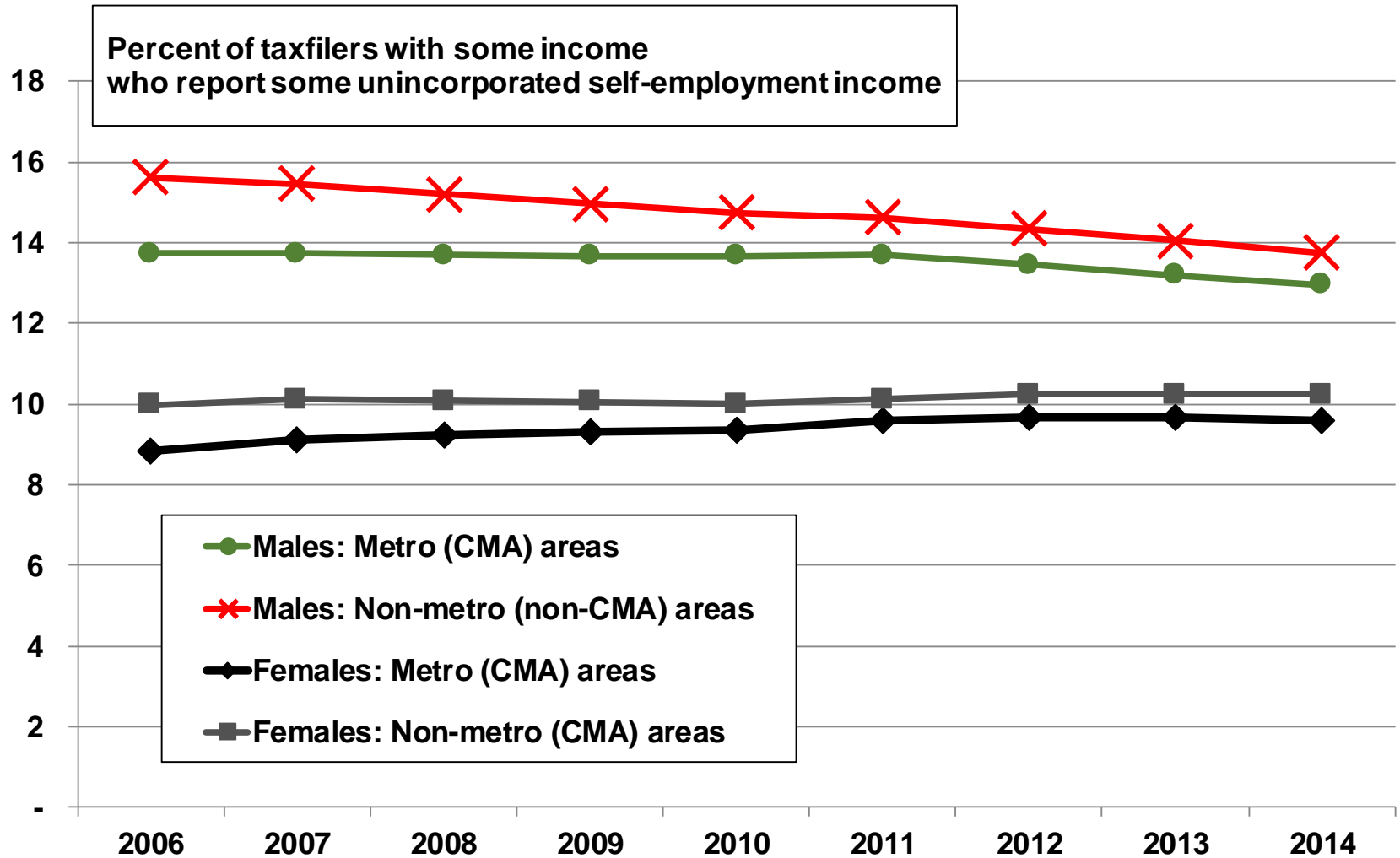

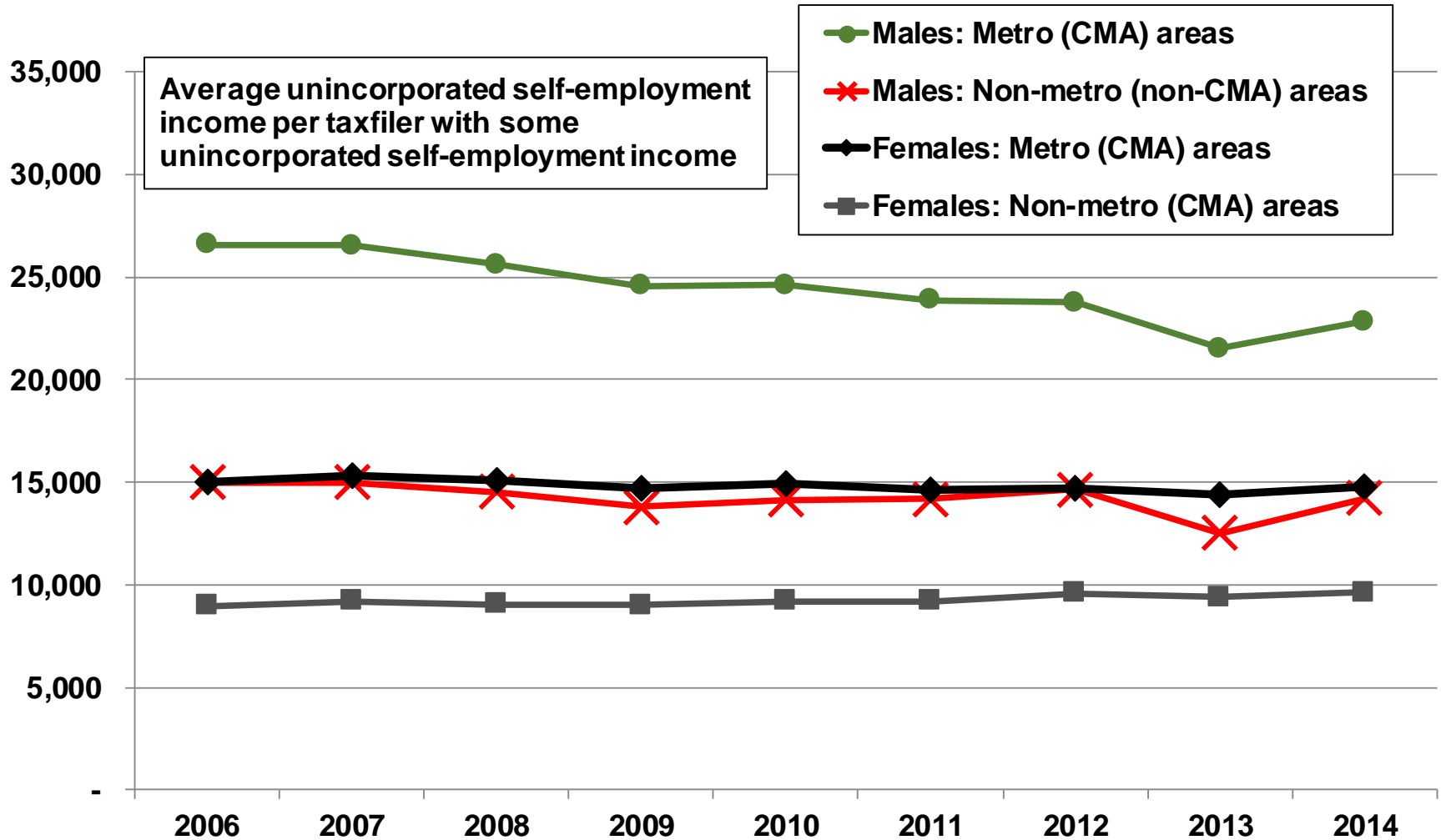

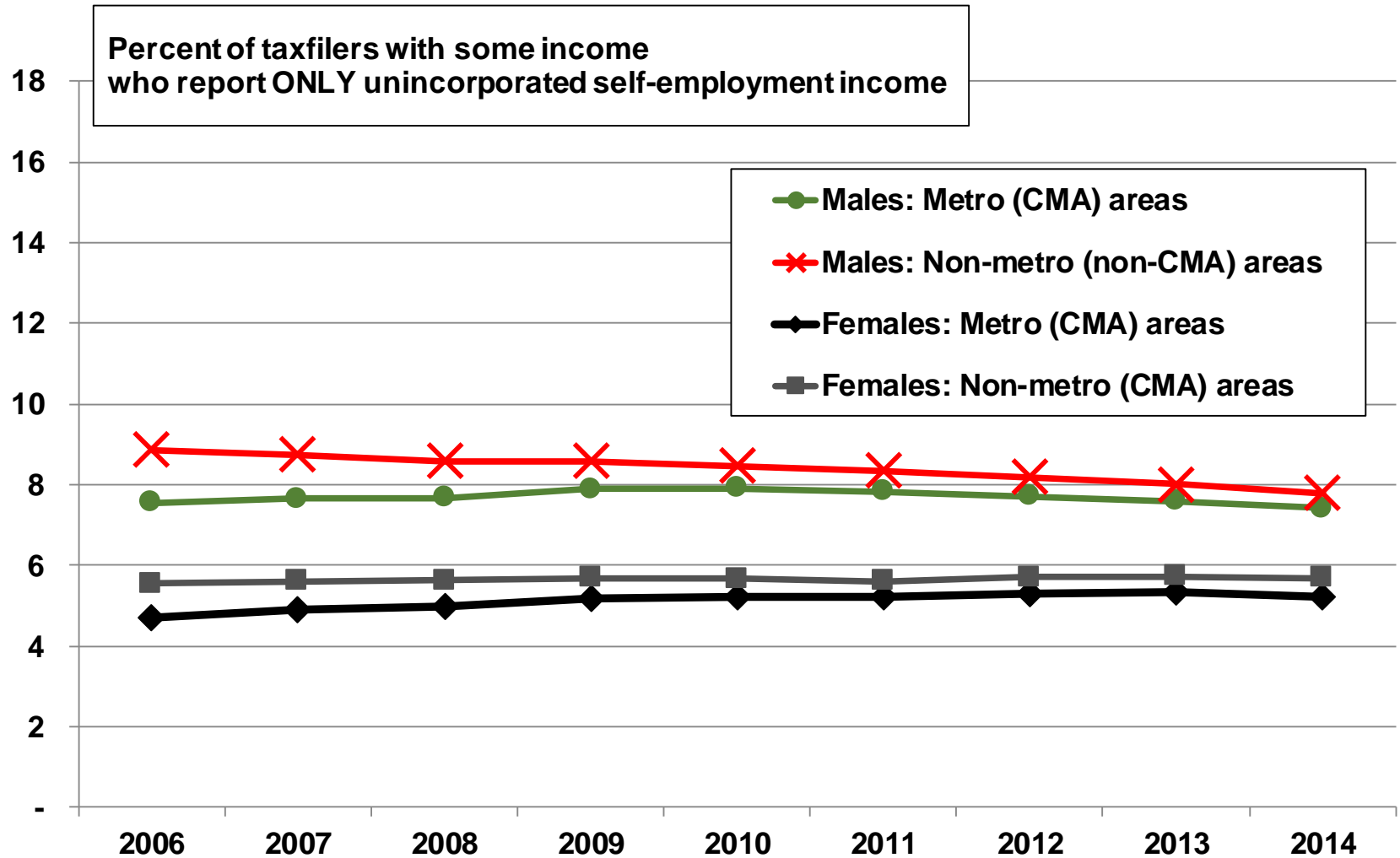

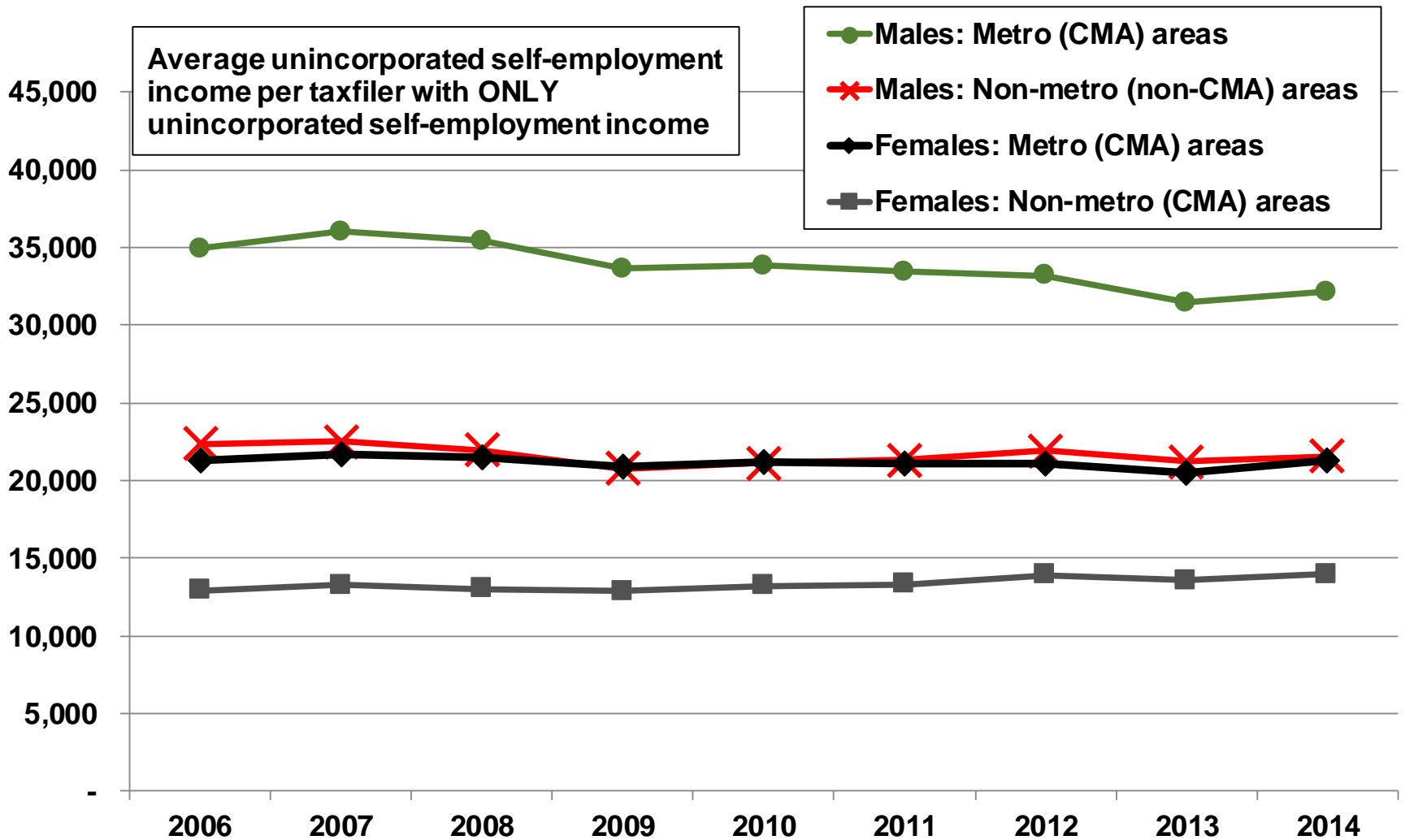

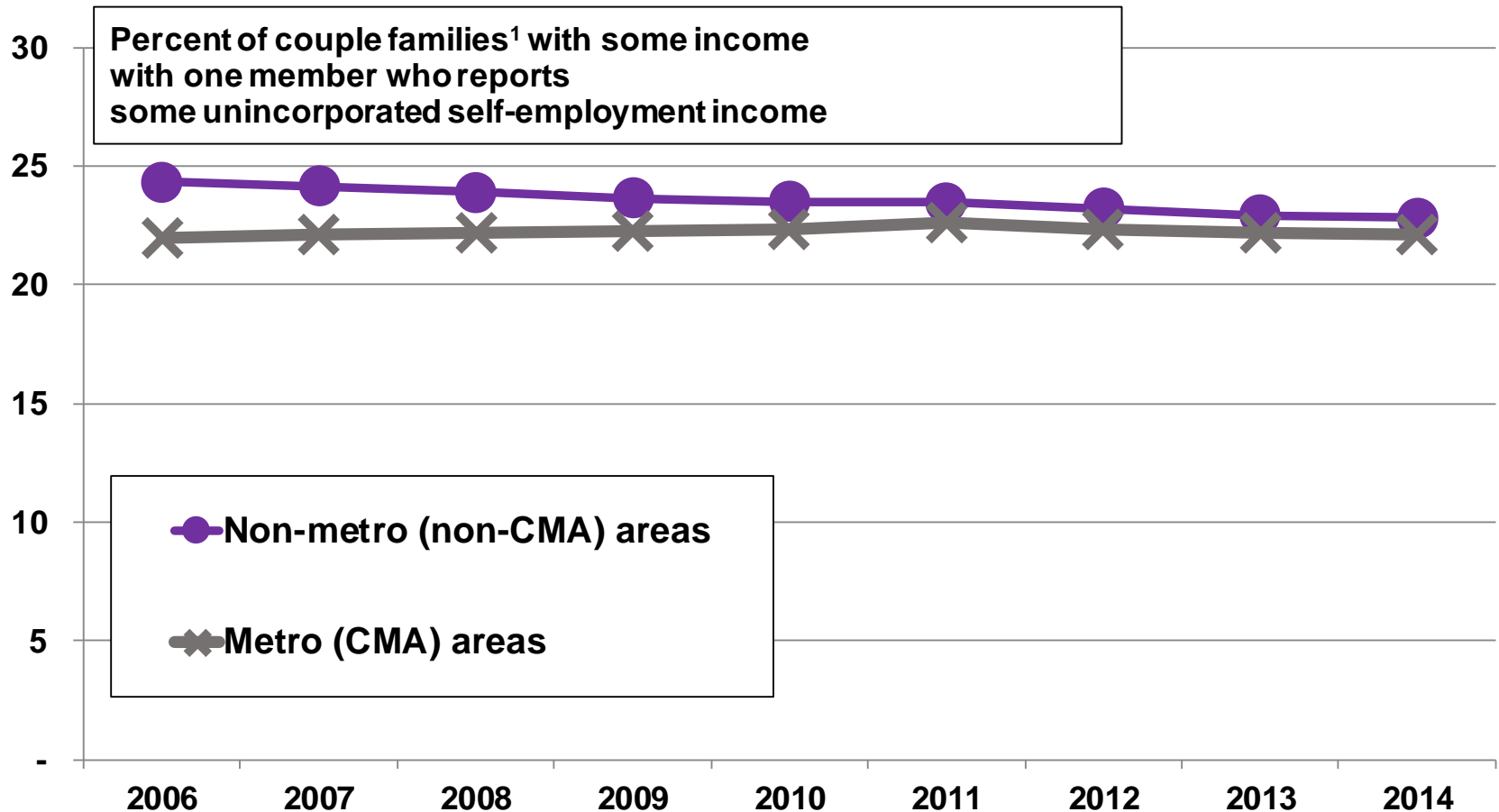

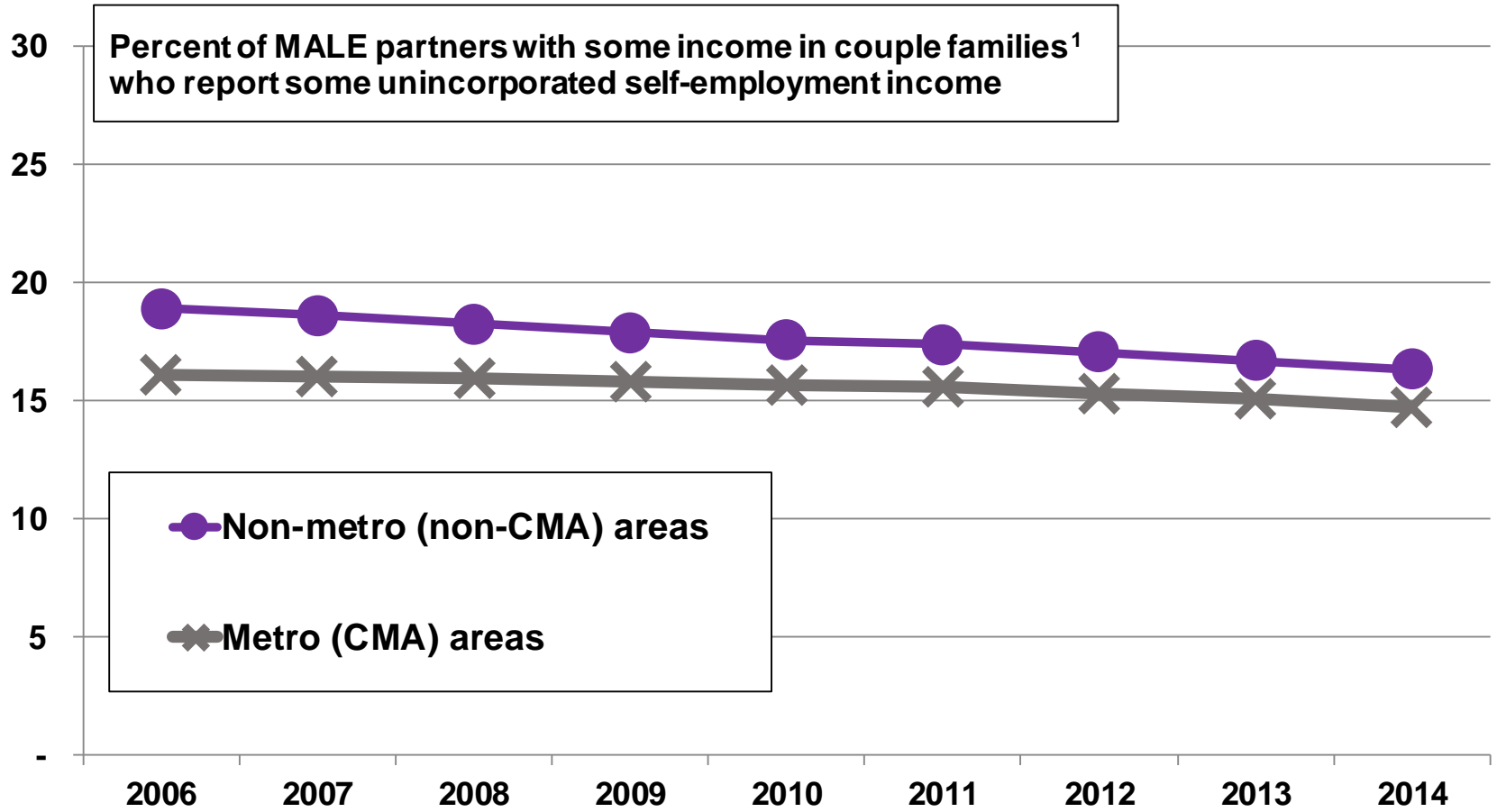

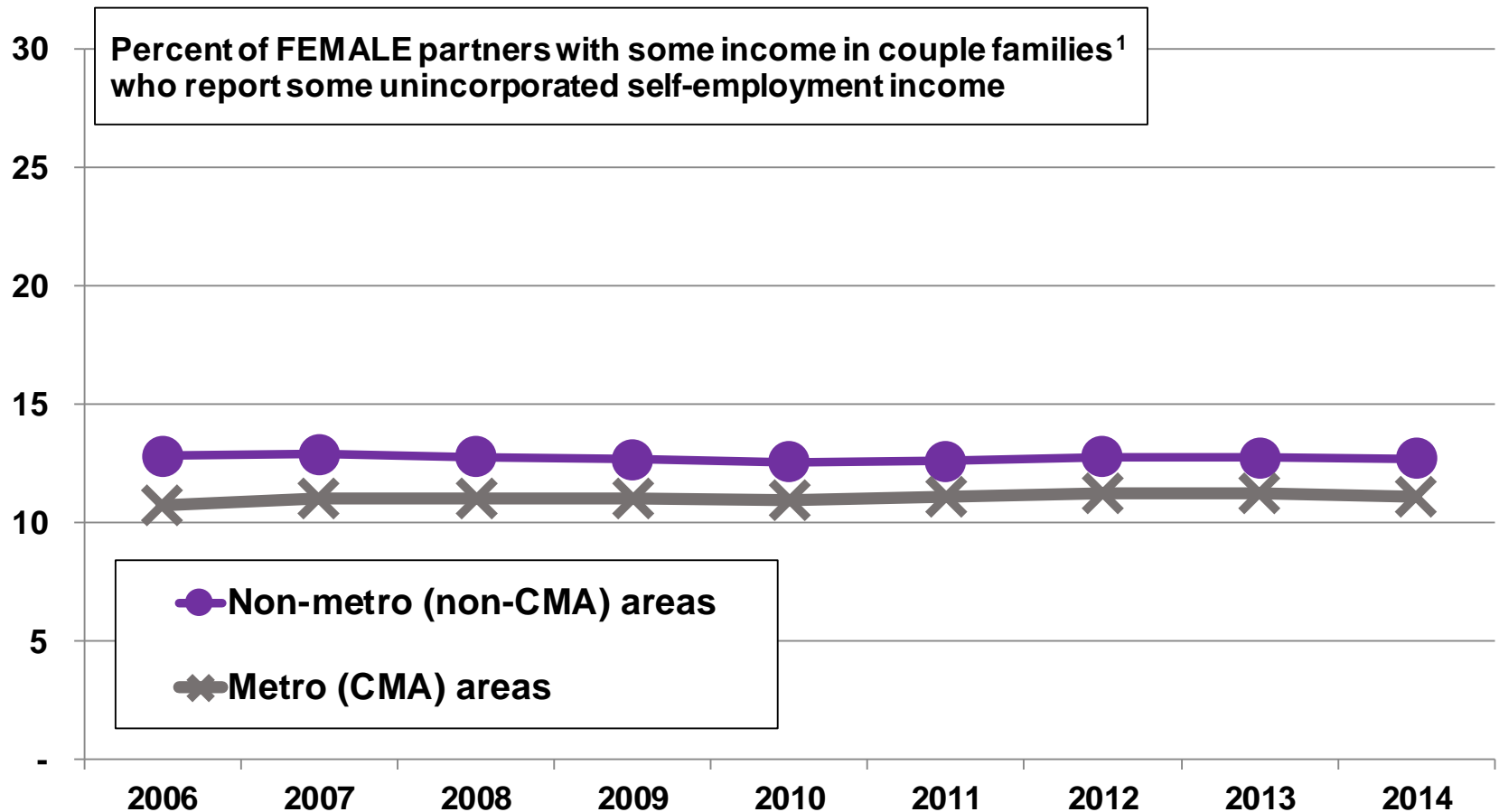
