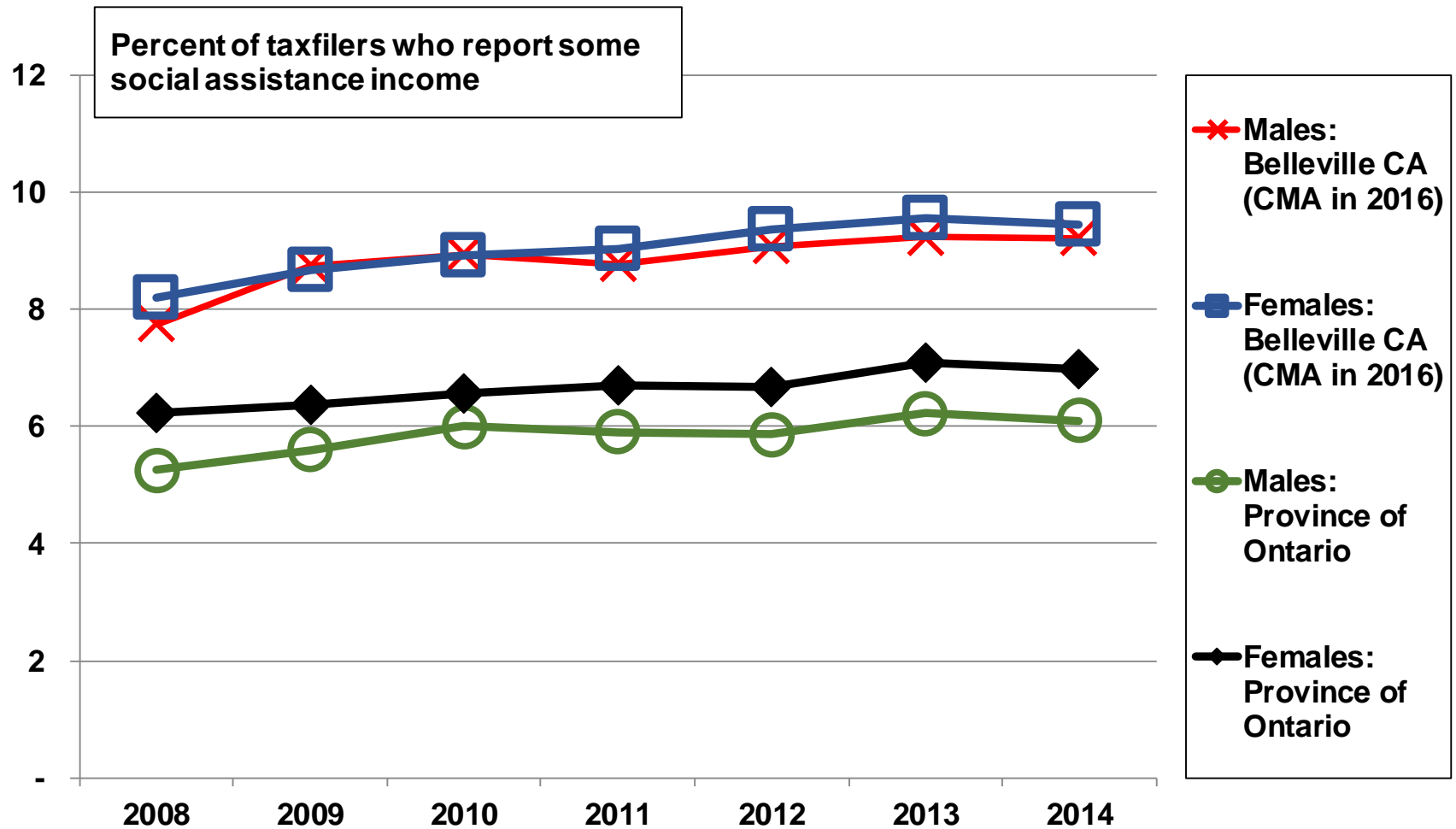

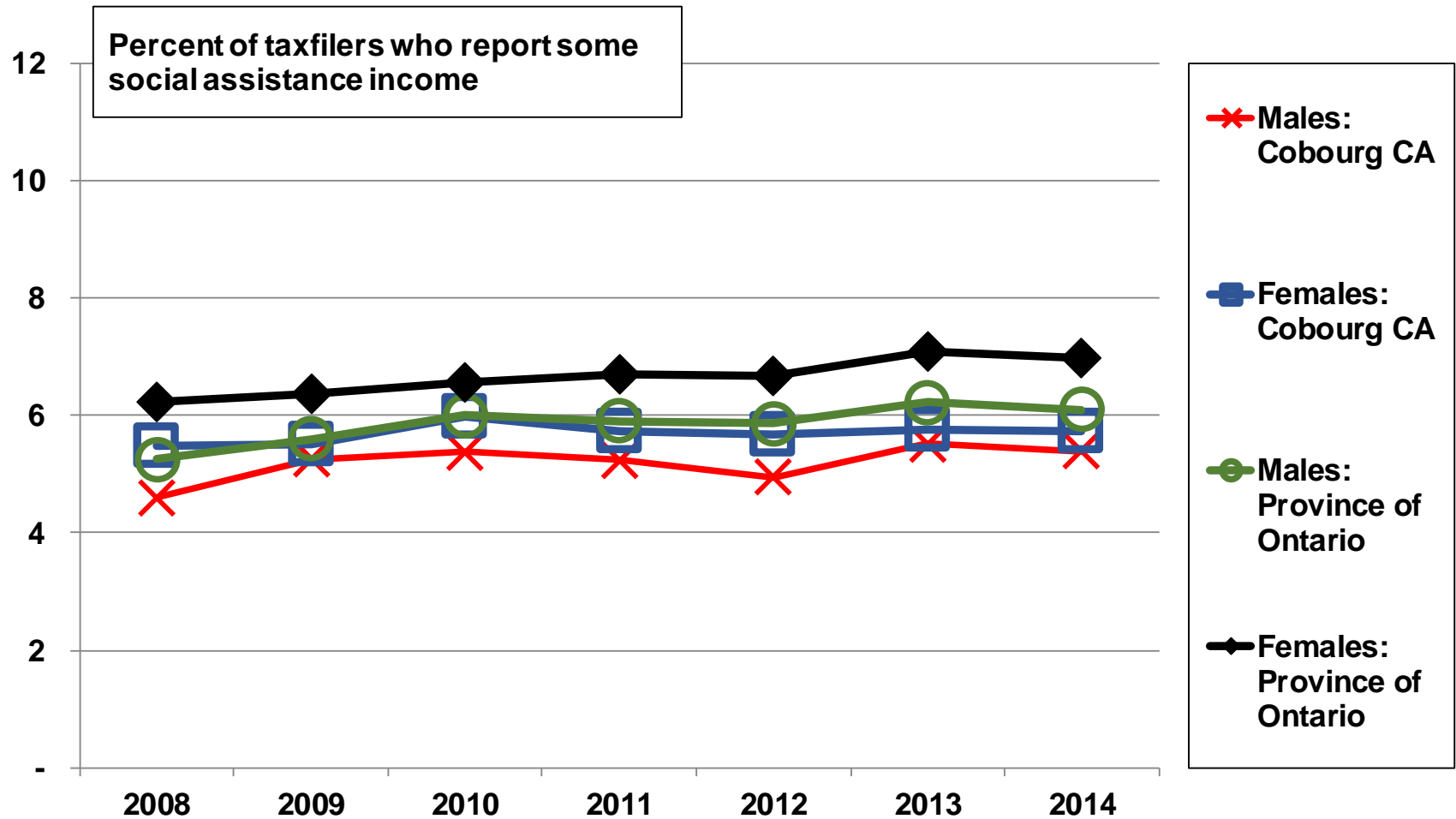
The percent of taxfilers reporting some social assistance income: Belleville CA¹ (CMA in 2016)

