

From October, 2008 to October, 2009, the number of paid employees declined by 361 thousand and the number of self-employed workers increased by 115 thousand. The increase in self-employed incorporated without paid help was 128 thousand. The increase in the age groups of 45 years of age and over was 156 thousand. The increase in the number "part-time for economic reasons and wanted full-time" was 23 thousand. Large increases were noted in the industry sectors of finance and real estate, "wholesale trade, "other" services and industry sector of professional, scientific and technical firms.






Increase in number self-employed, except unincorporated with paid help, Ontario




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


Only self-employed, incorporated, no paid help show a recent increase in share of total workforce, Ontario



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