In non-metro Ontario, the percent of male partners in couple families¹ reporting some self-employment income was 16% in 2014

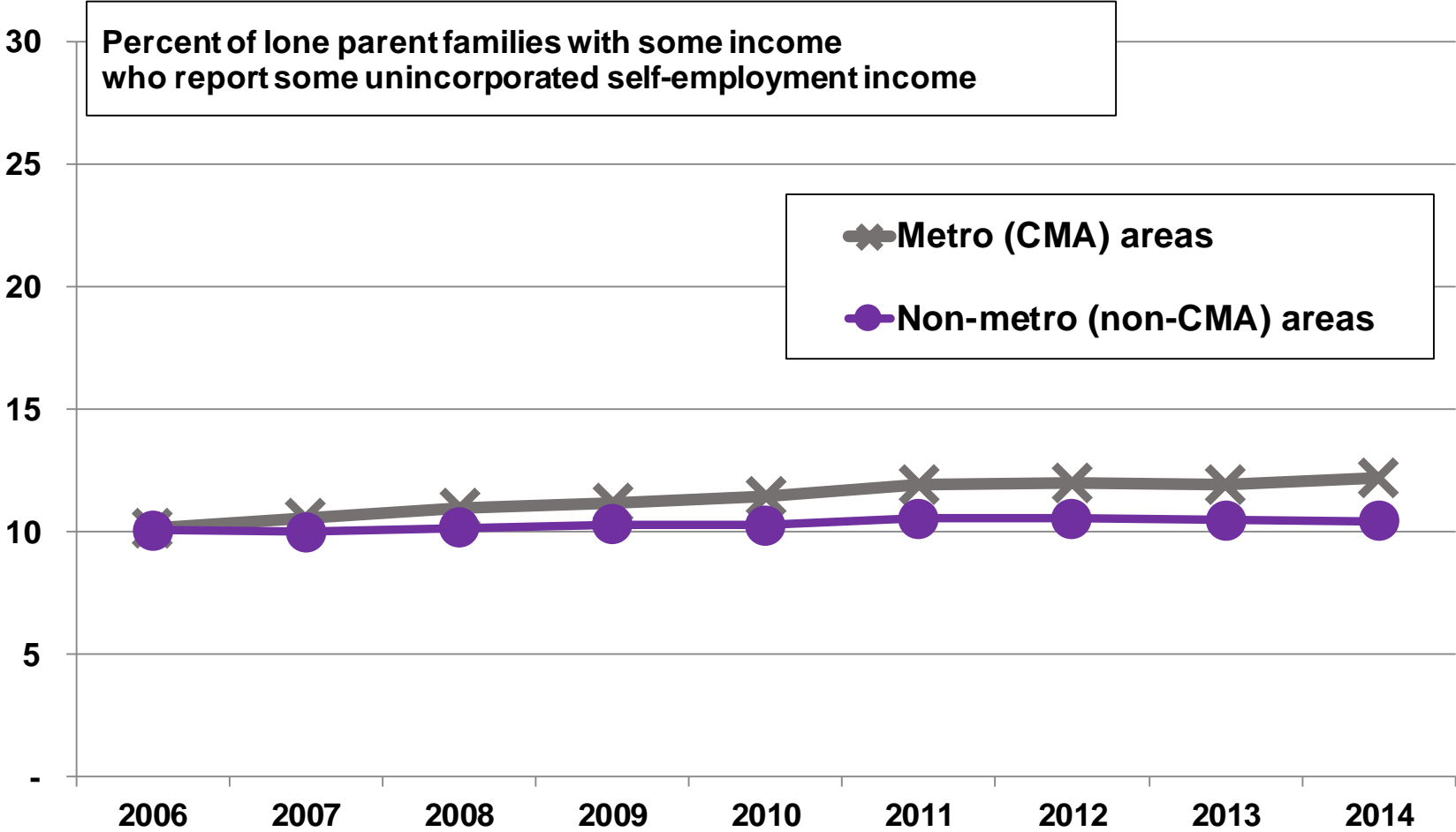

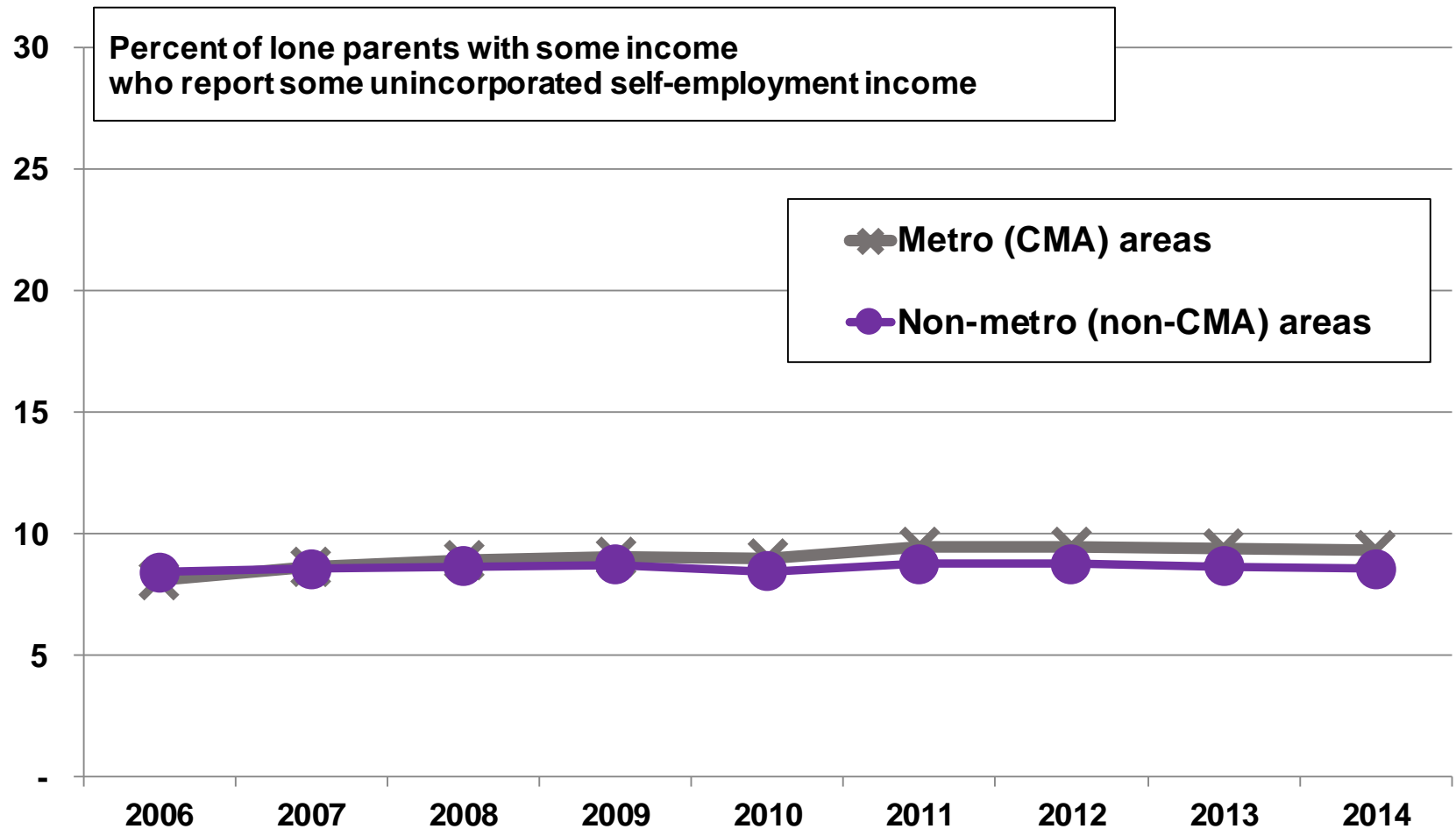

In Ontario, the percent of lone parent families with income who report some self-employment income is (about) the same in metro and non-metro areas