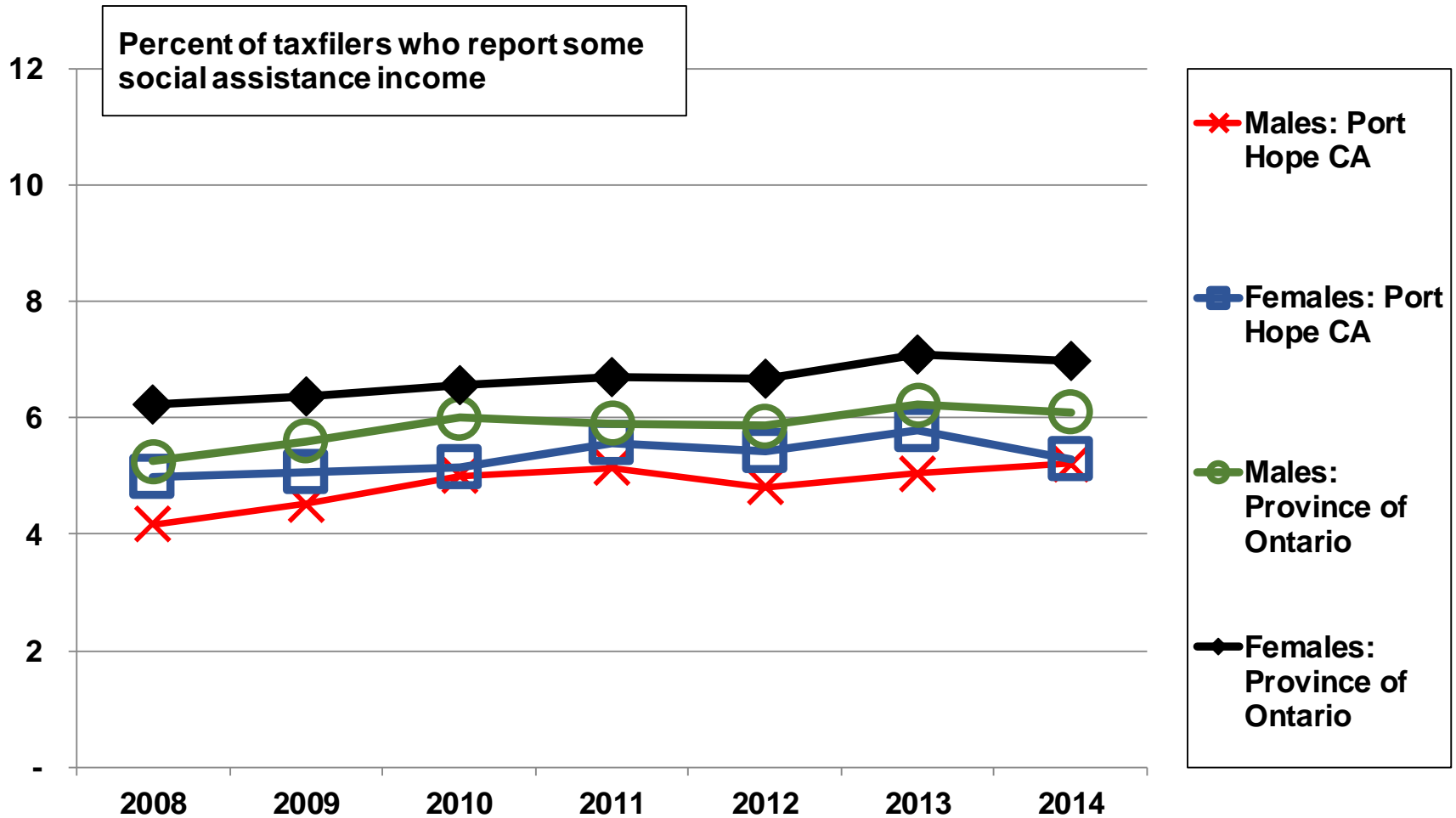

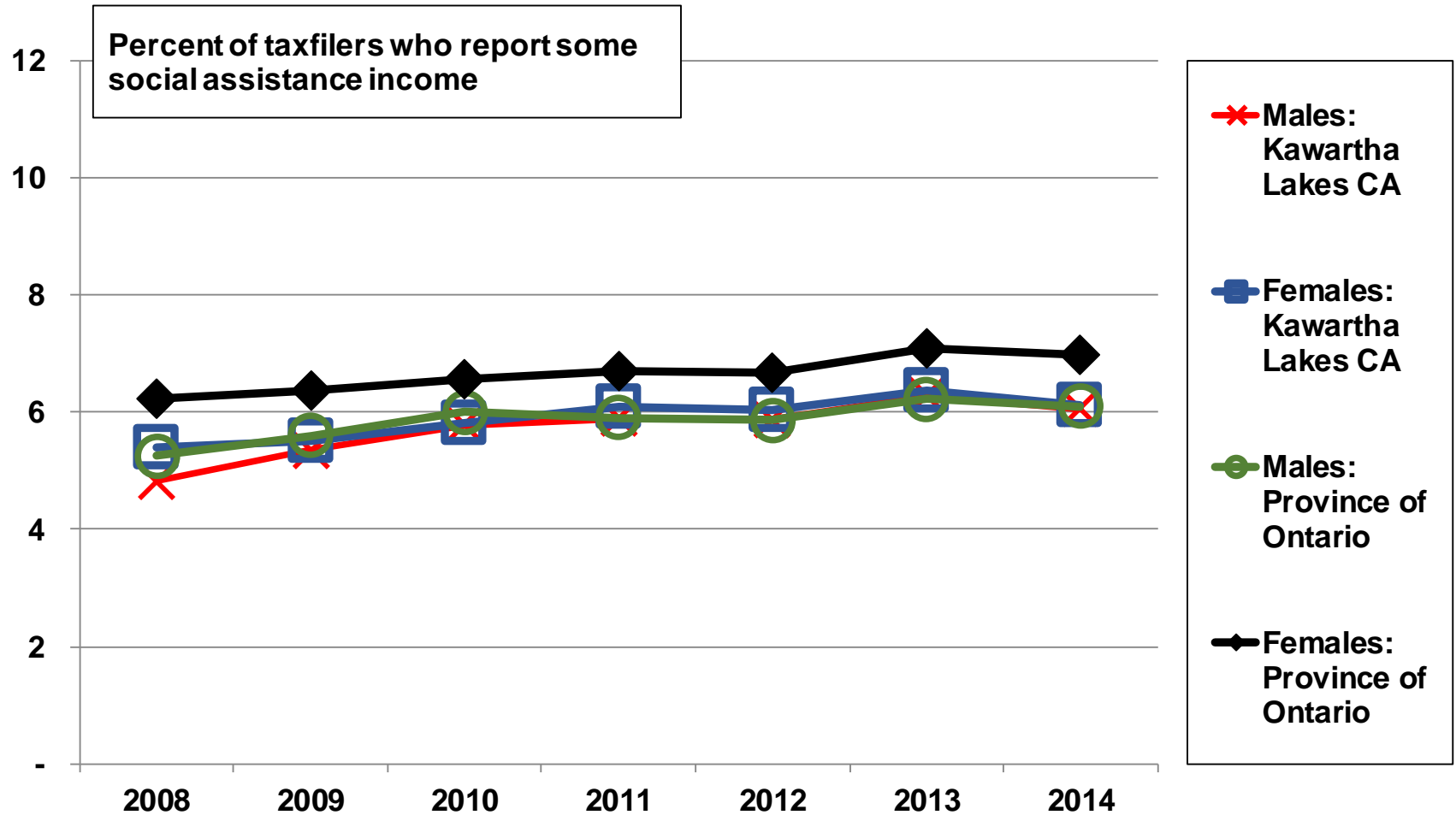

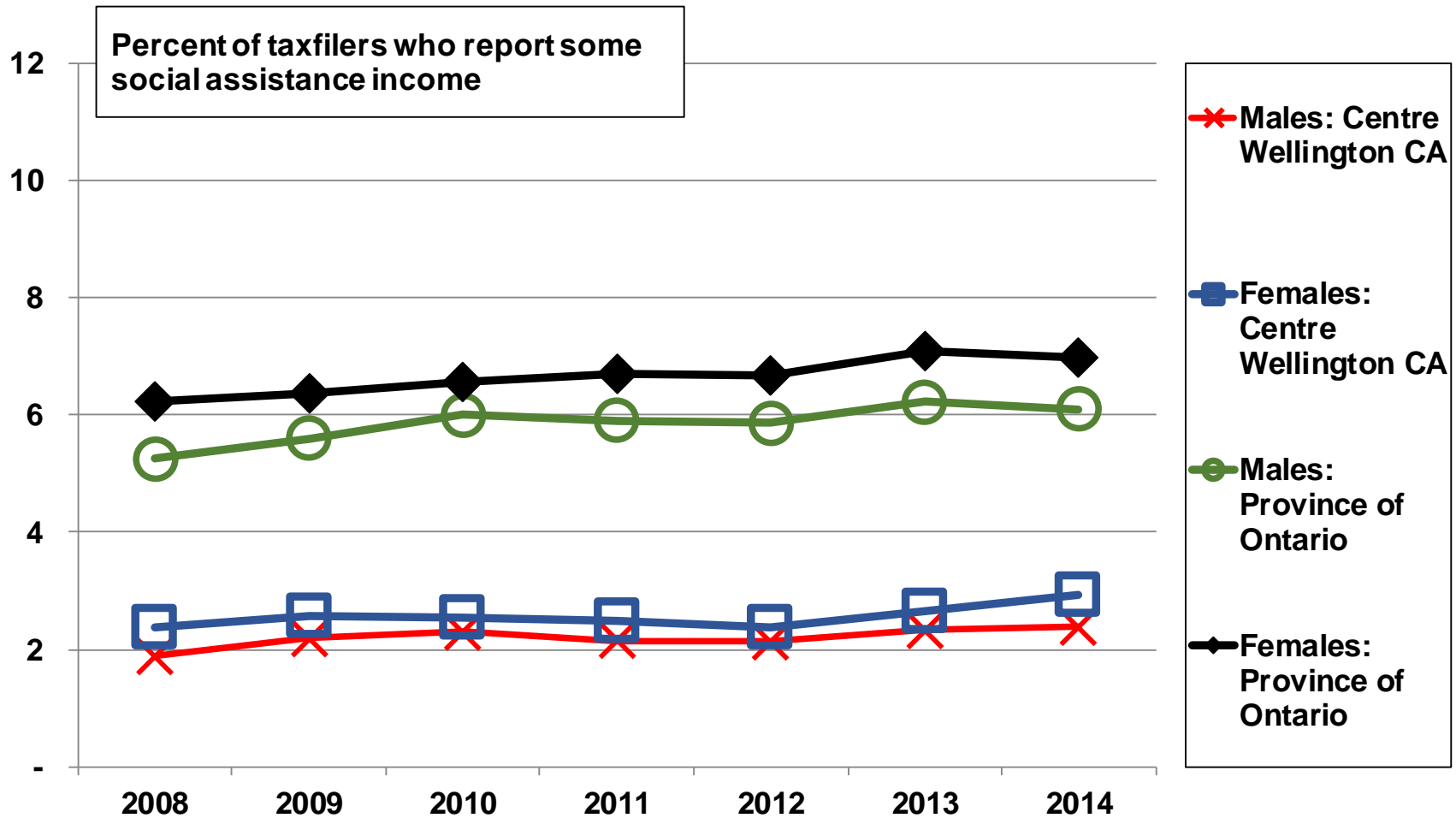
The percent of taxfilers reporting some social assistance income: Kawartha Lakes CA¹