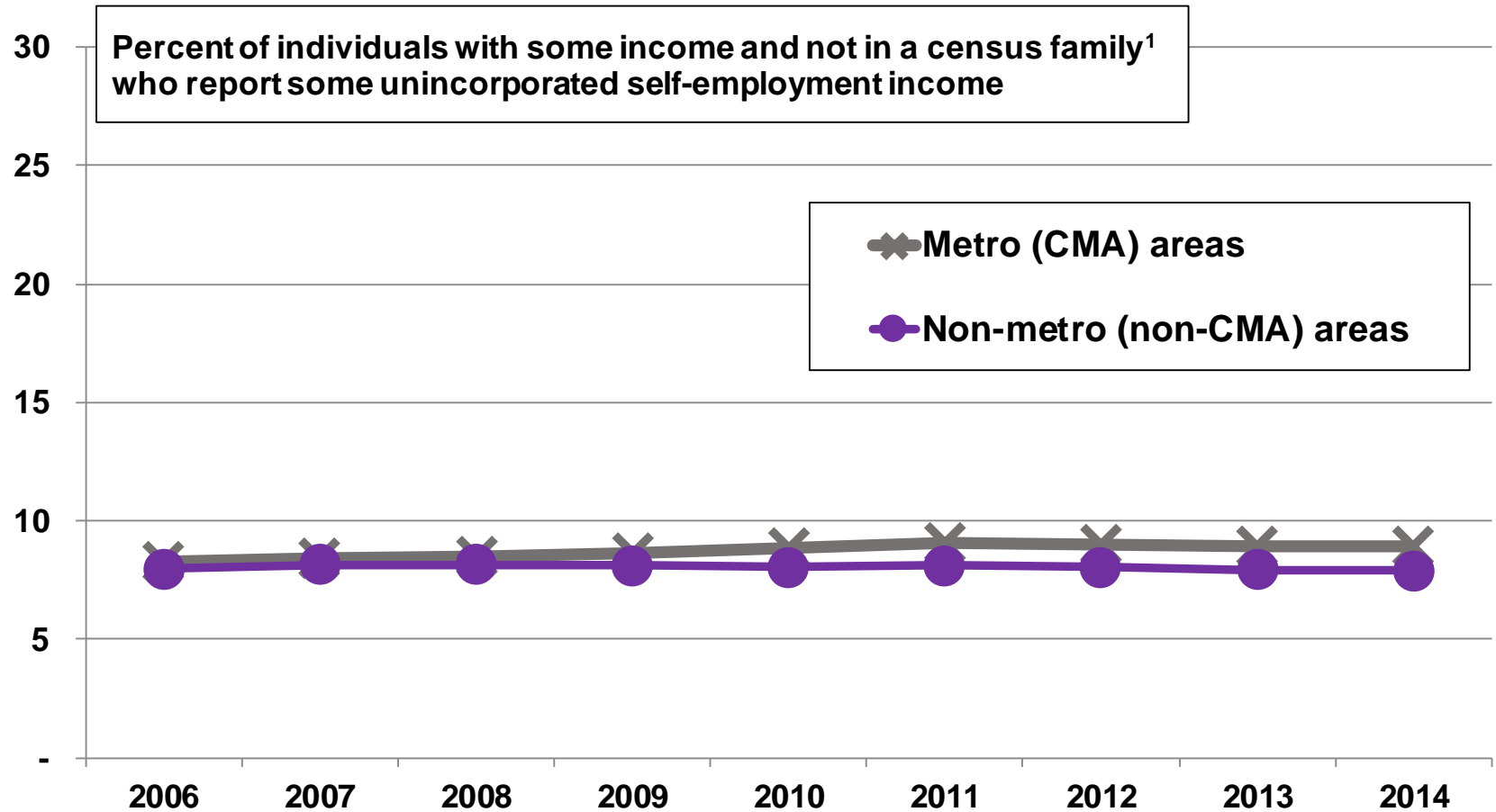

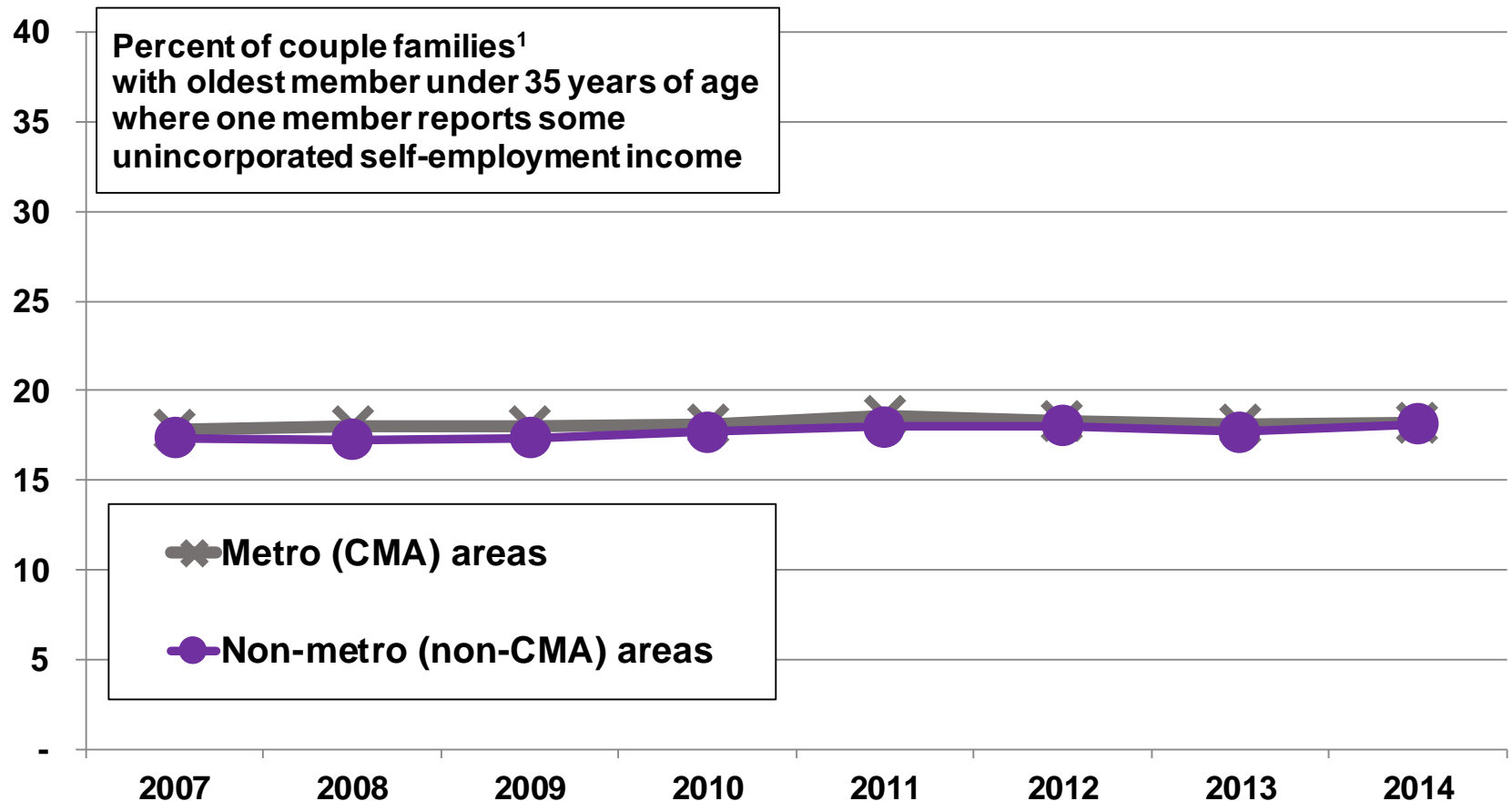

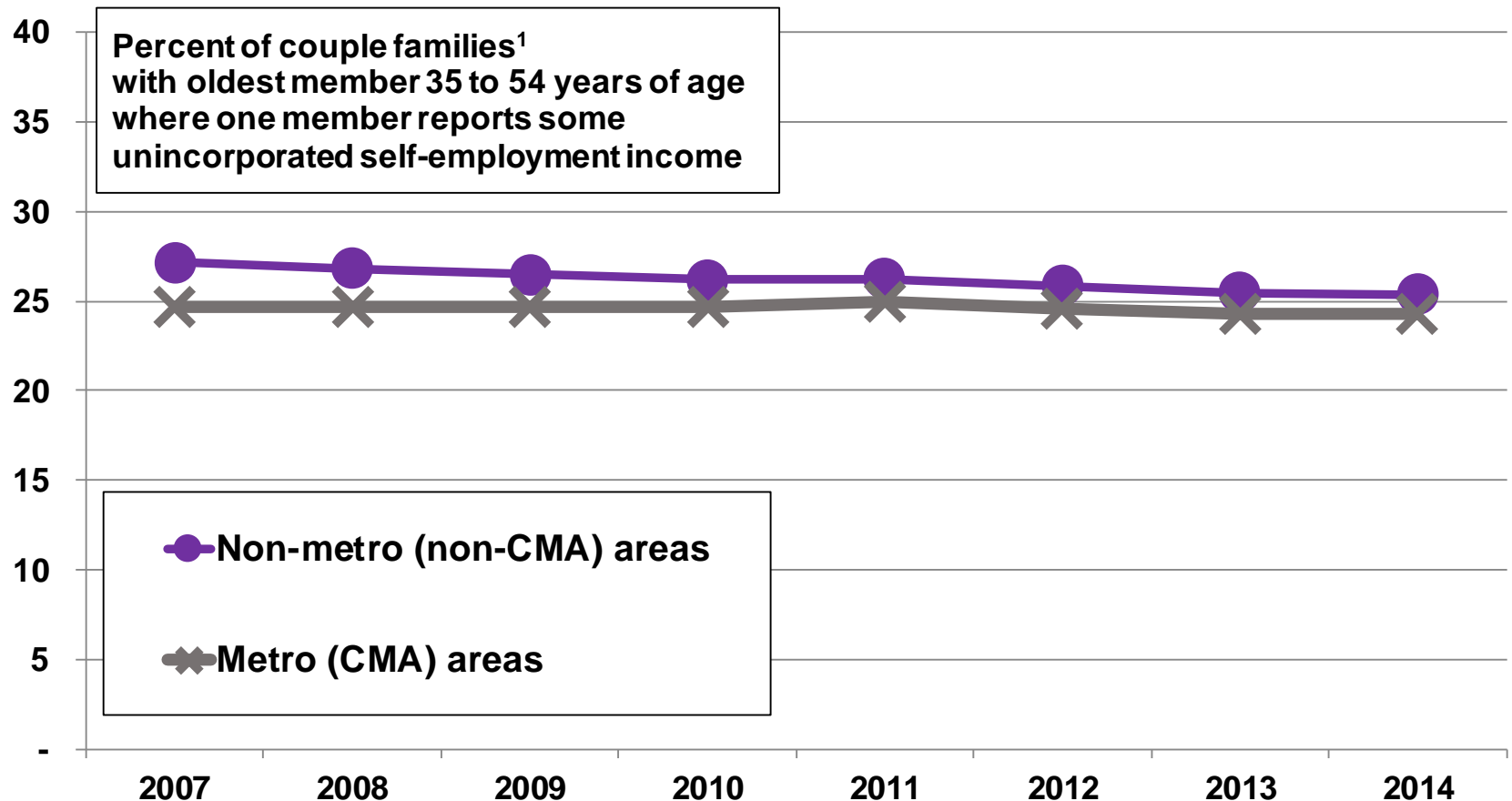

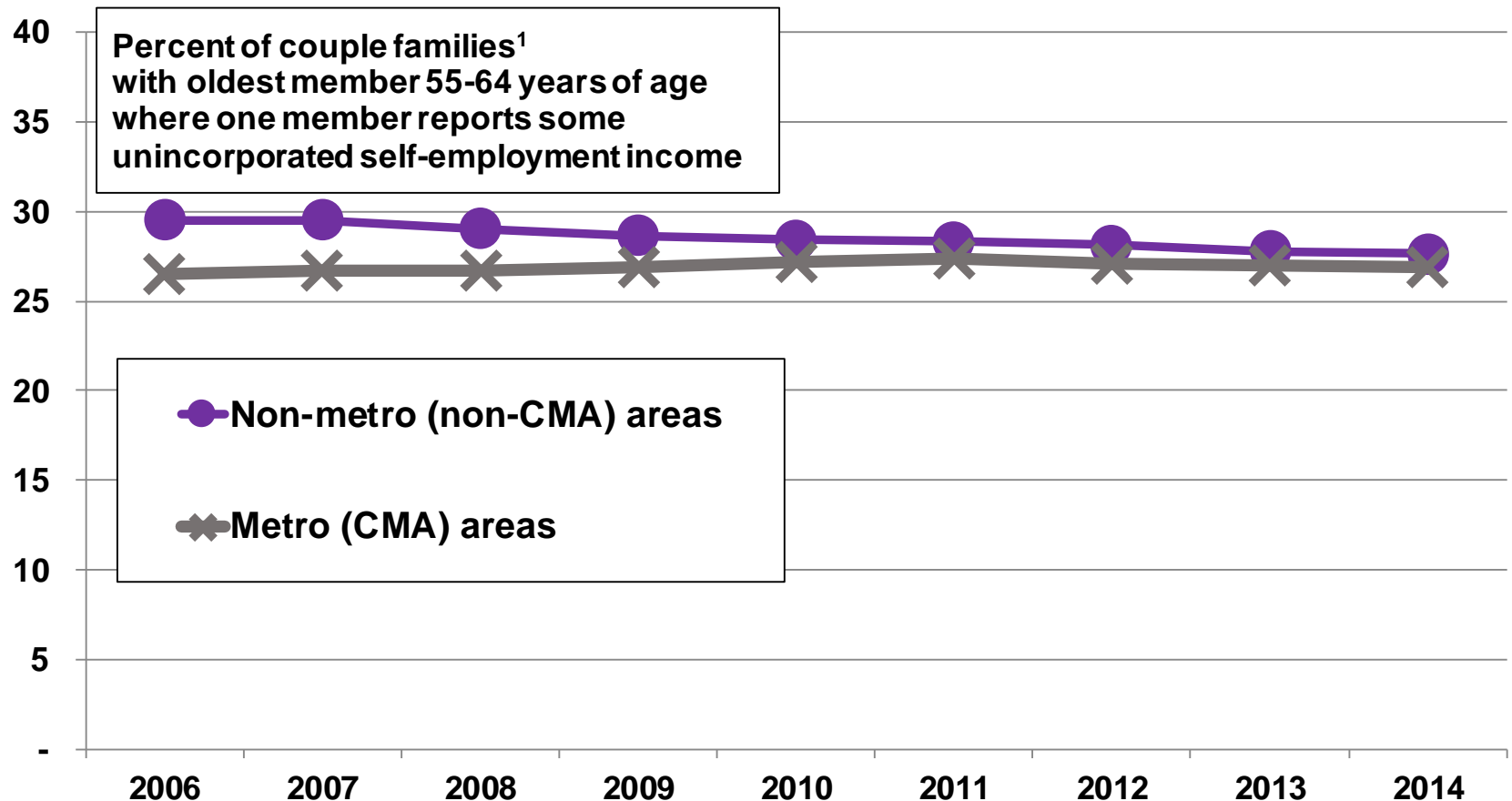