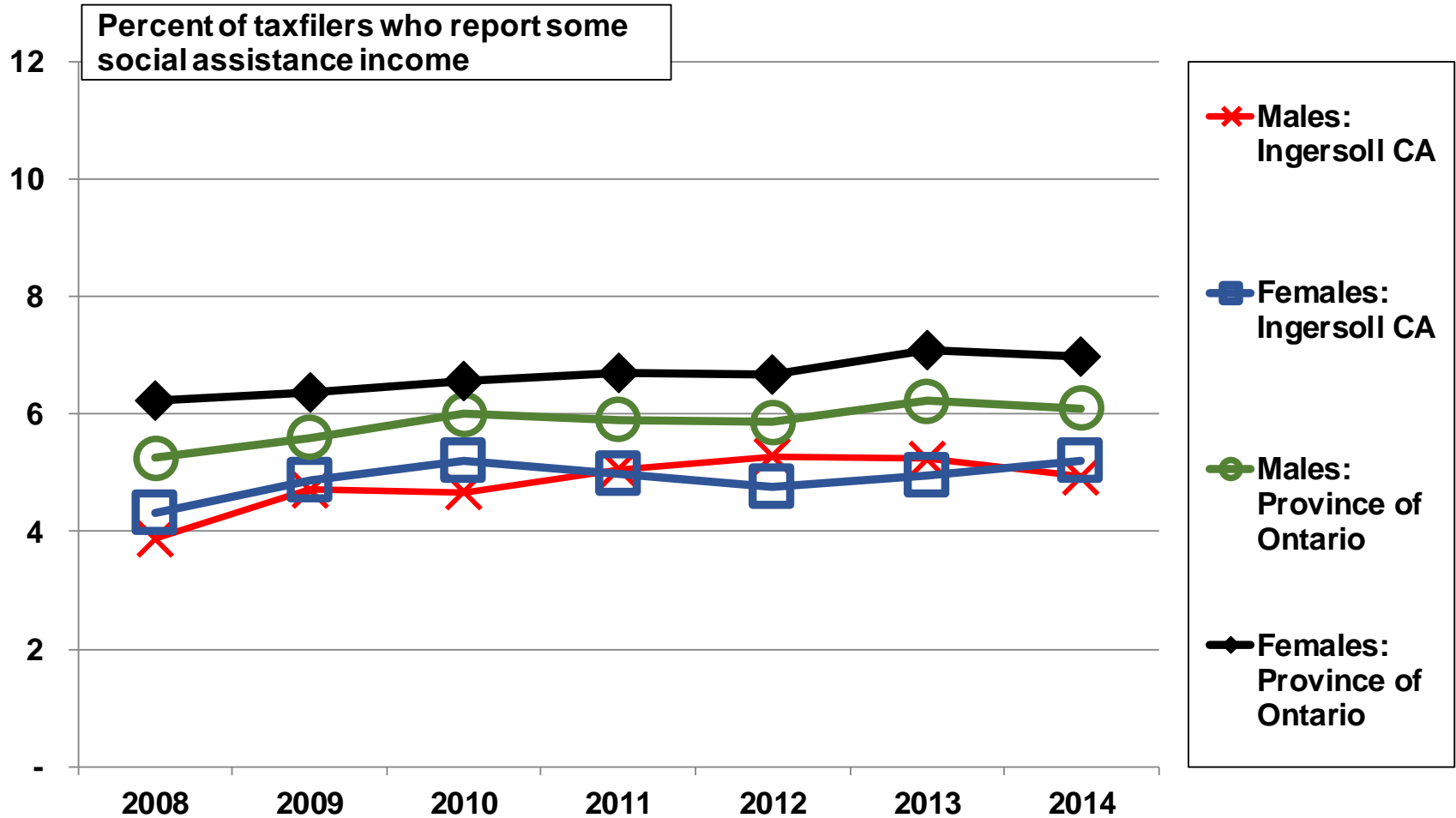

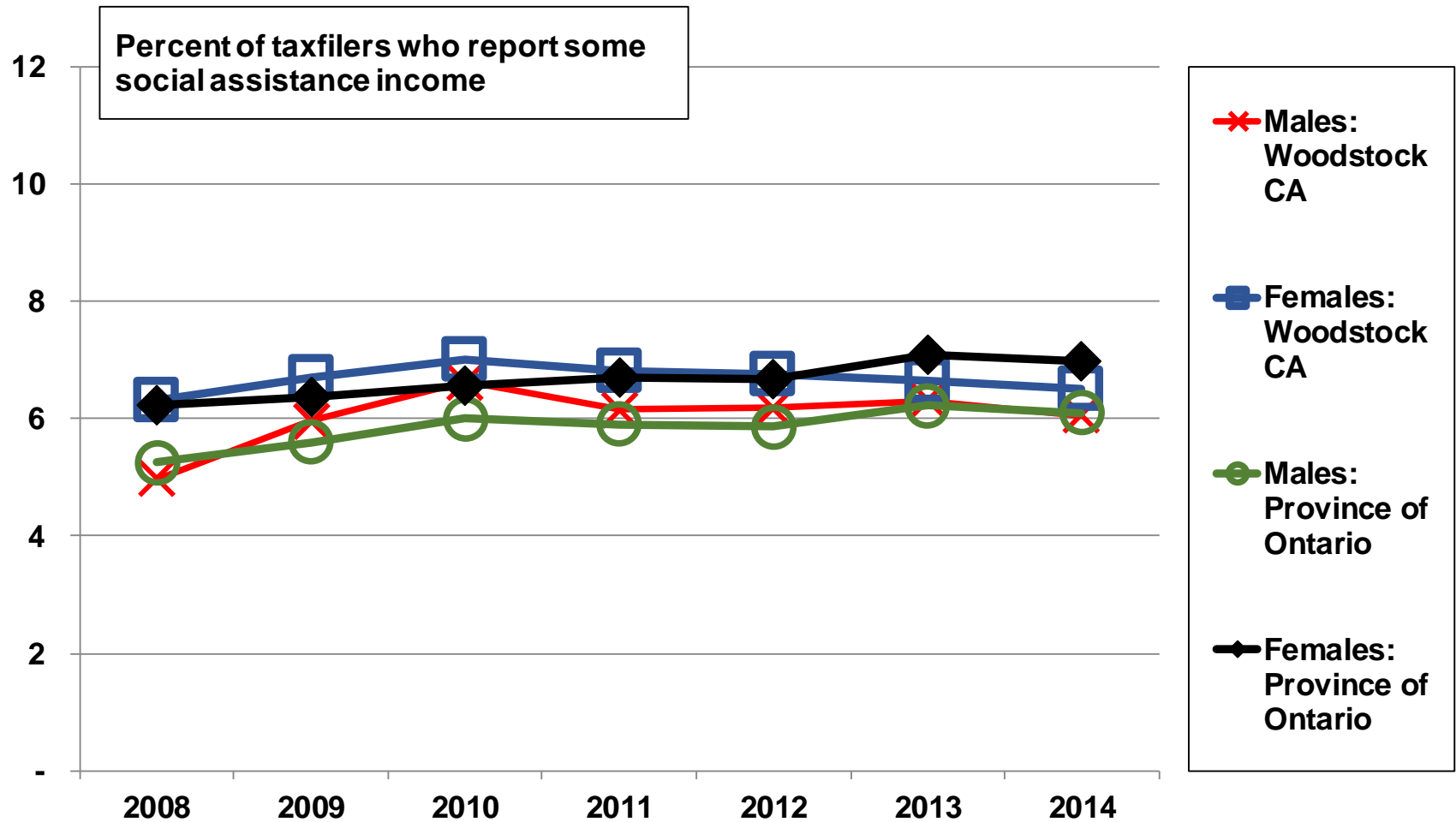

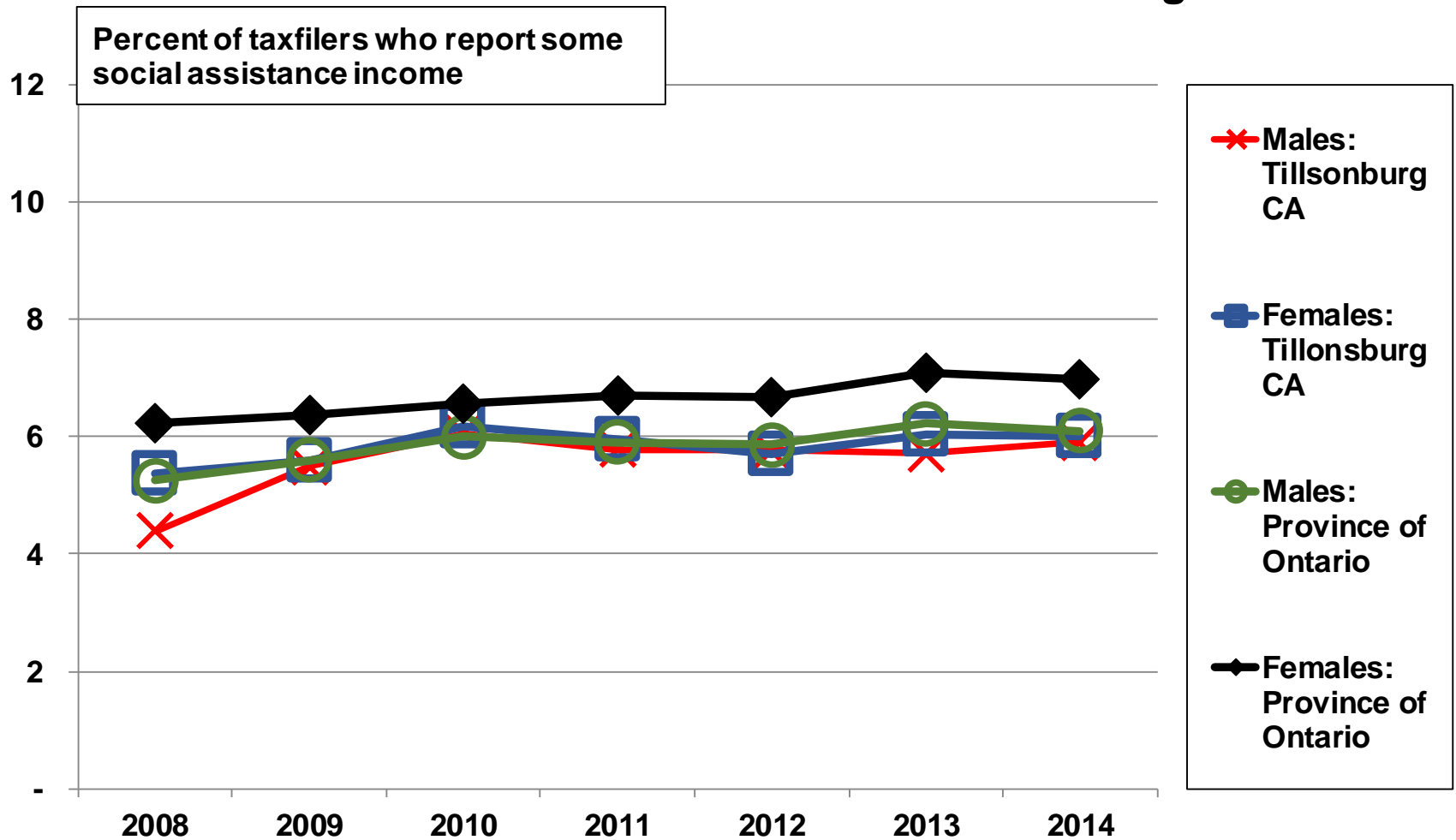
The percent of taxfilers reporting some social assistance income: Woodstock CA¹

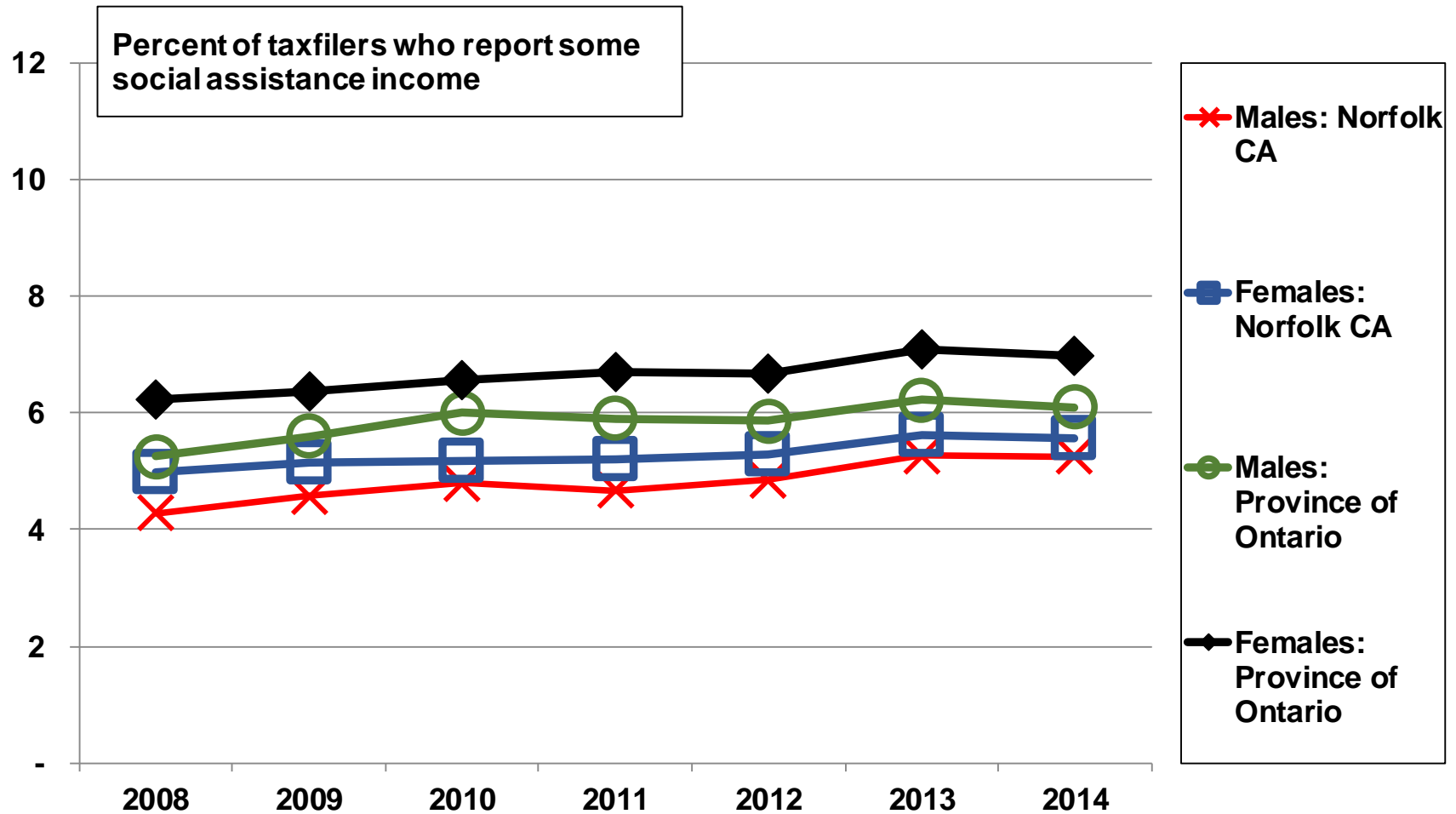
The percent of taxfilers reporting some social assistance income: Tillsonburg CA¹

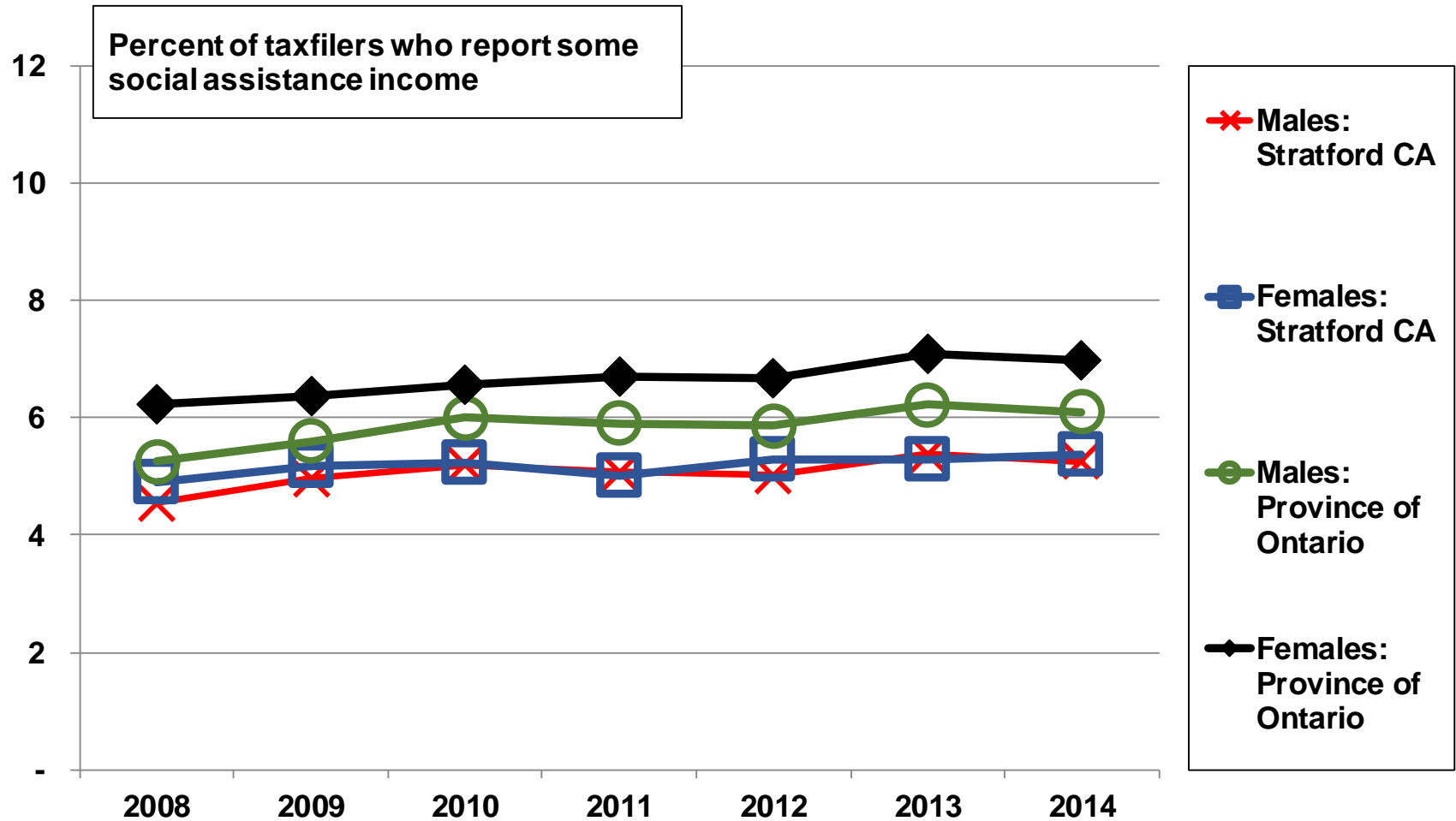
The percent of taxfilers reporting some social assistance income: Norfolk CA¹

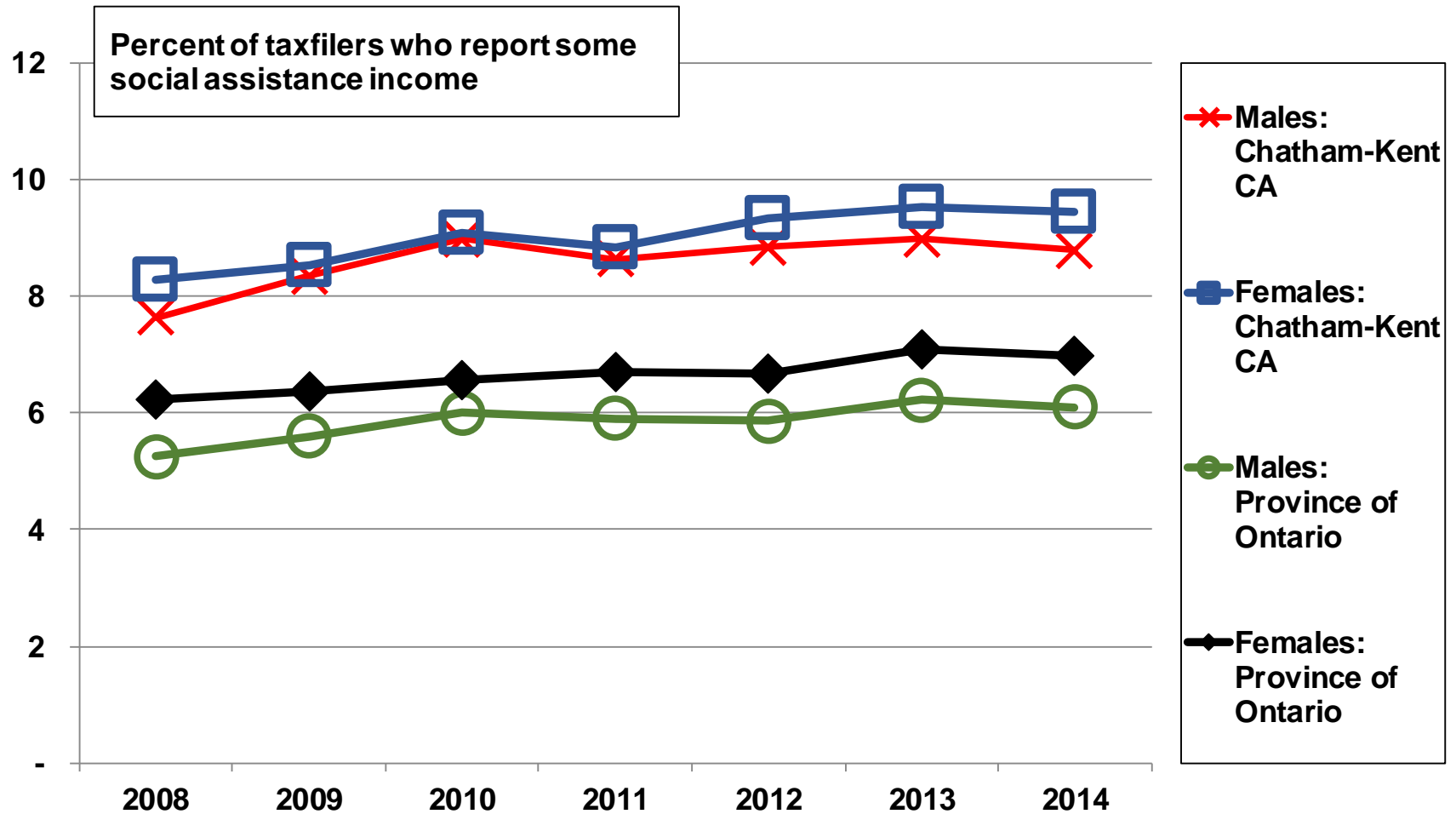
The percent of taxfilers reporting some social assistance income: Stratford CA¹

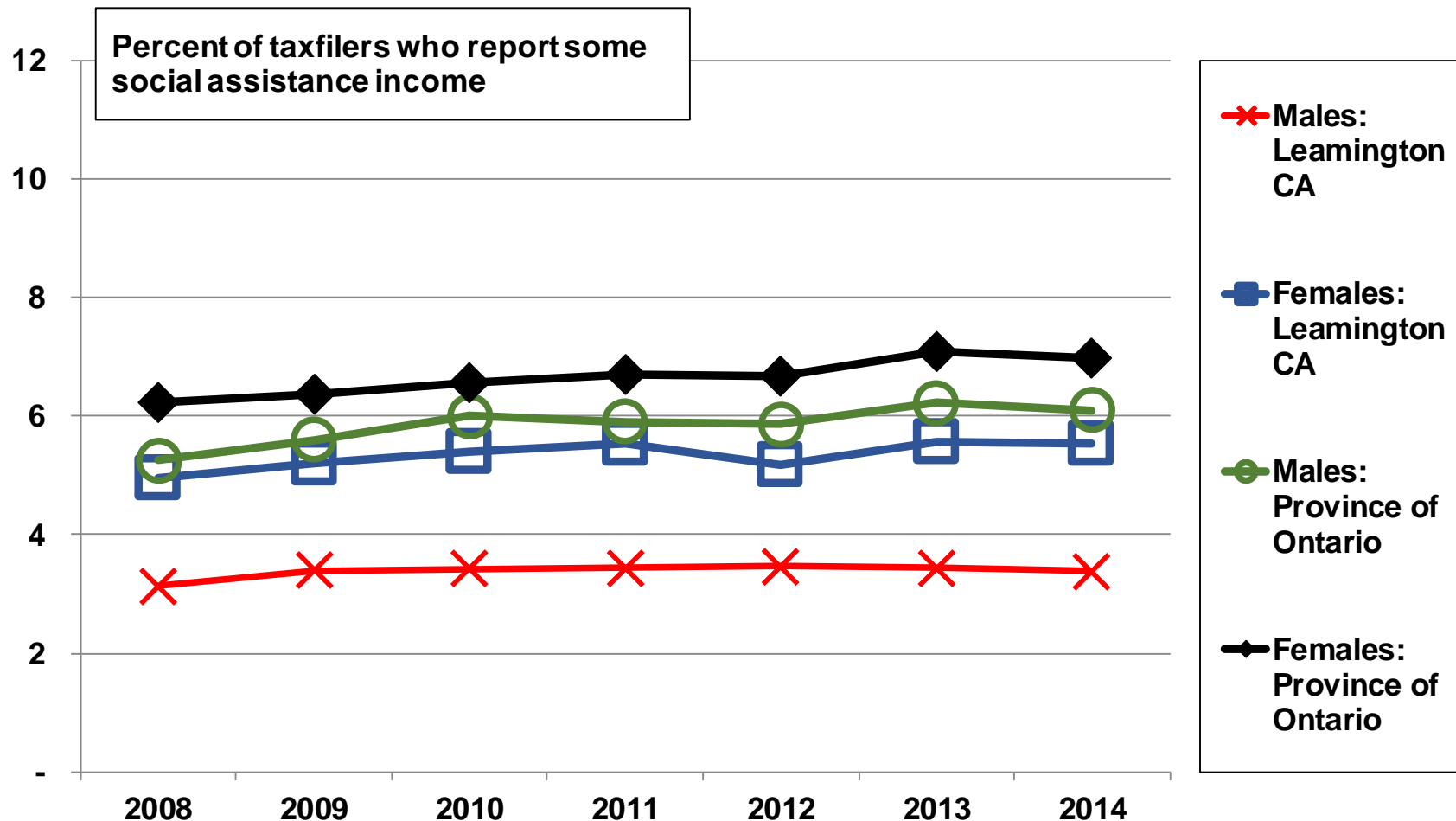
The percent of taxfilers reporting some social assistance income: Chatham-Kent CA¹