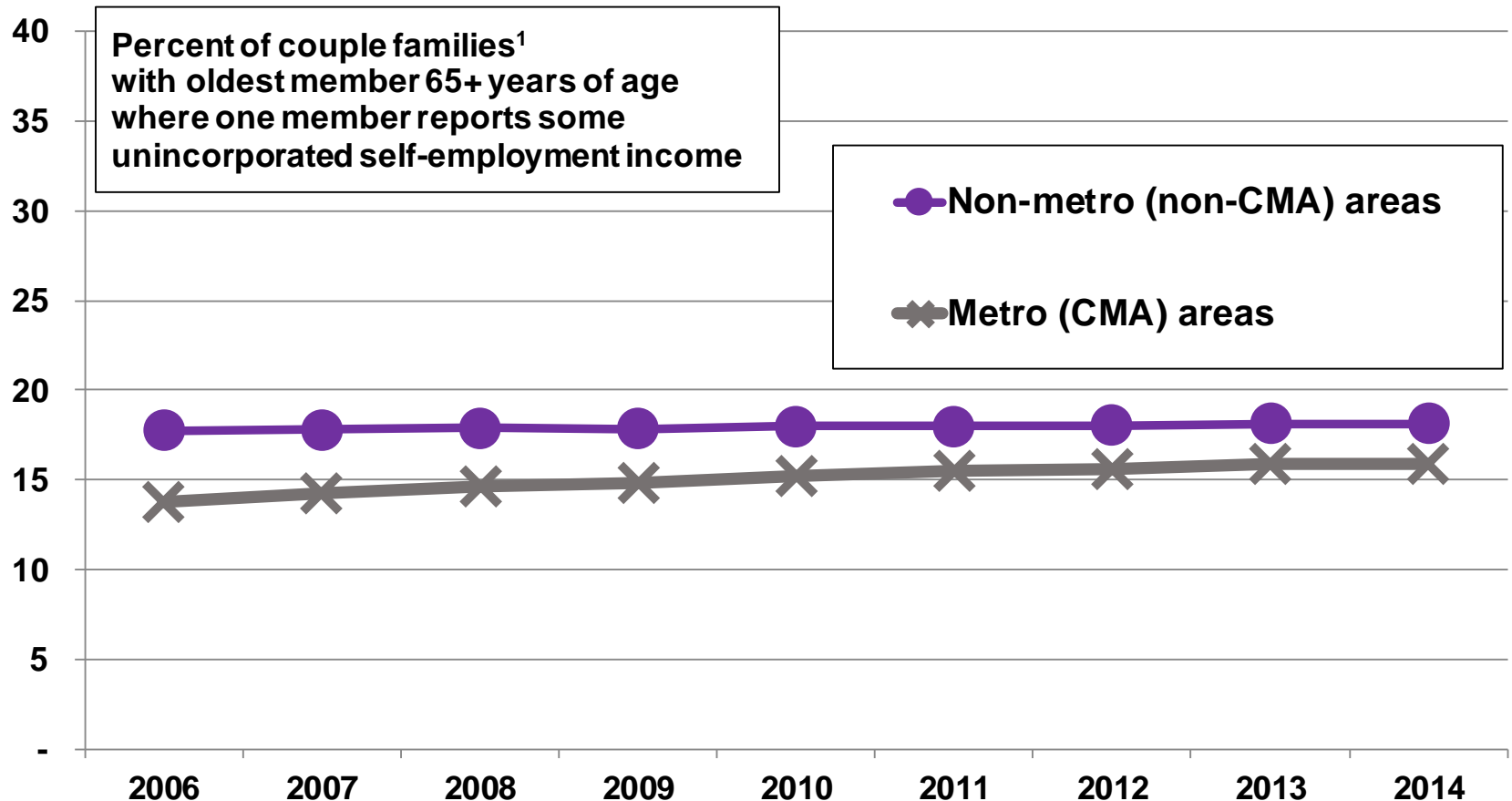

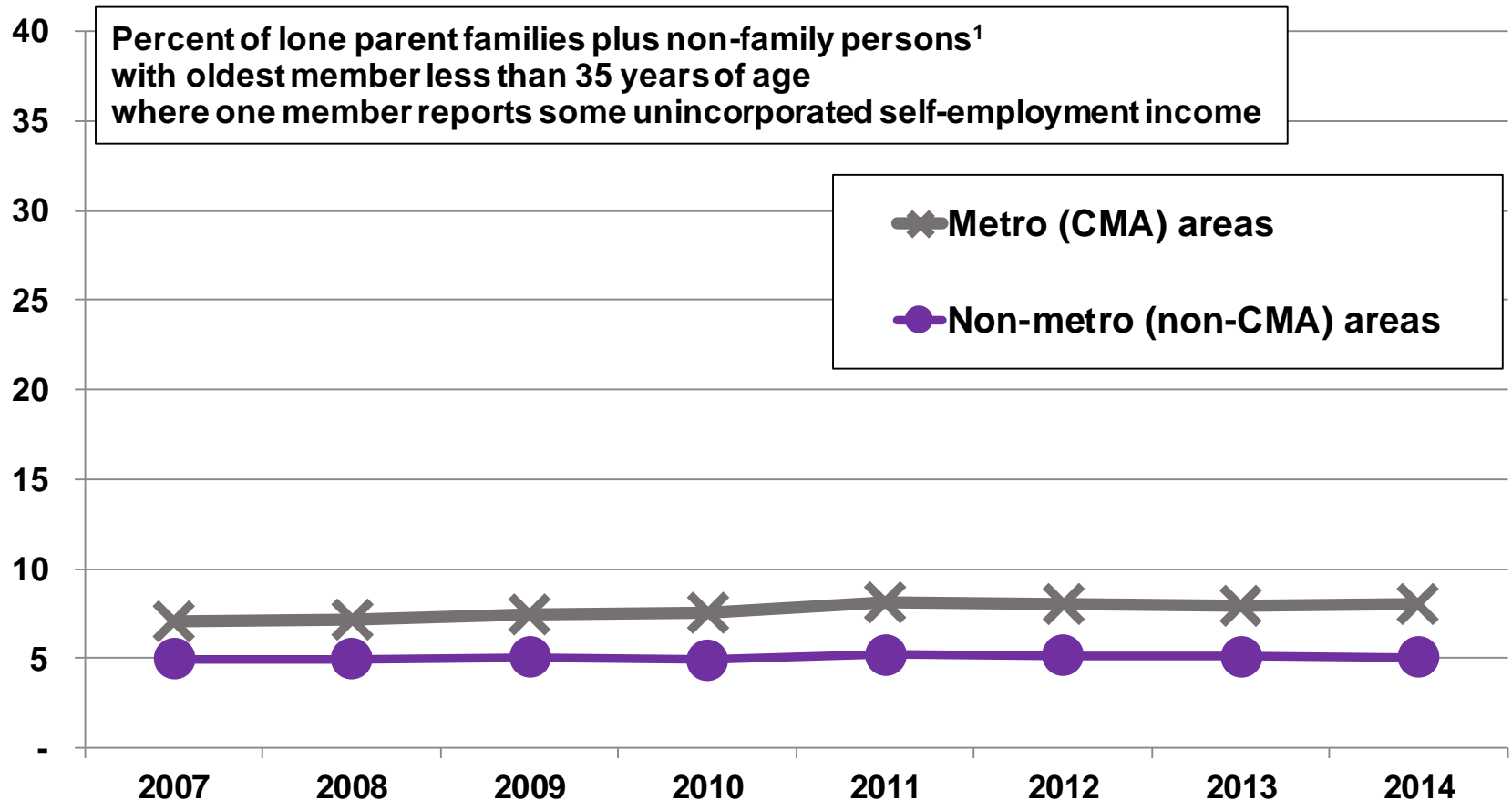

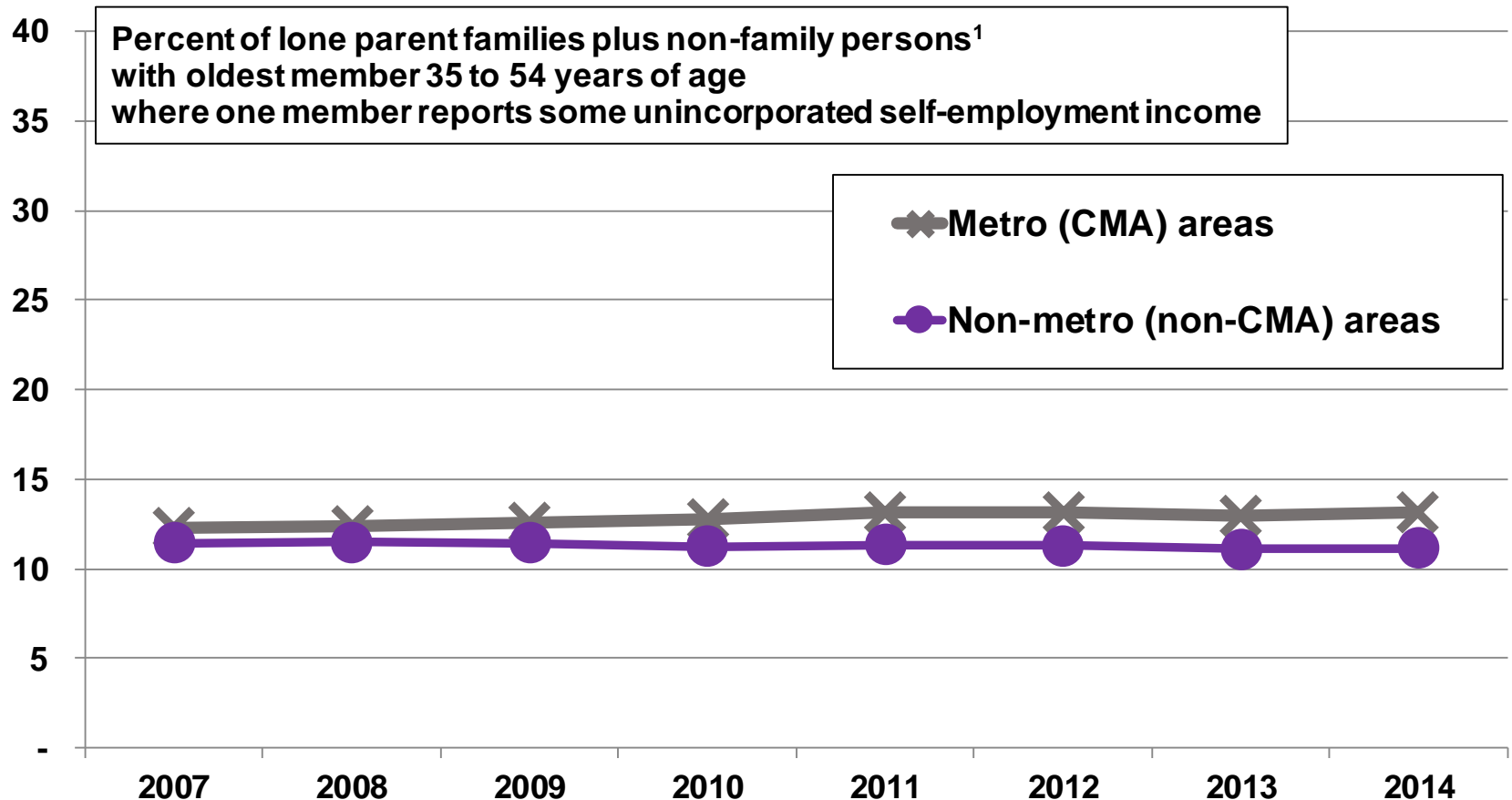

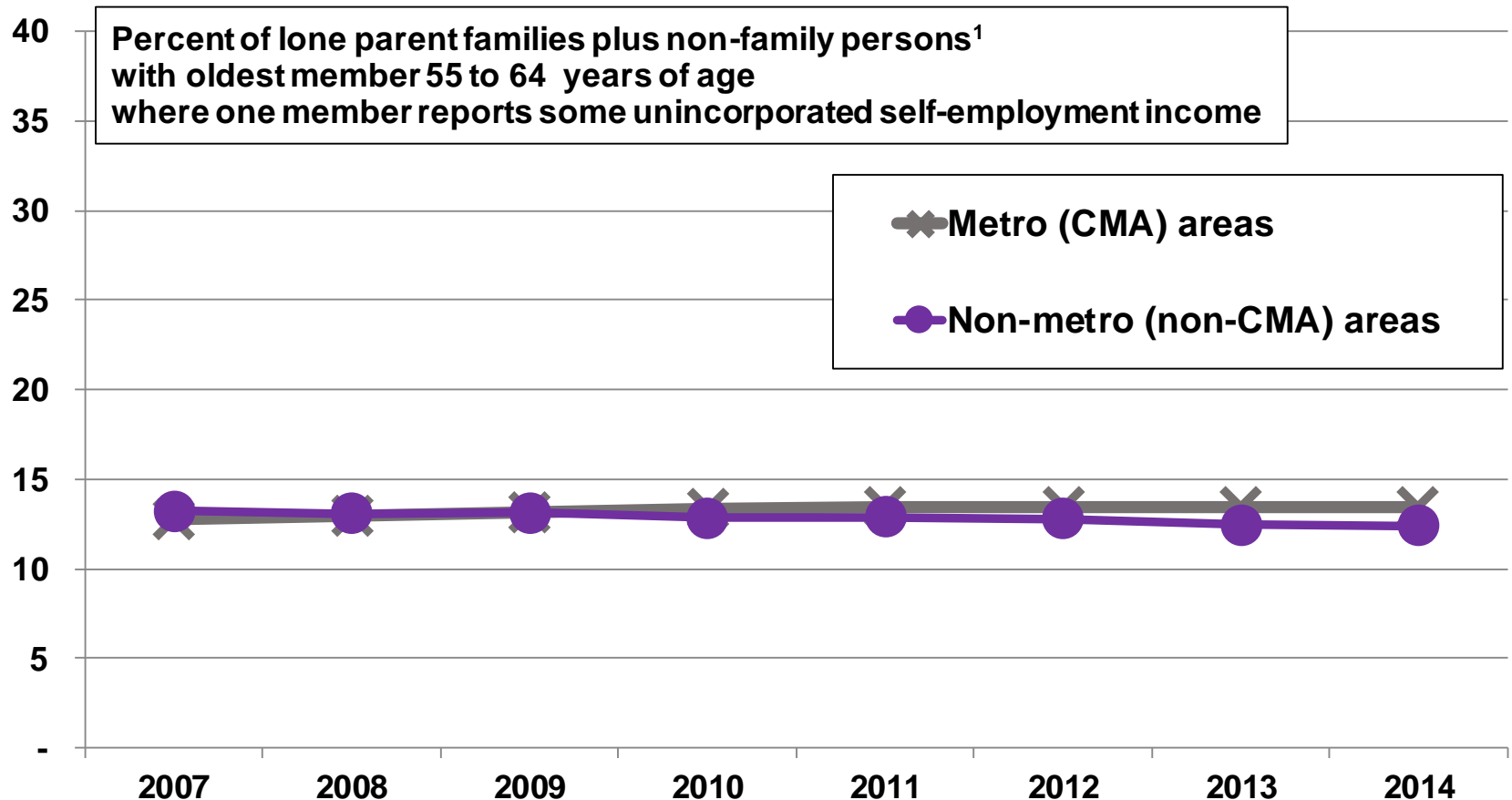

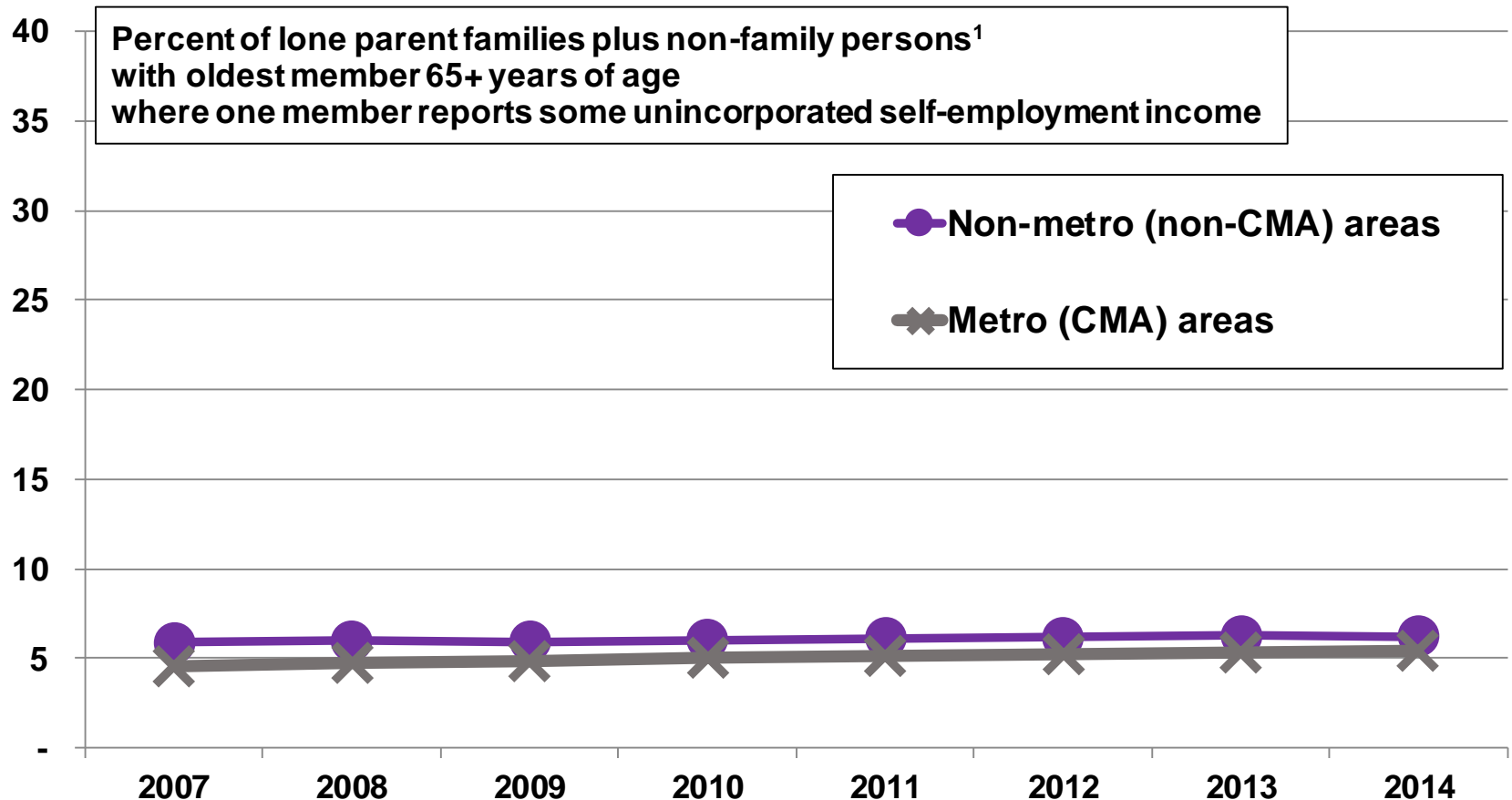