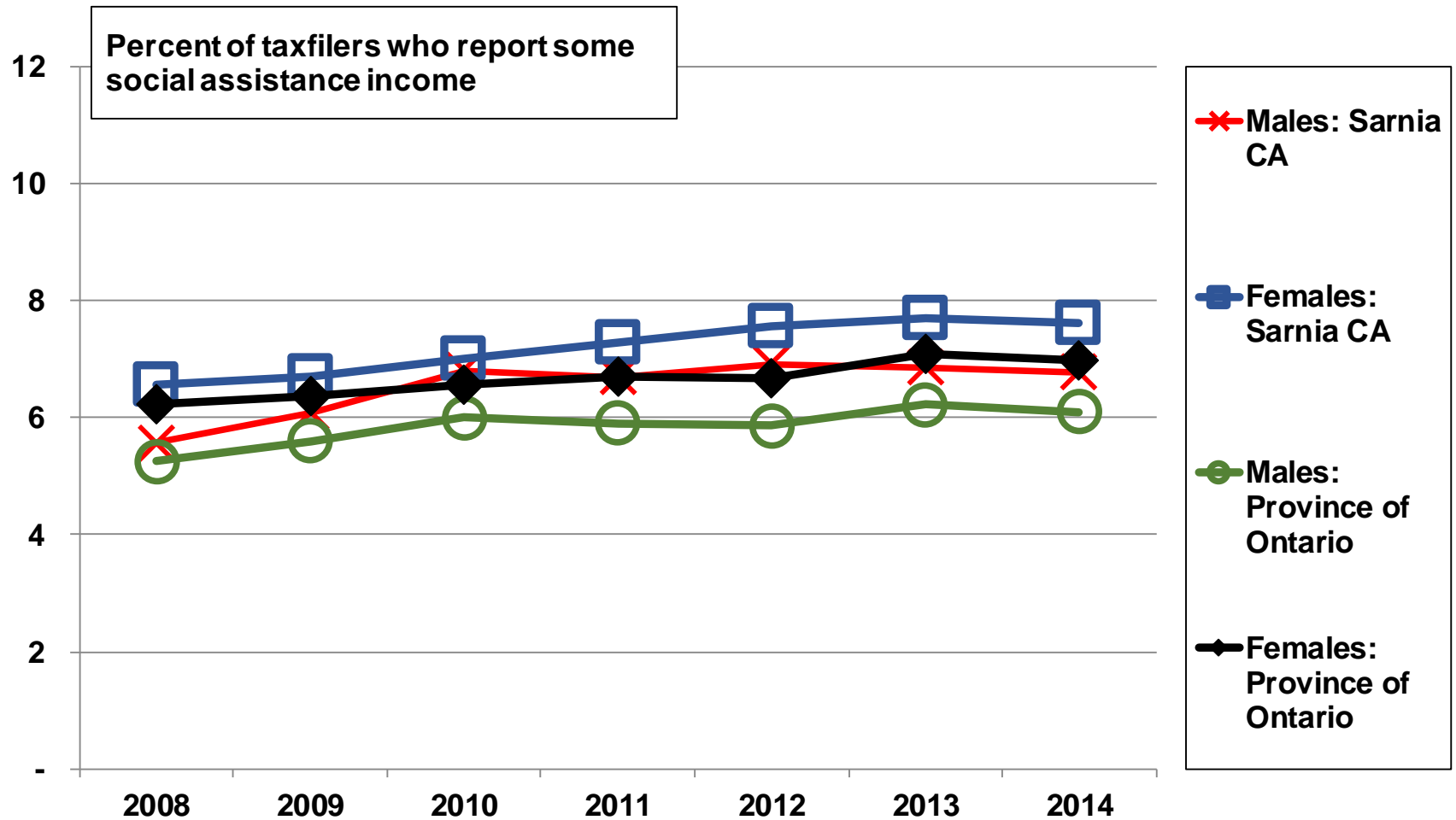

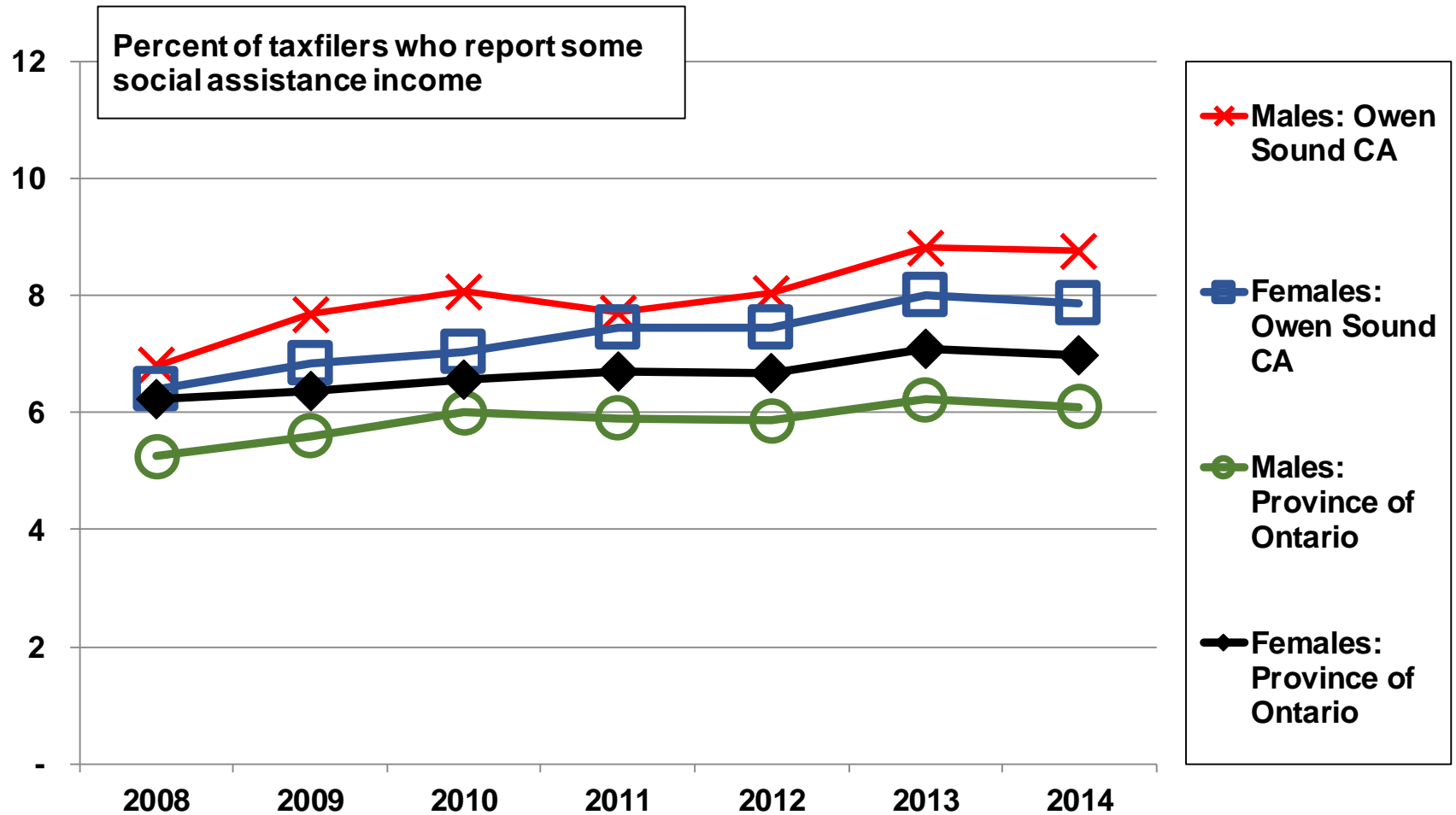
The percent of taxfilers reporting some social assistance income: Sarnia CA¹

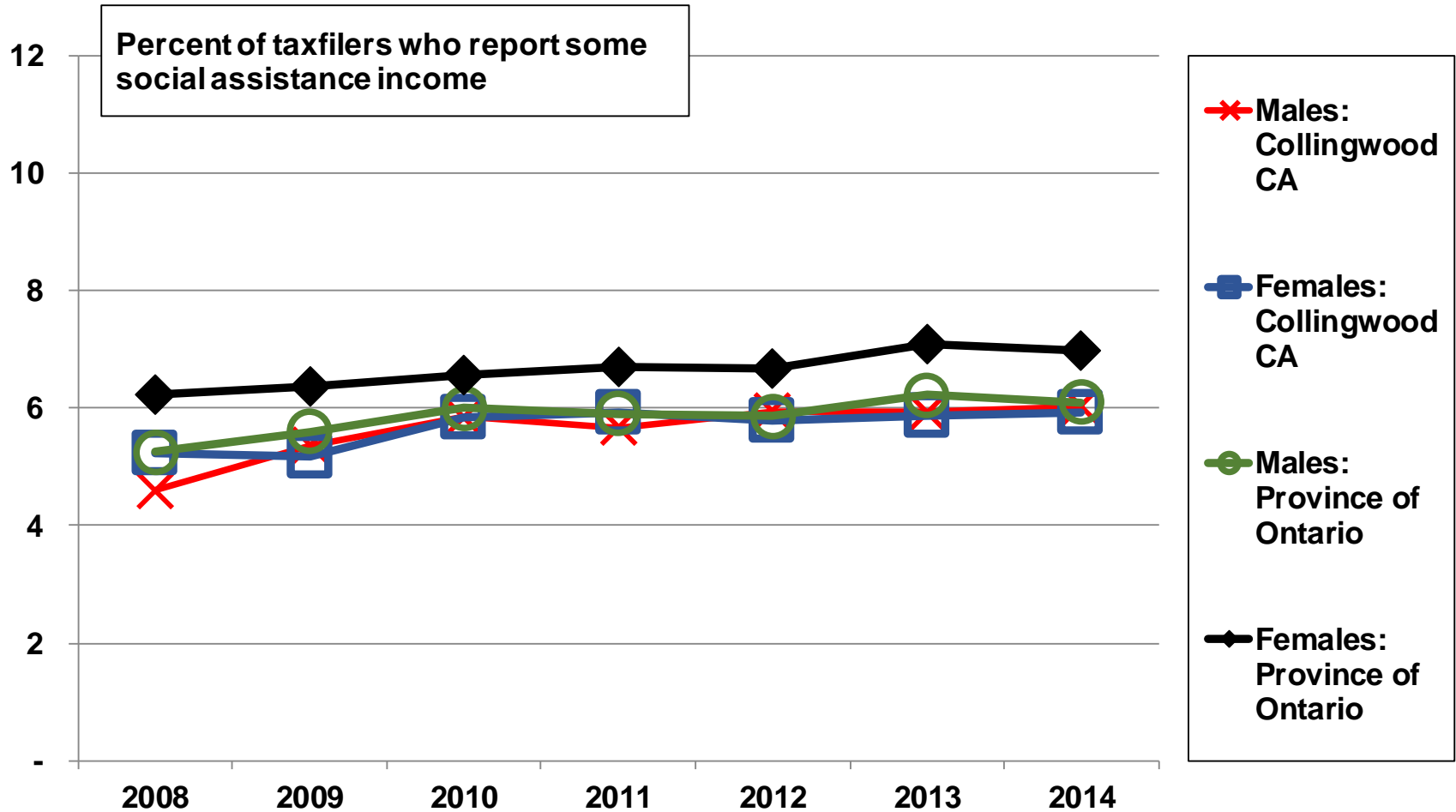
The percent of taxfilers reporting some social assistance income: Owen Sound CA¹

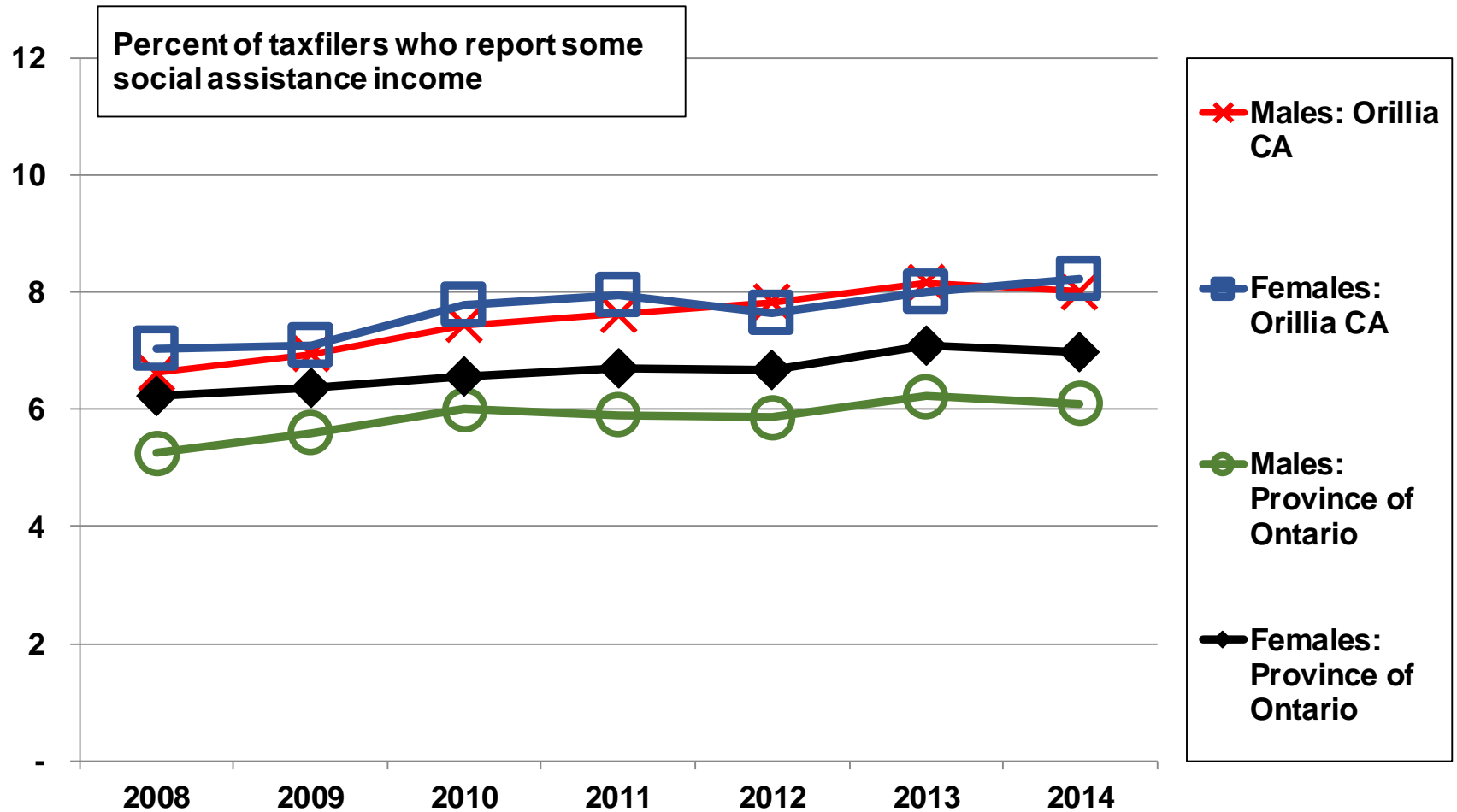
The percent of taxfilers reporting some social assistance income: Collingwood CA¹