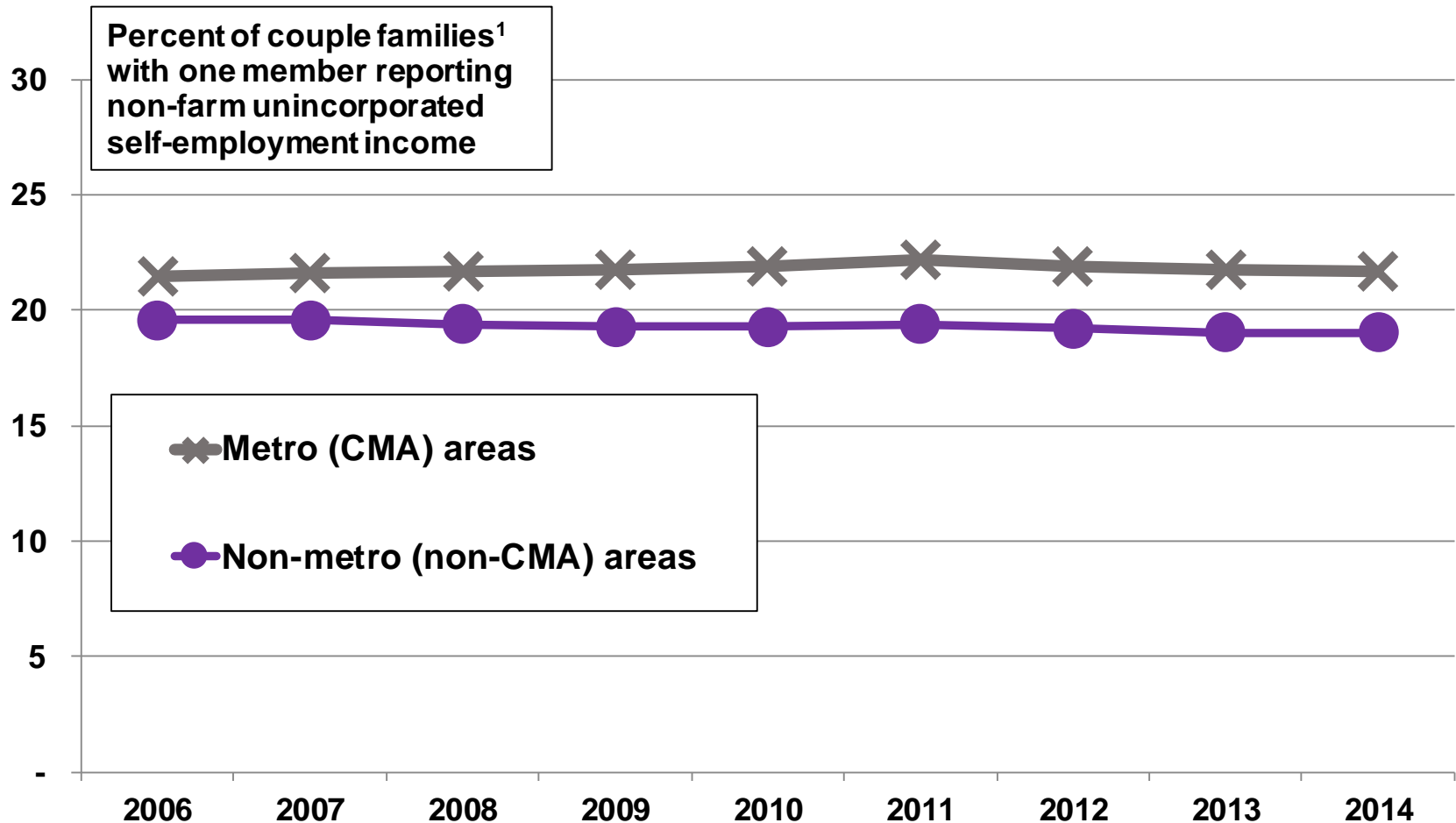

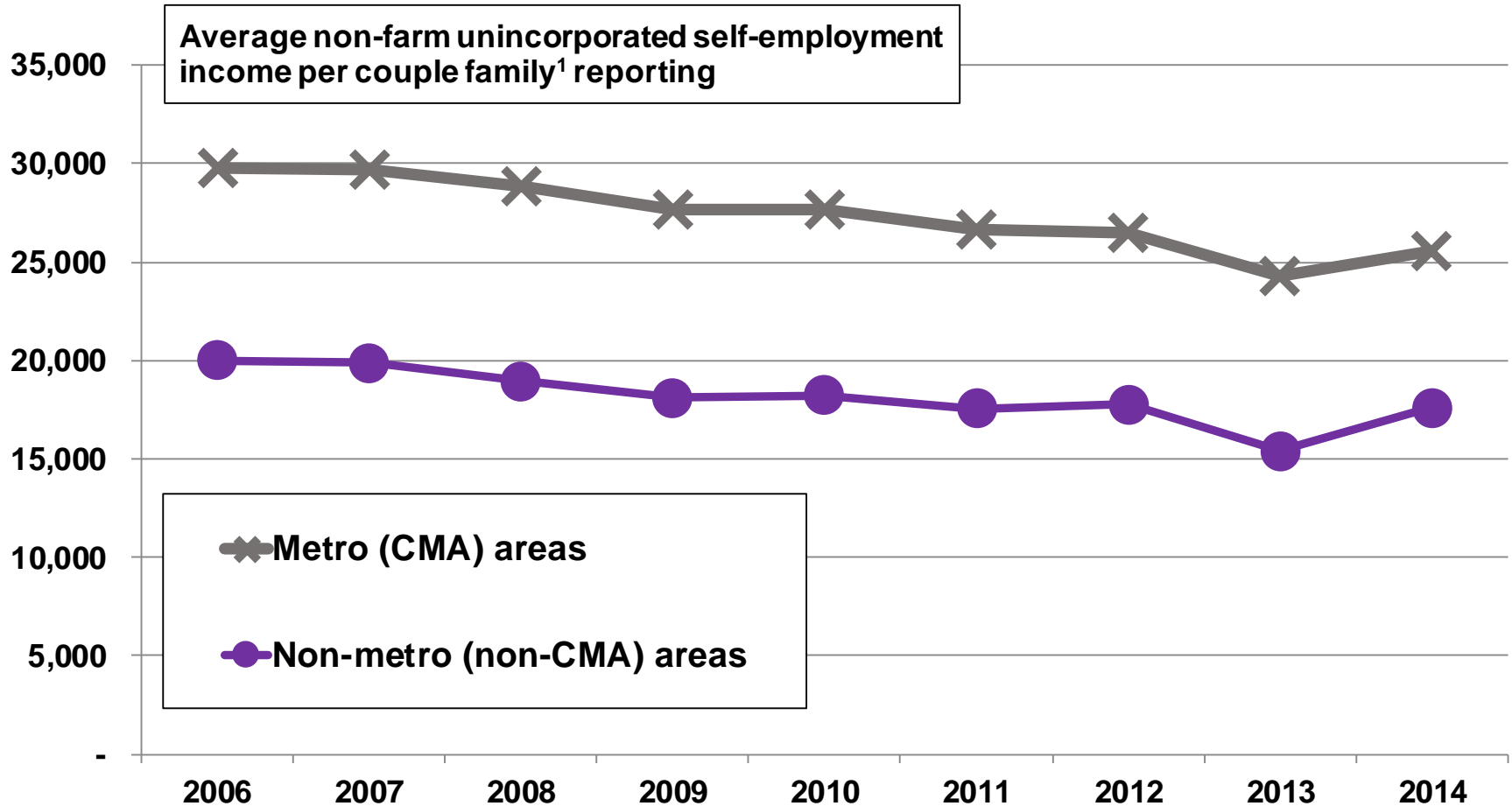

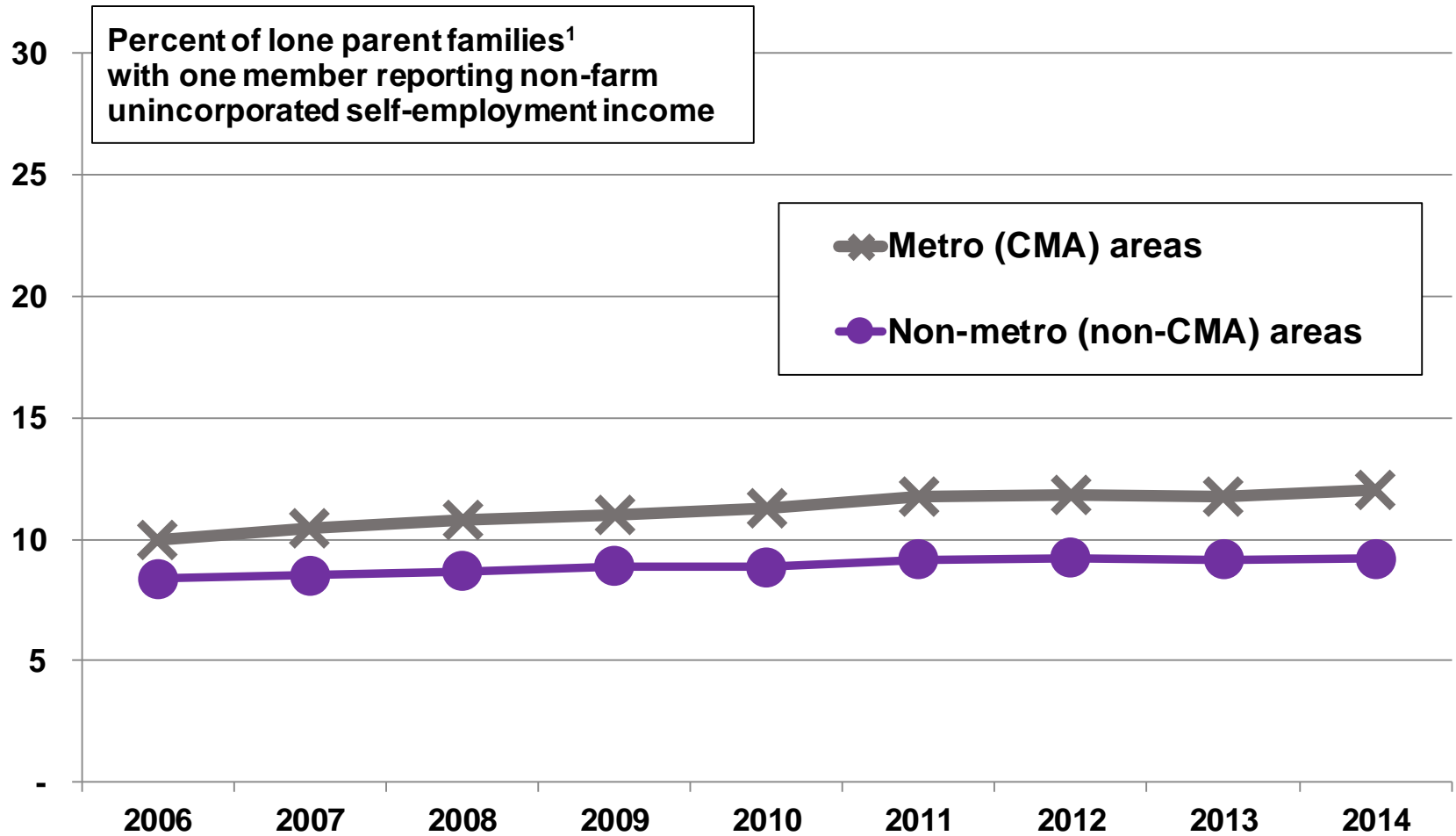

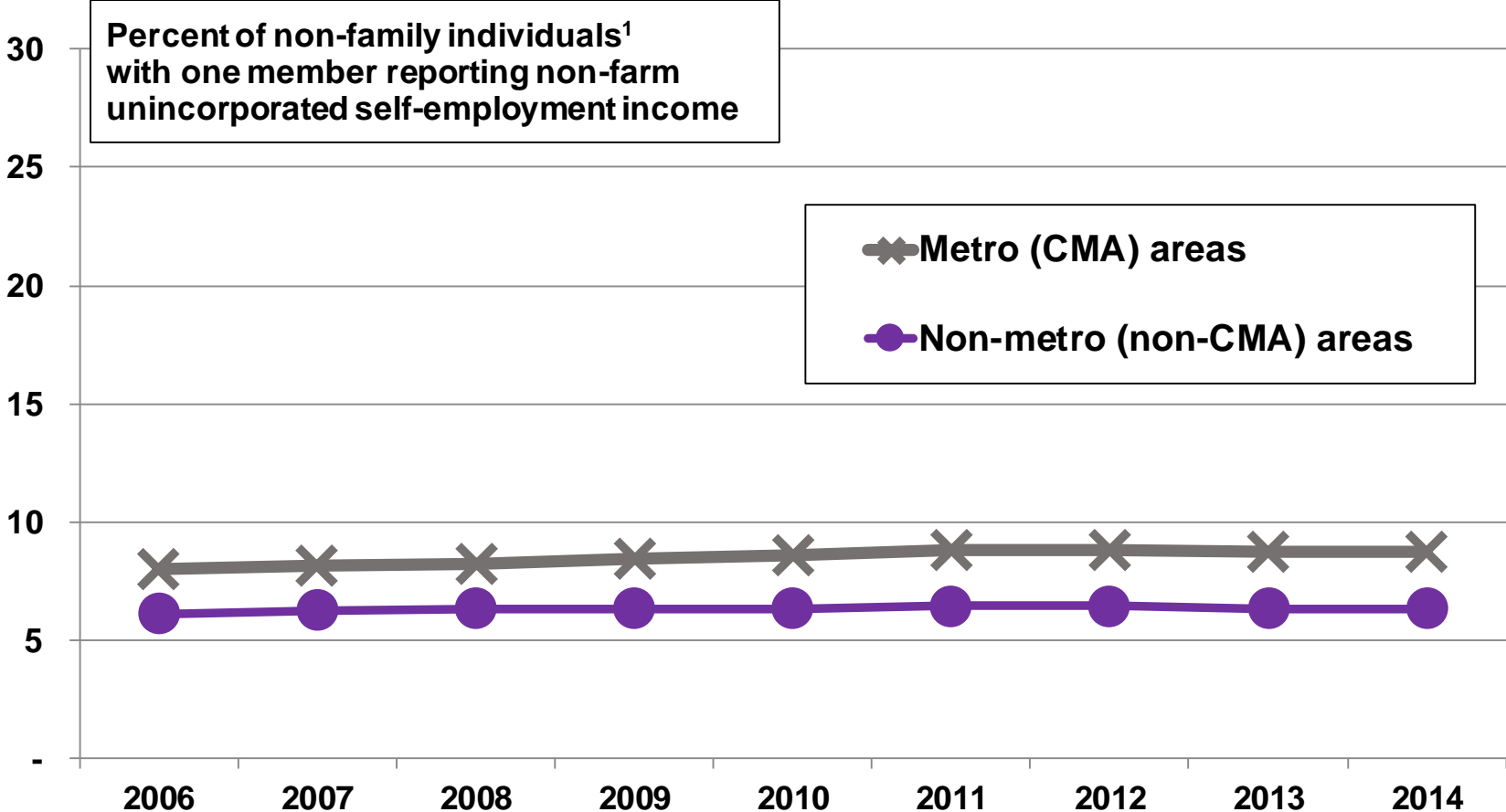

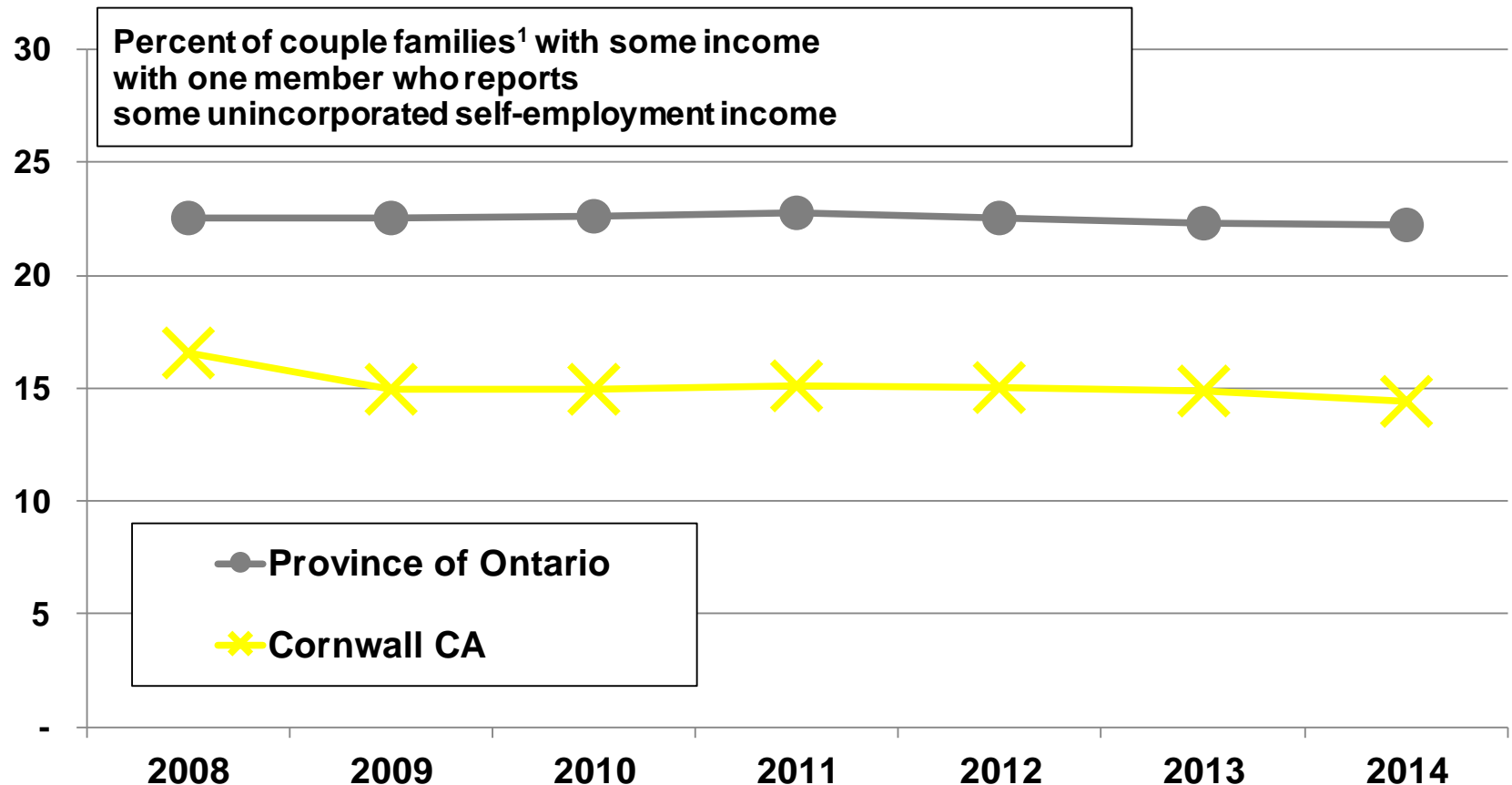

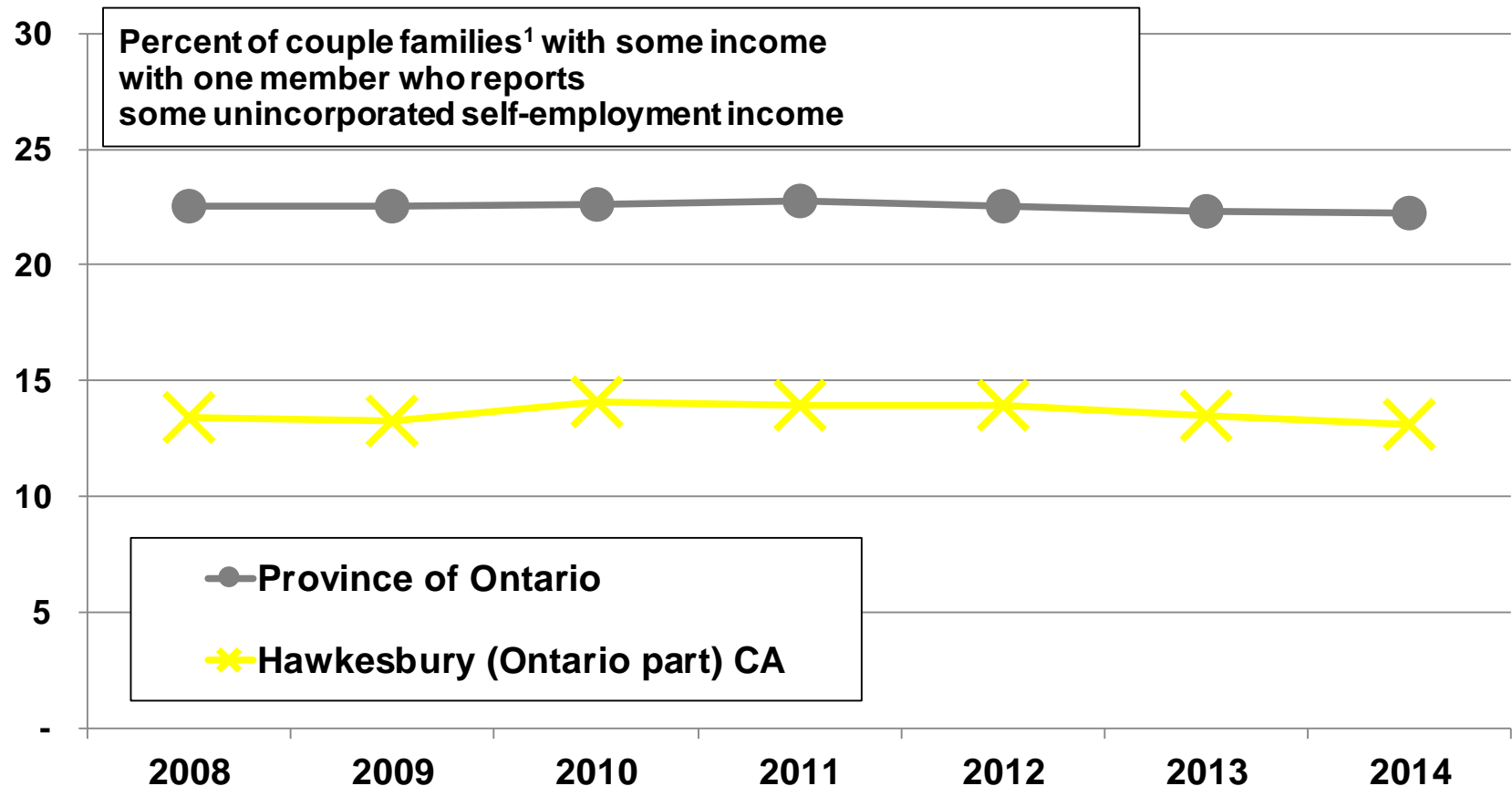

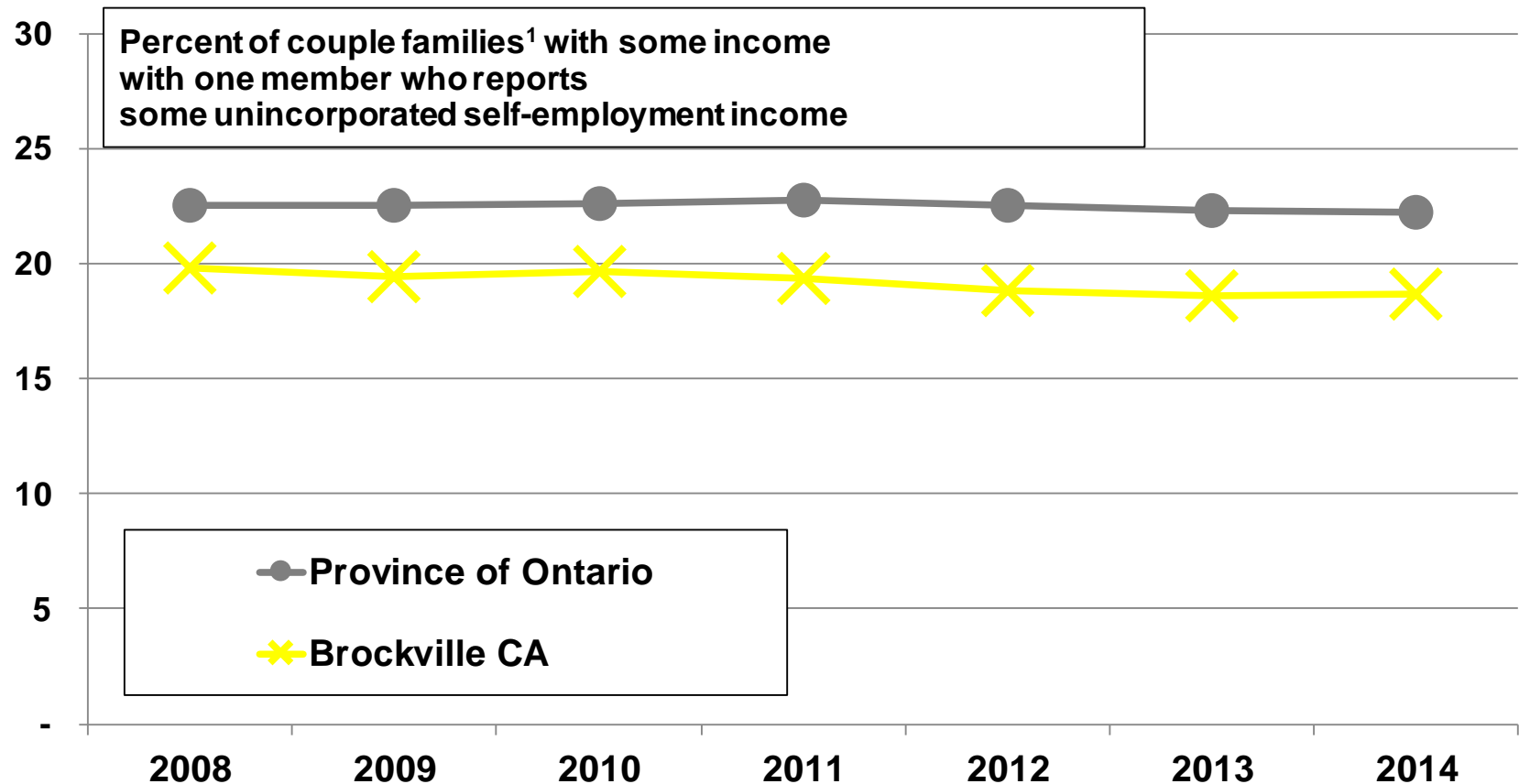

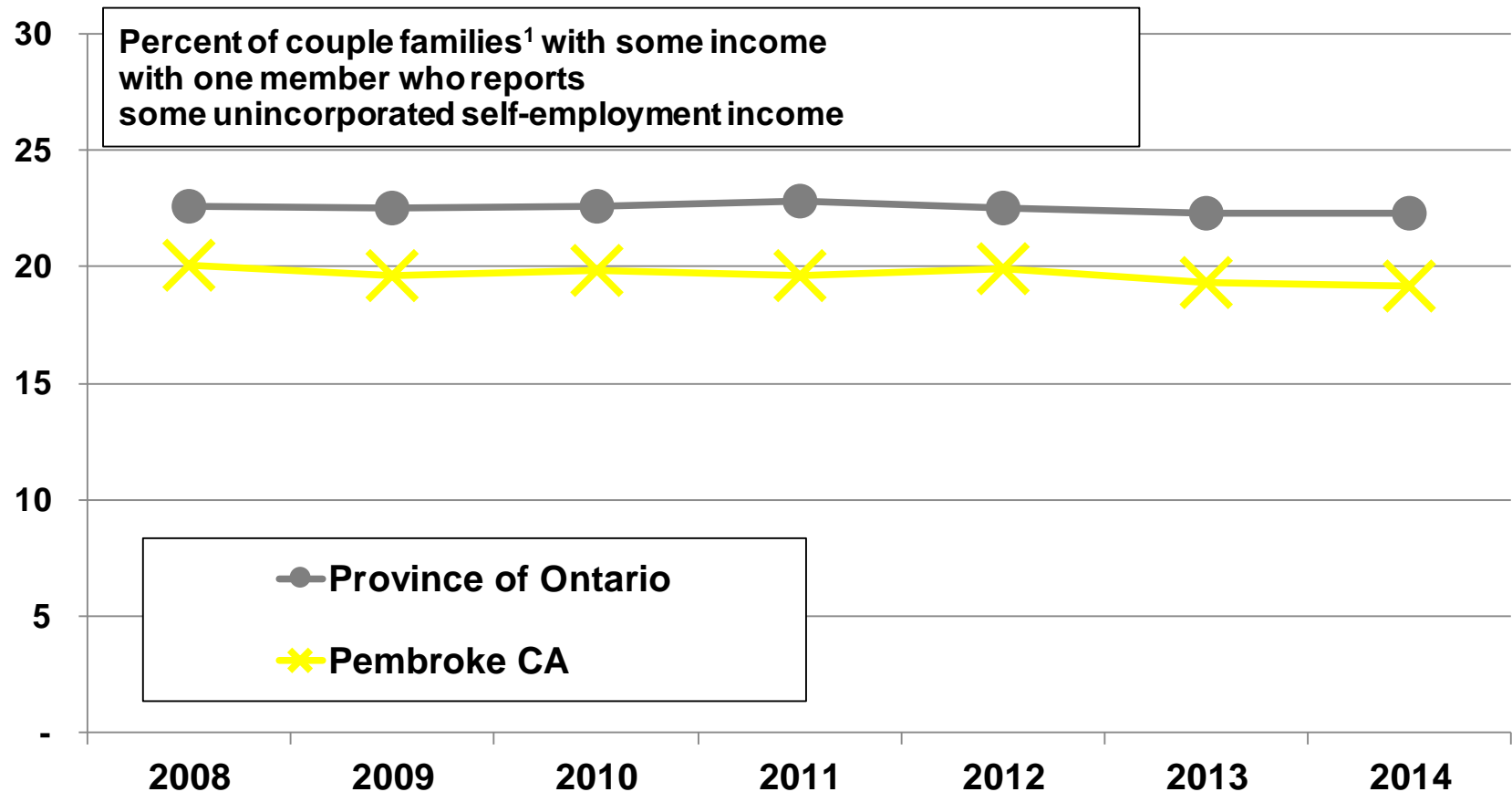

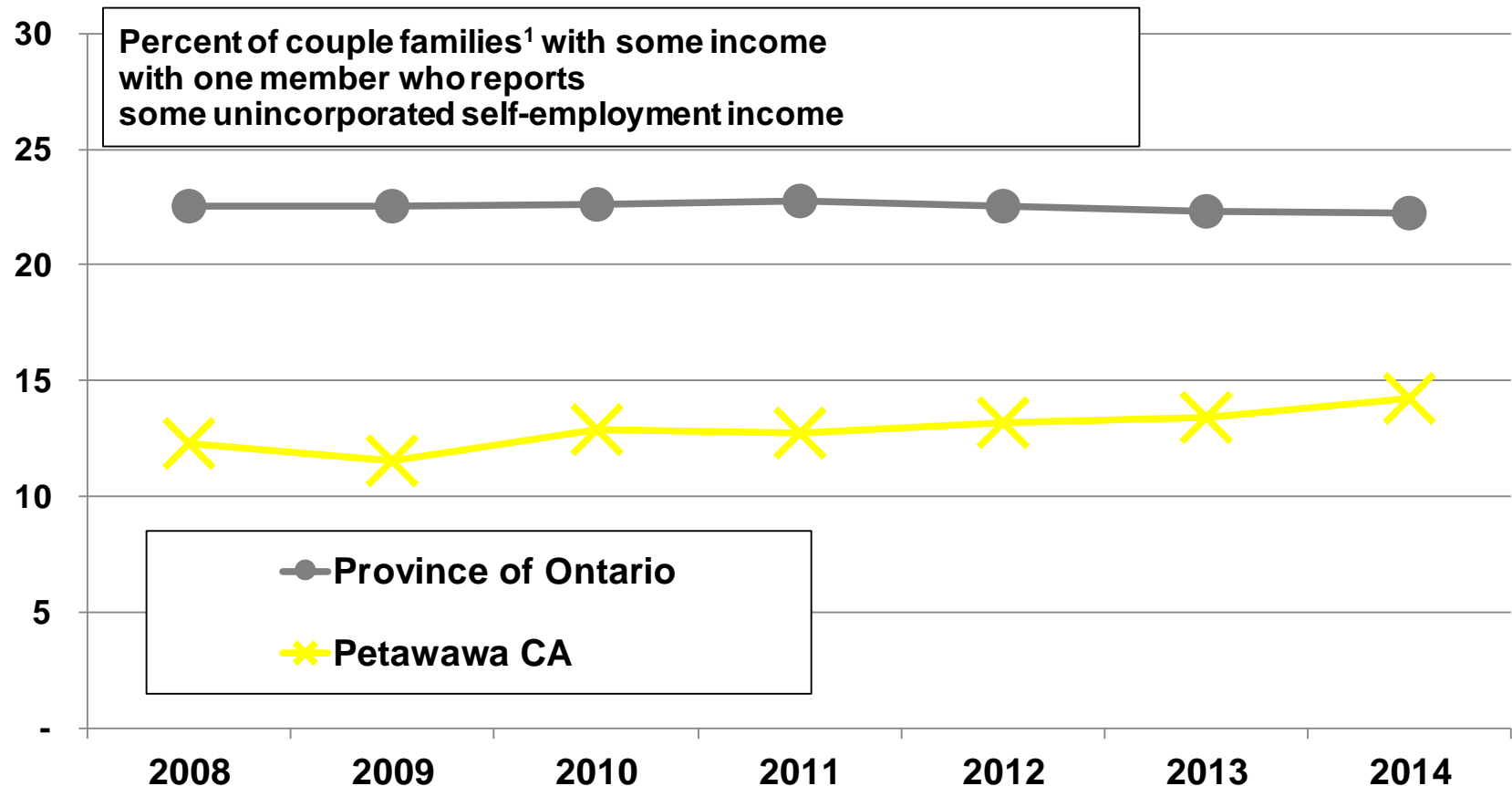