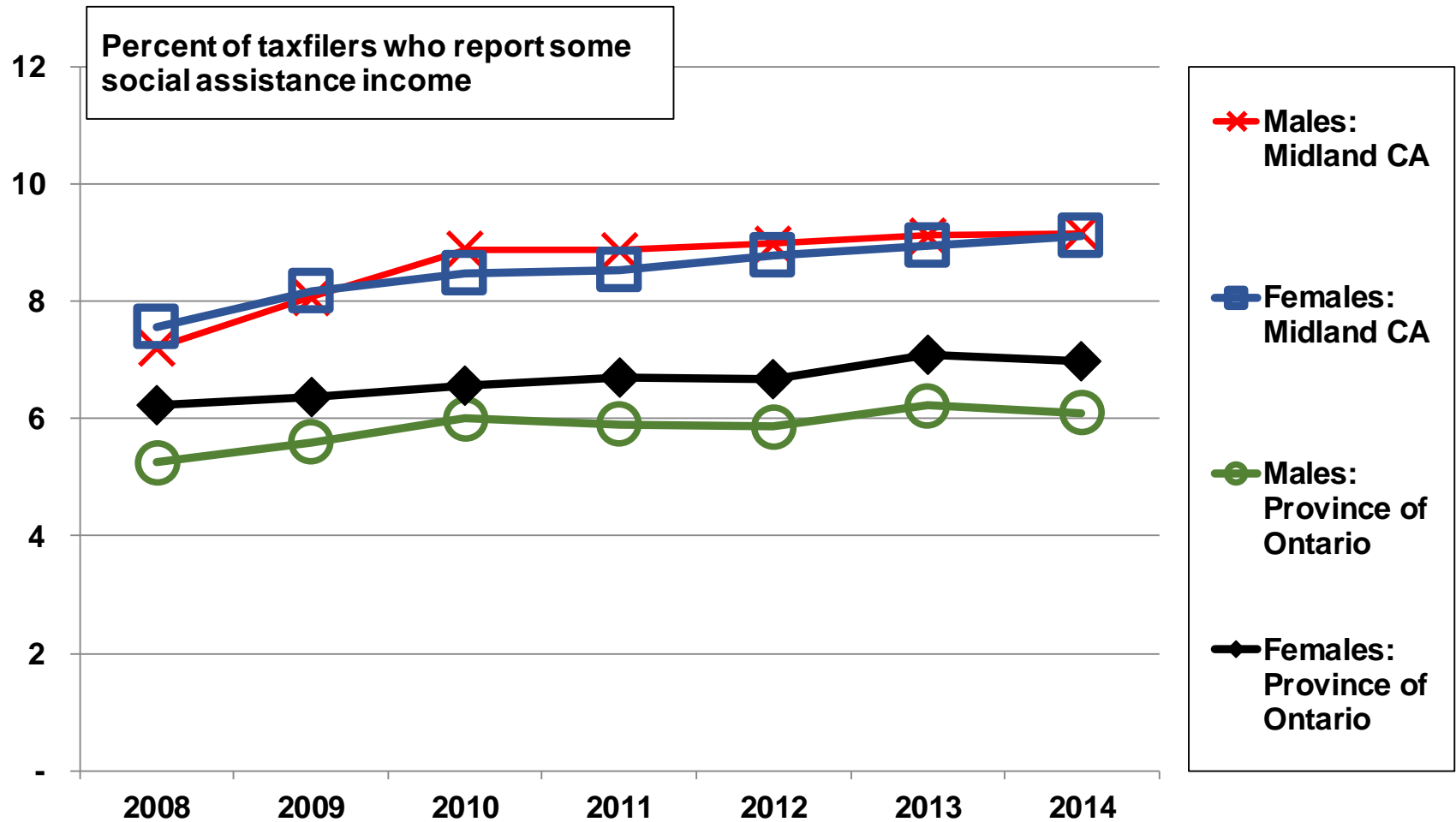

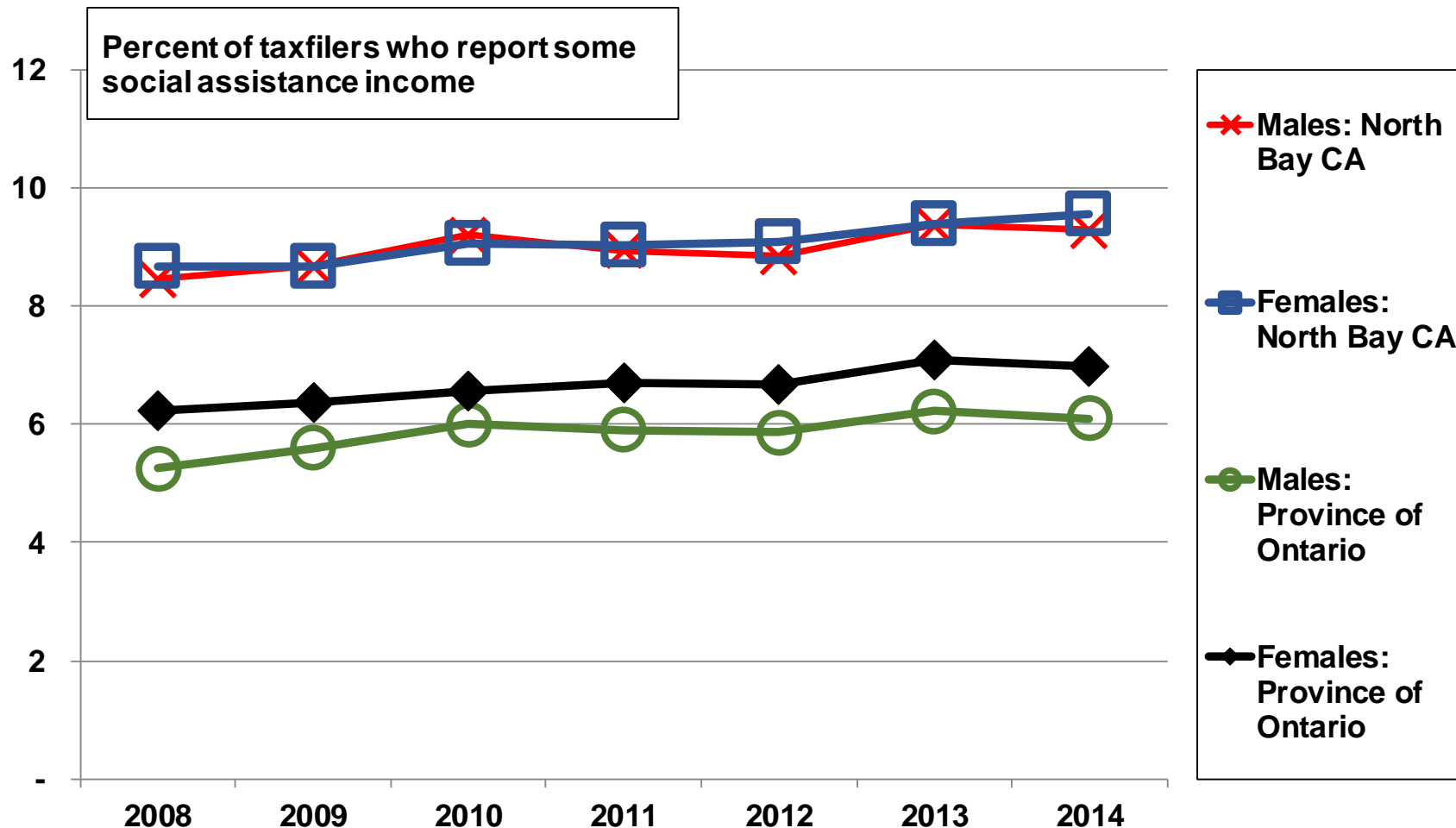

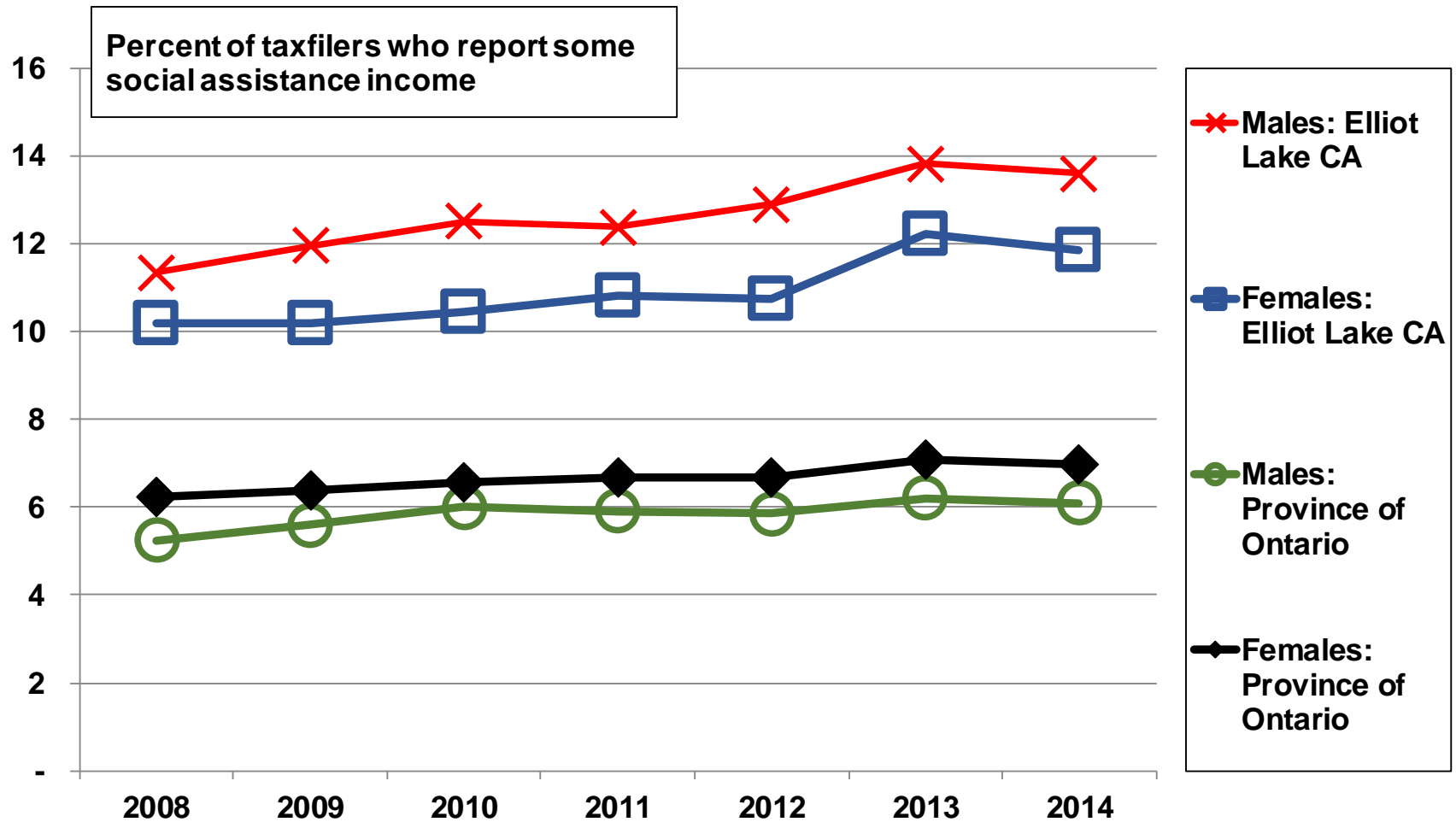
The percent of taxfilers reporting some social assistance income: North Bay CA¹

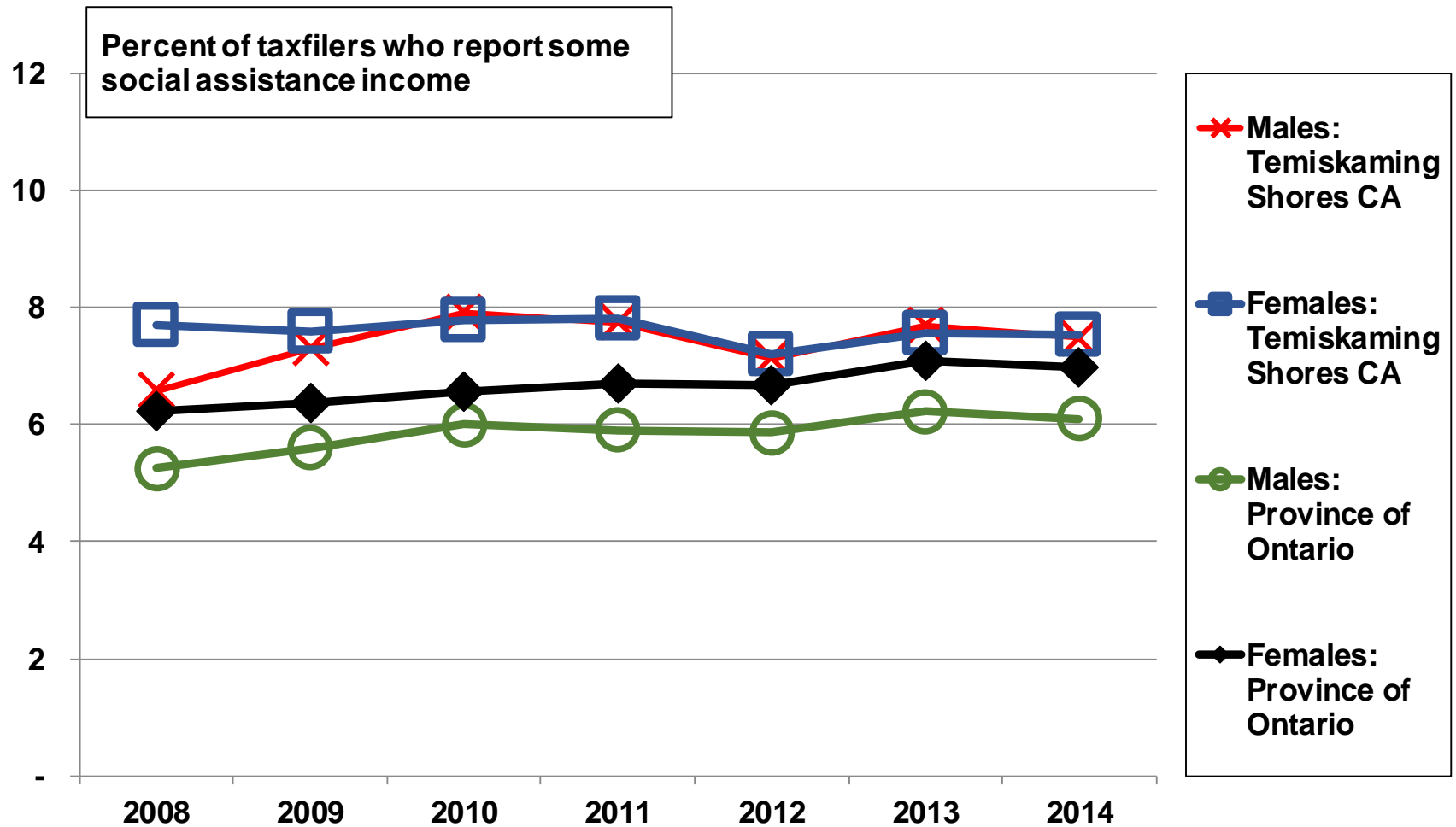
The percent of taxfilers reporting some social assistance income: Elliot Lake CA¹

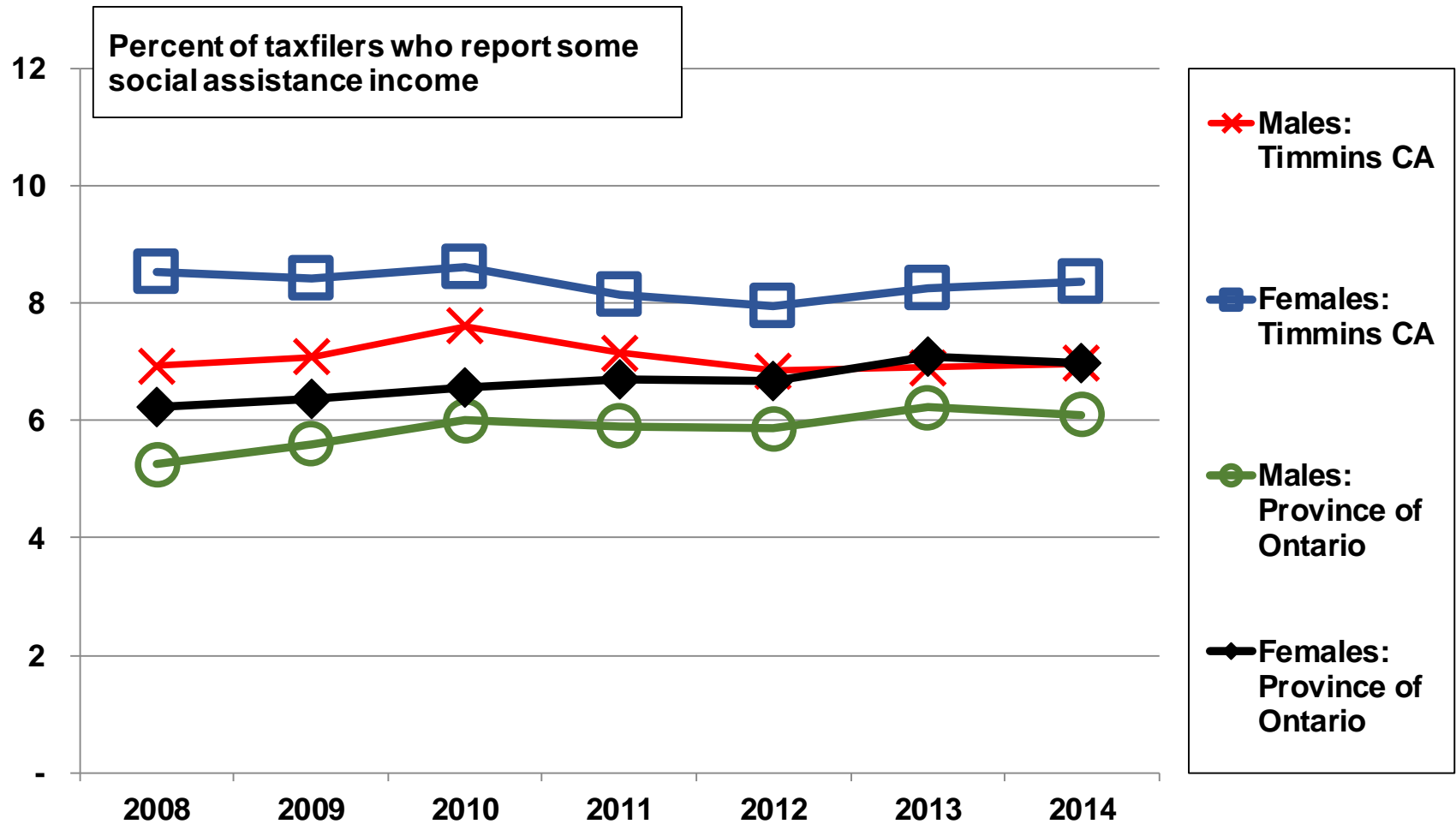
The percent of taxfilers reporting some social assistance income: Temiskaming Shores CA¹