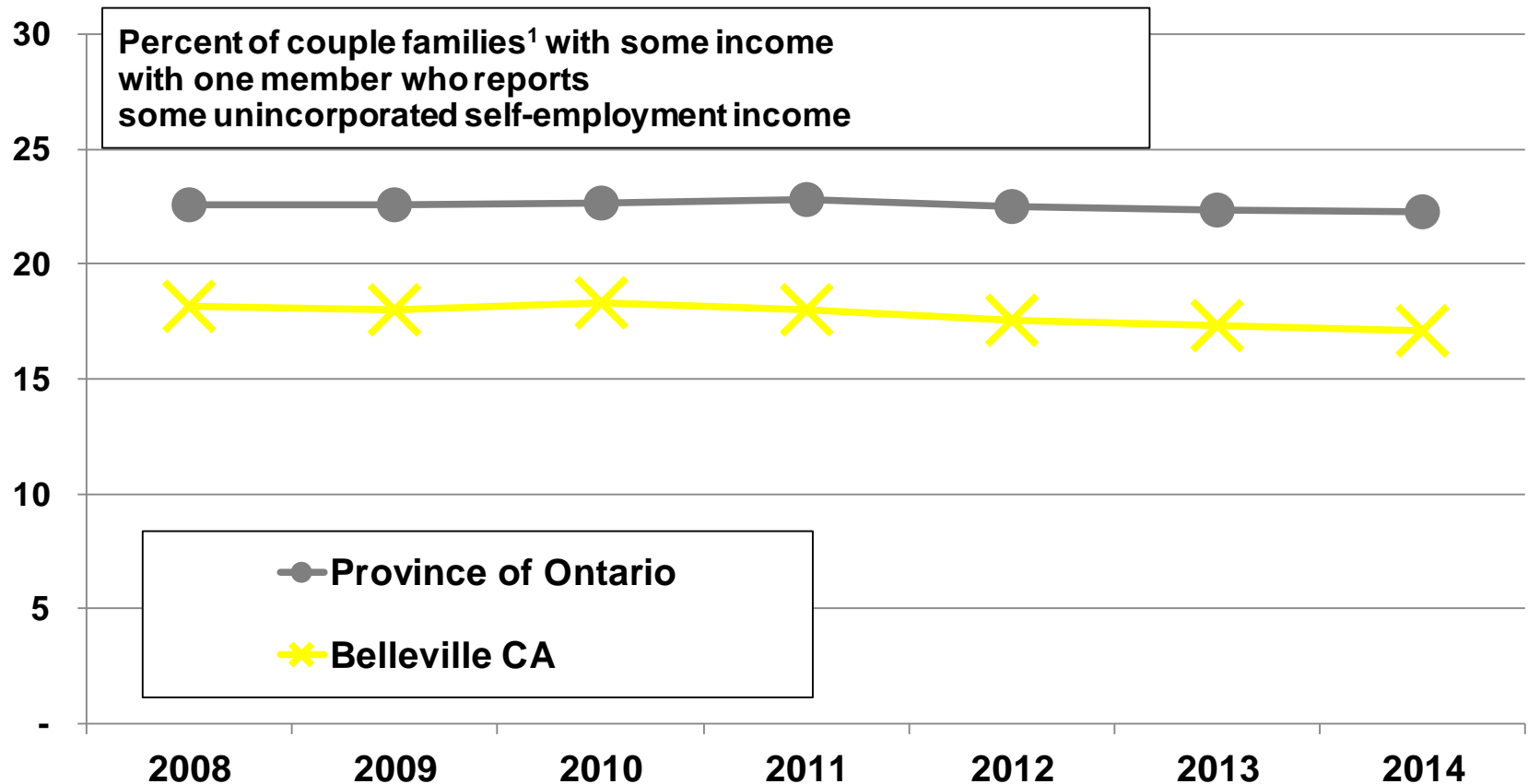

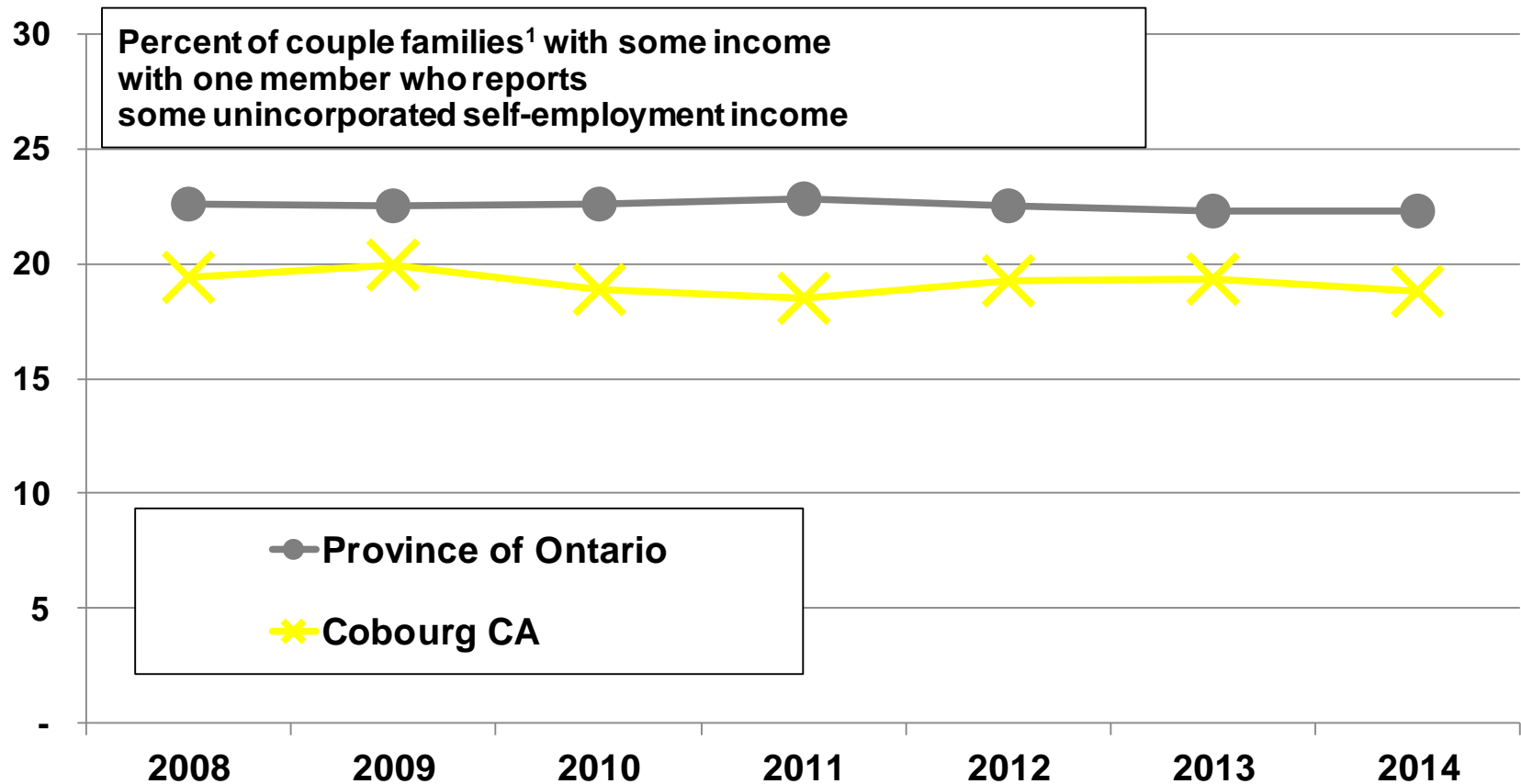

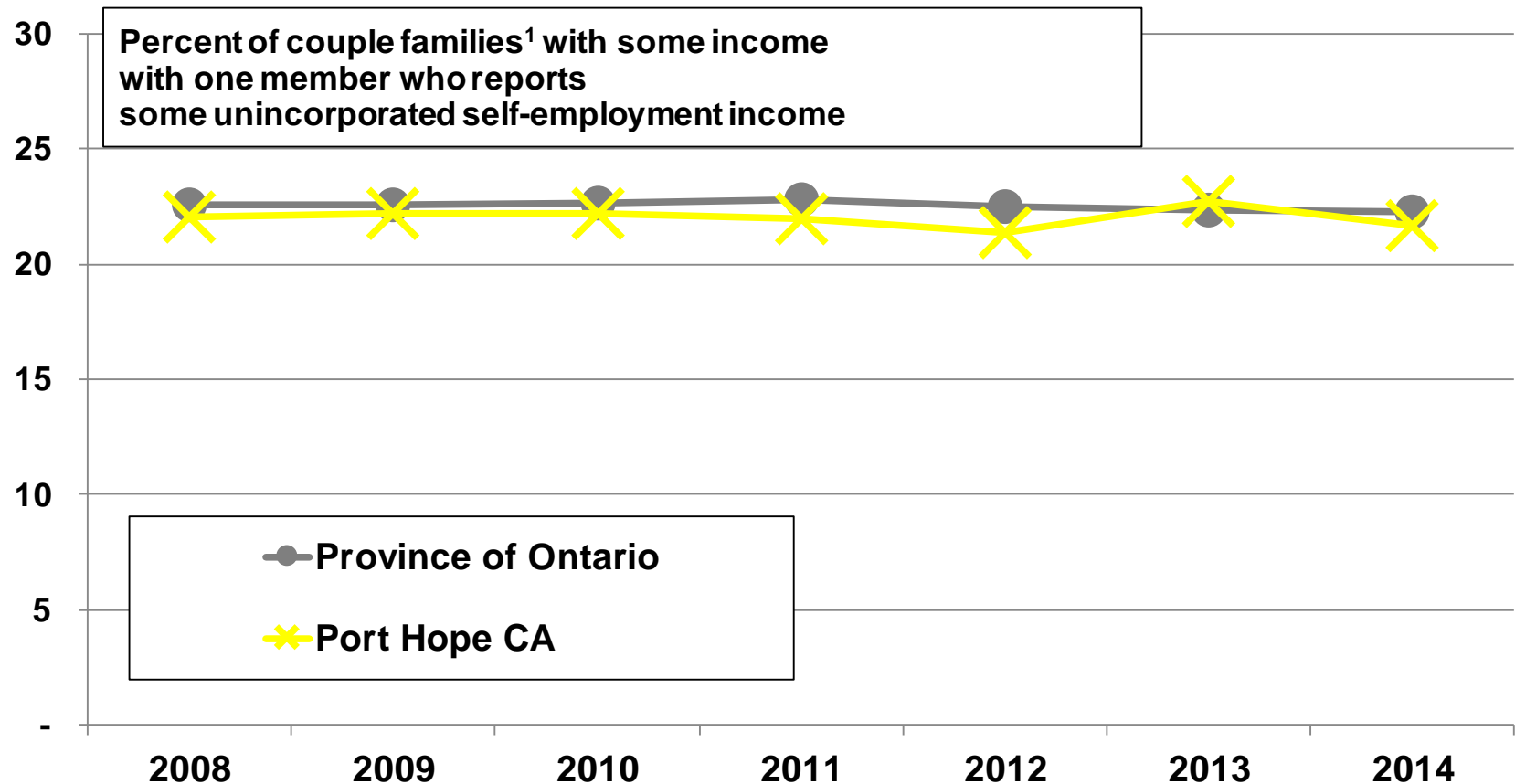

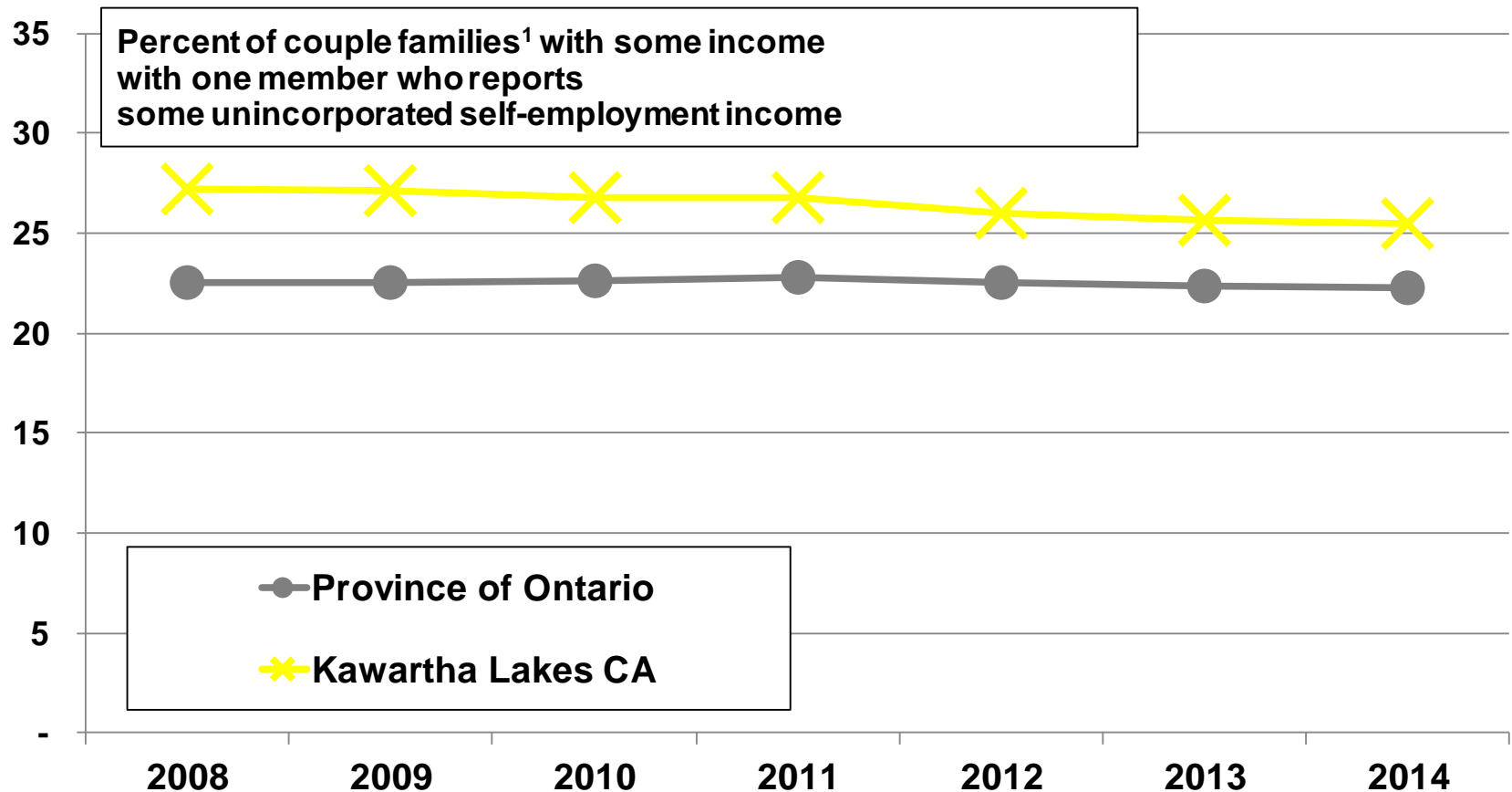