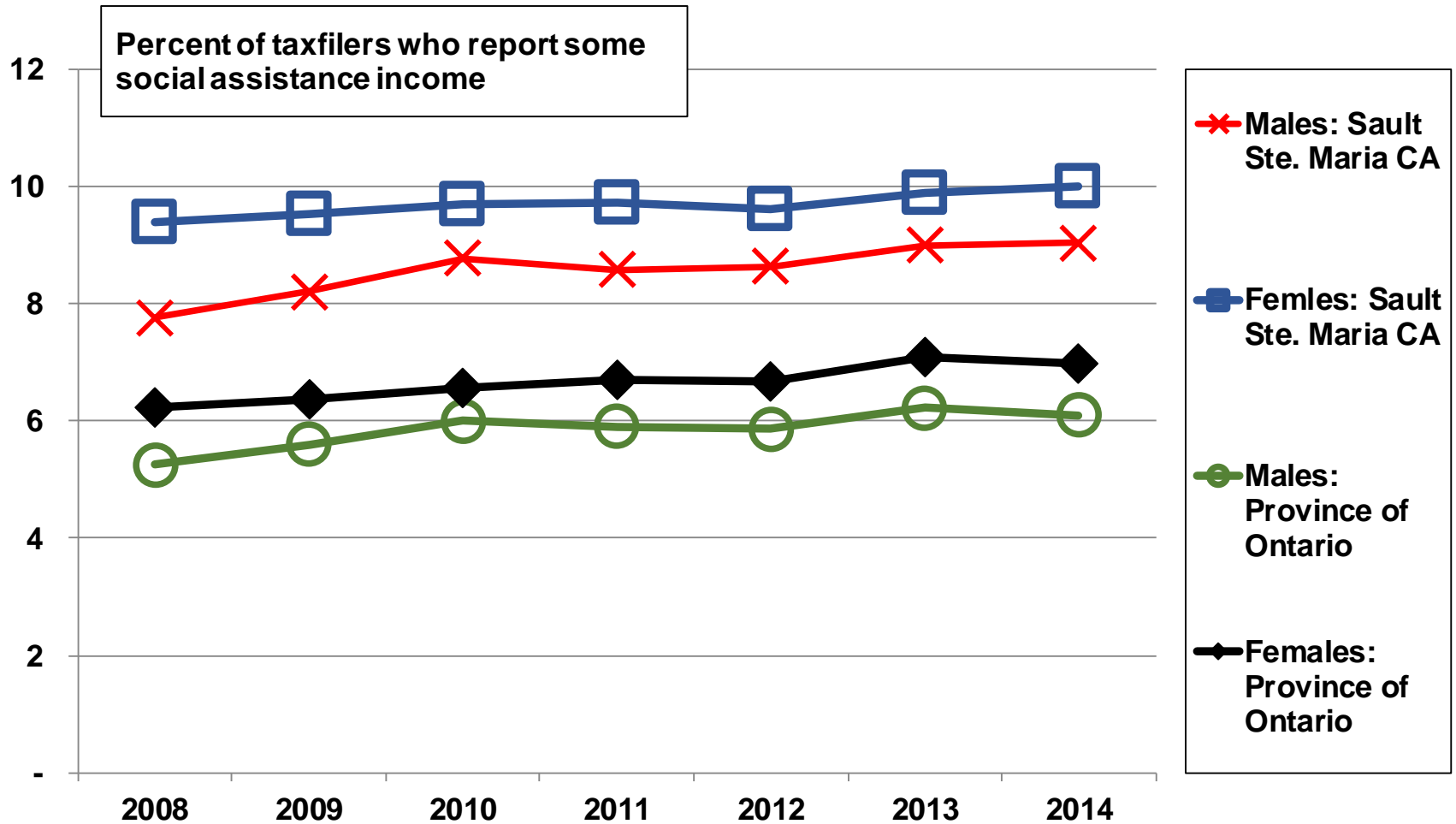
The percent of taxfilers reporting some social assistance income: Timmins CA¹

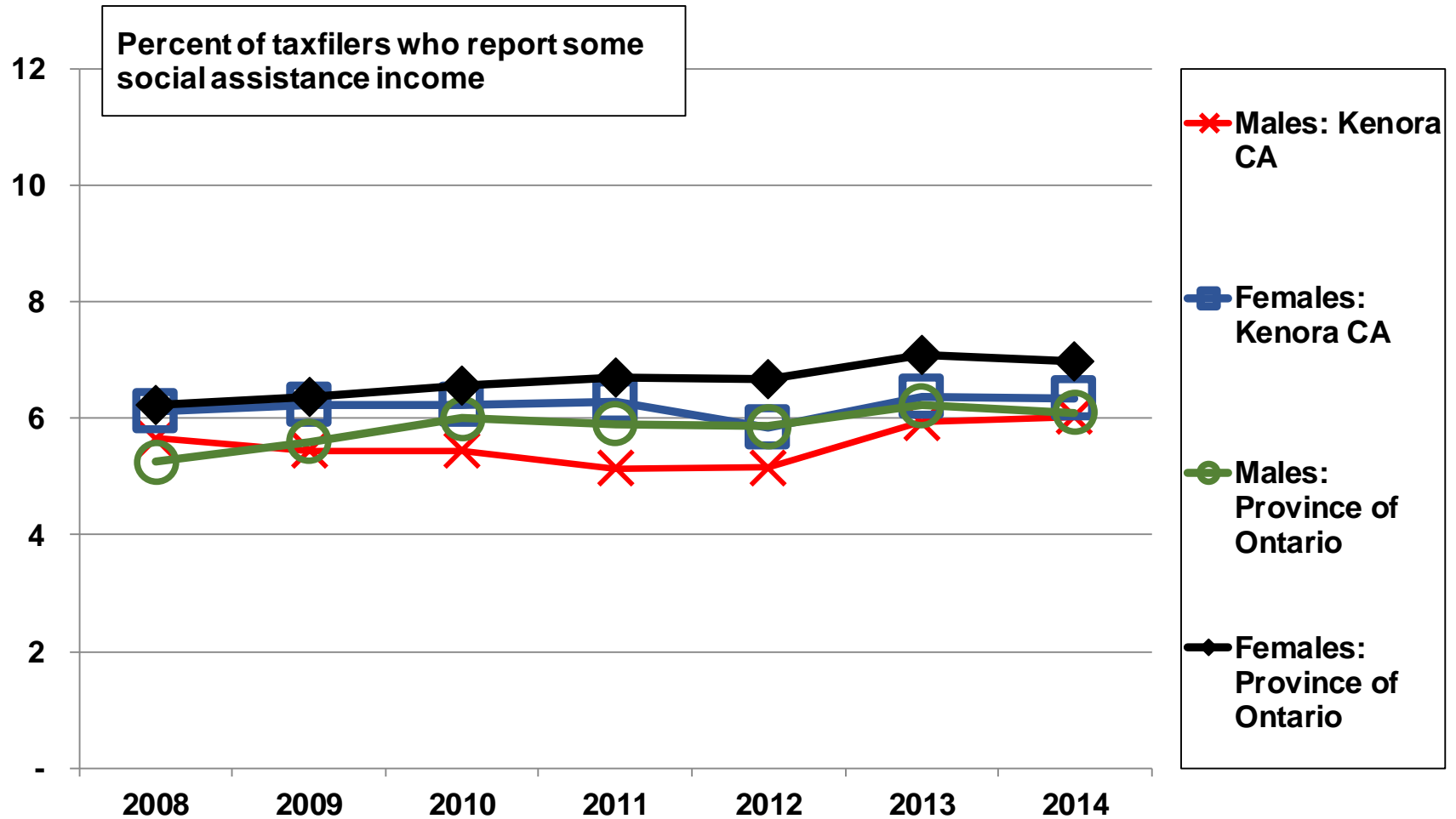
The percent of taxfilers reporting some social assistance income: Sault Ste. Marie CA¹

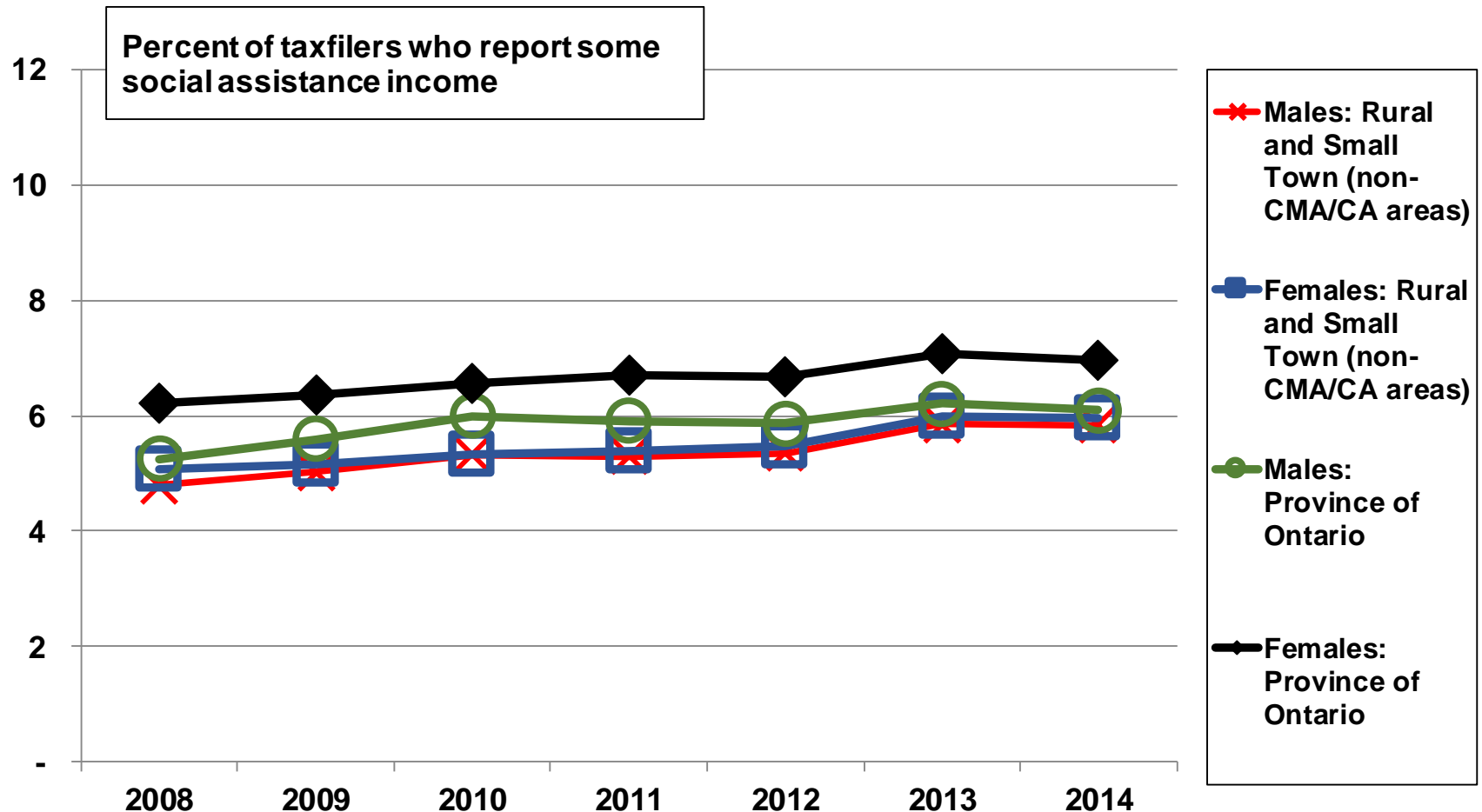