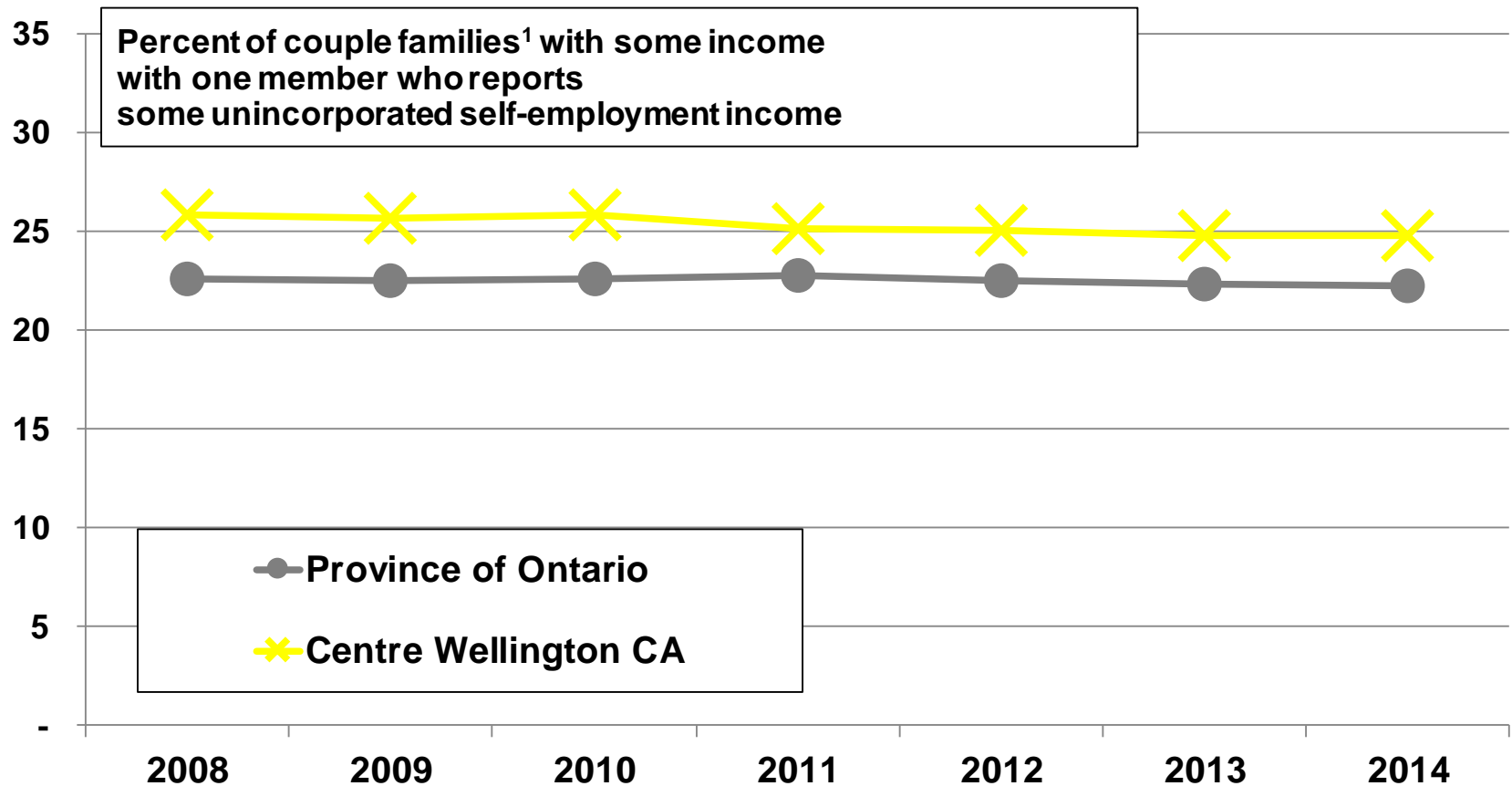

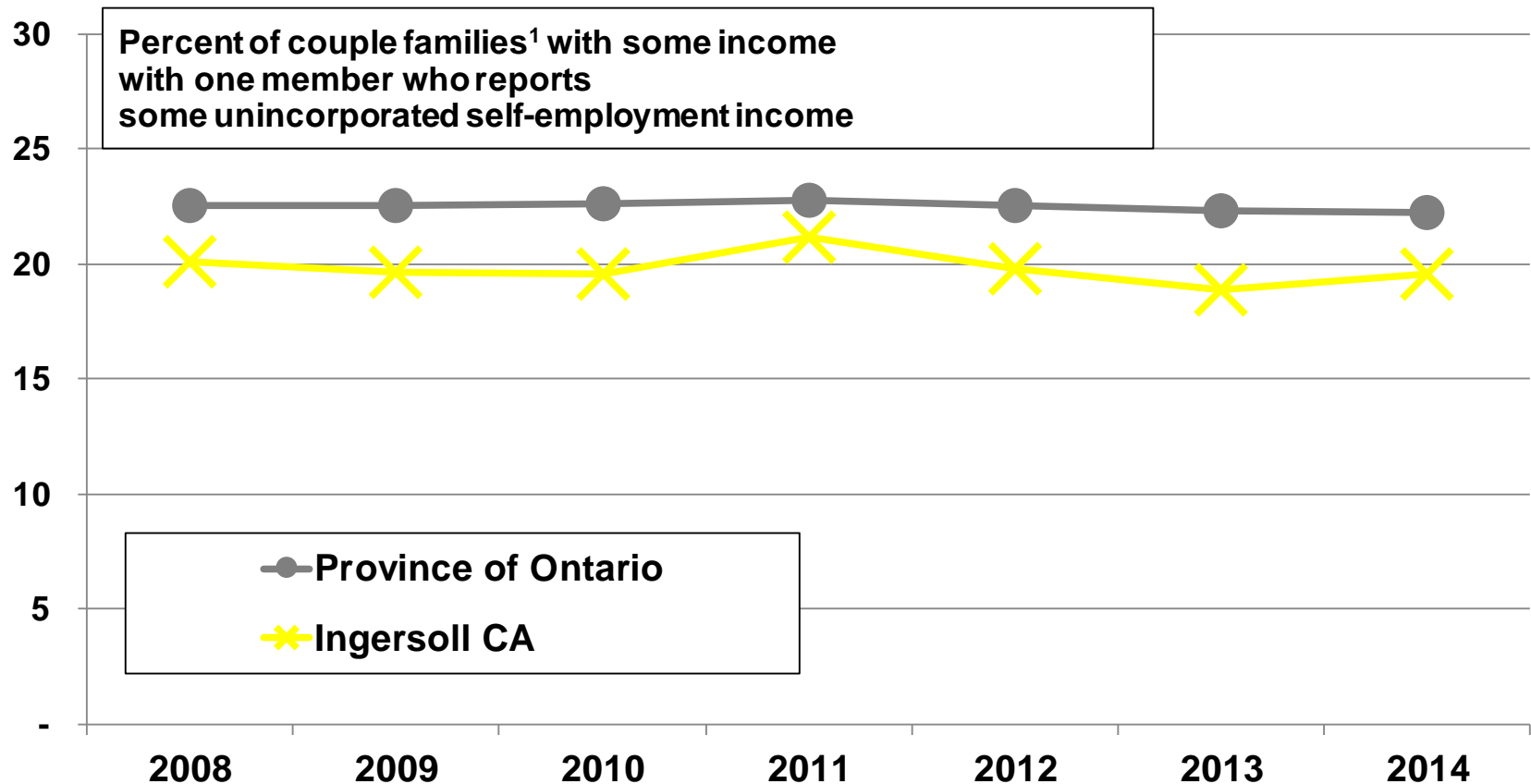

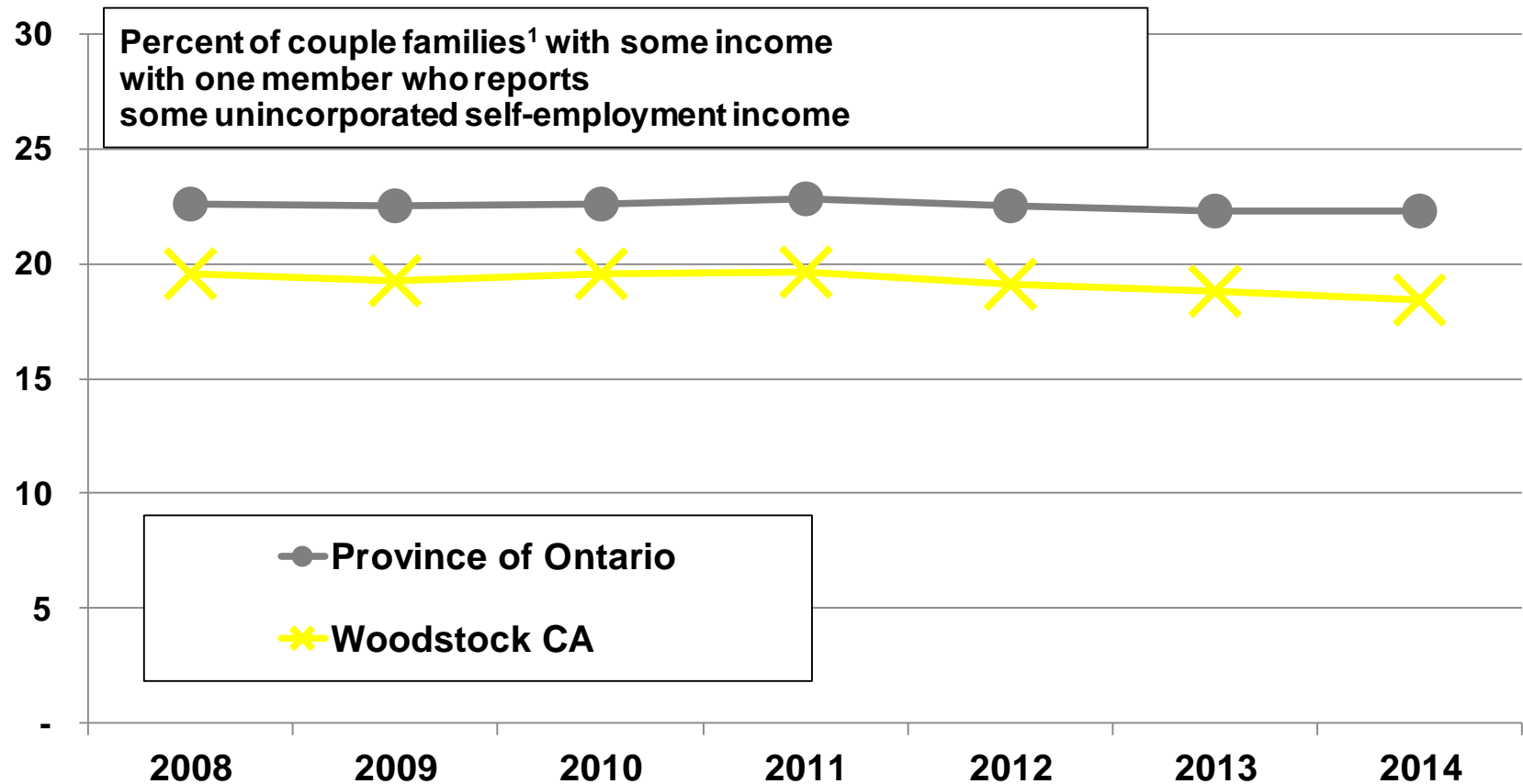

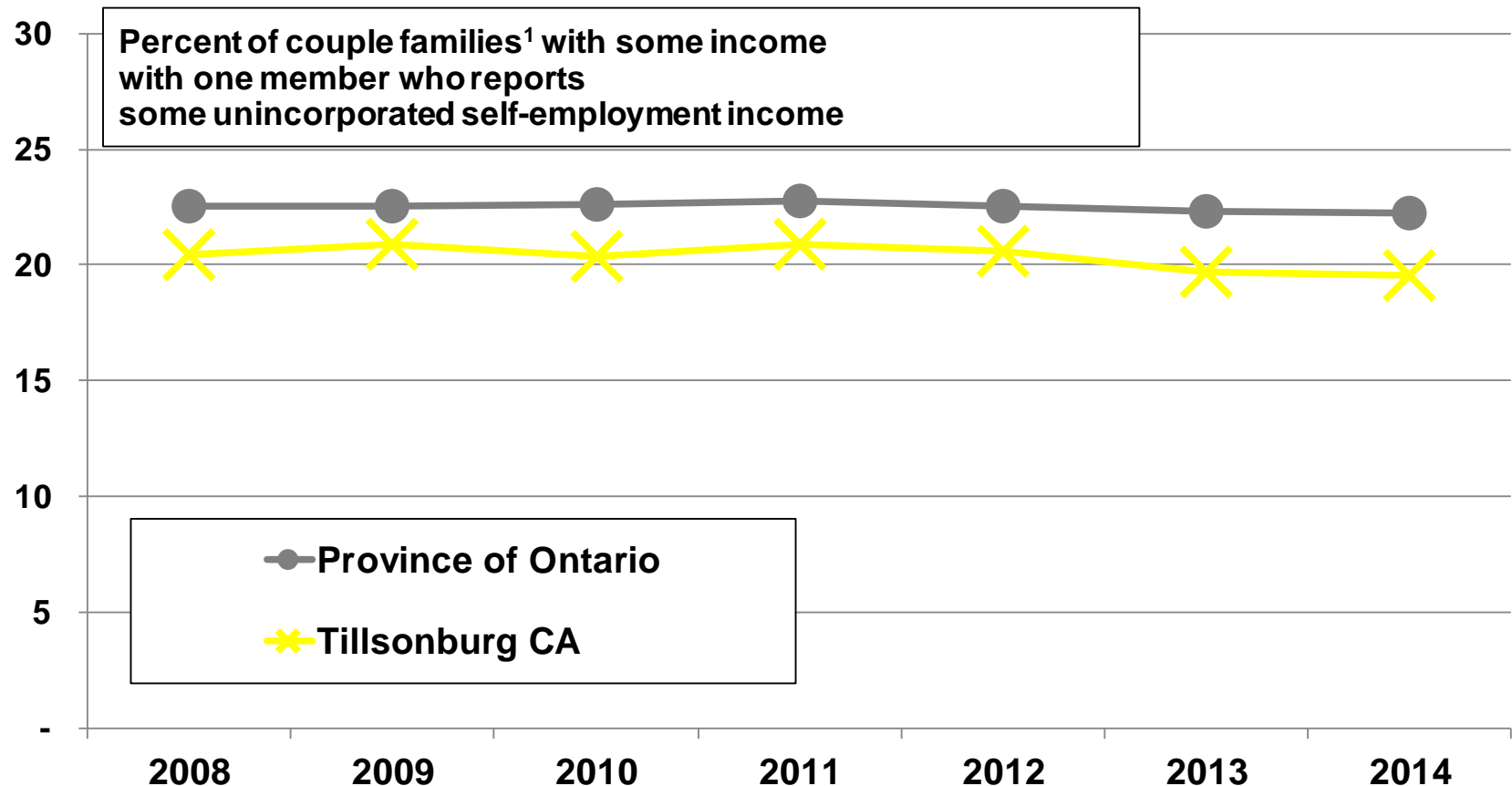

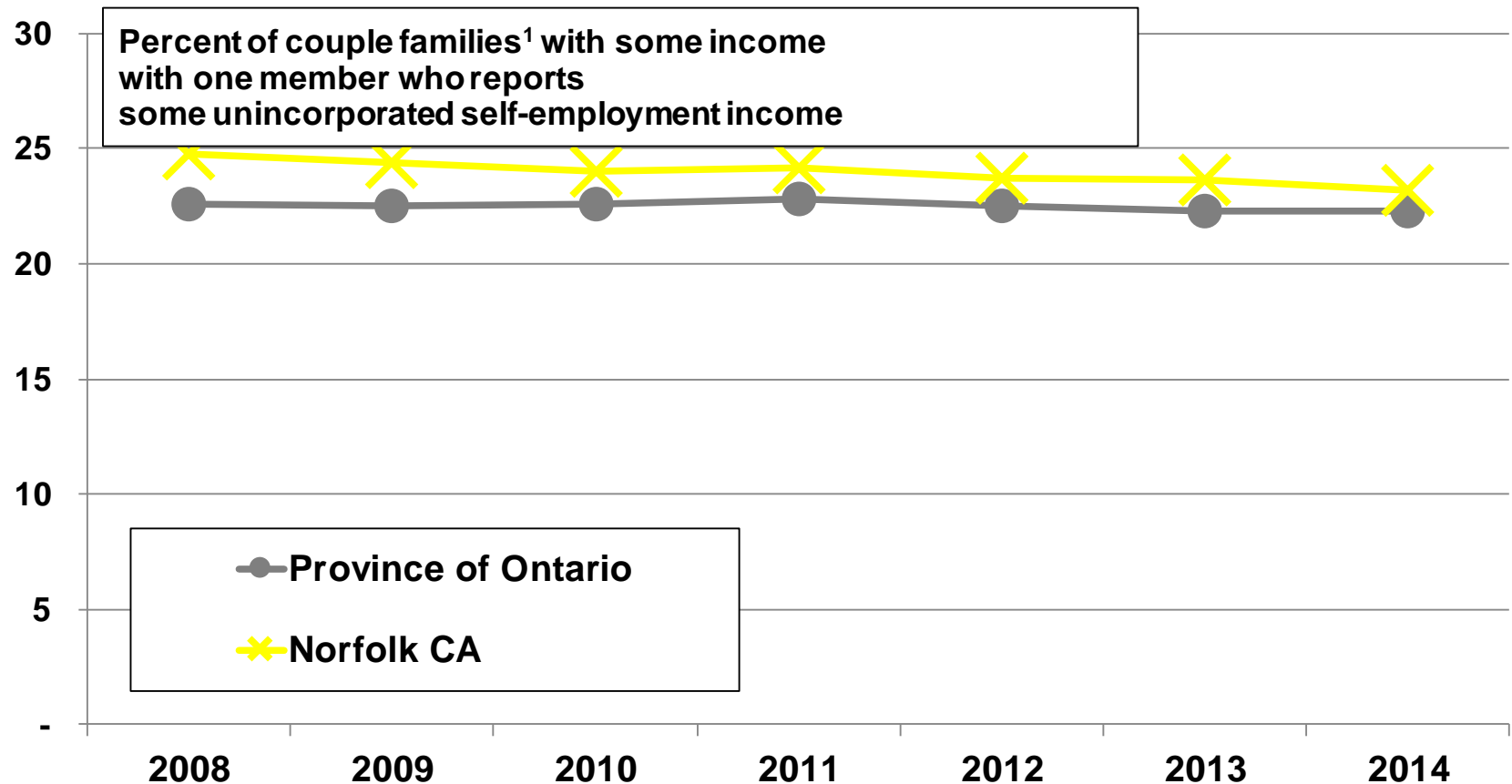

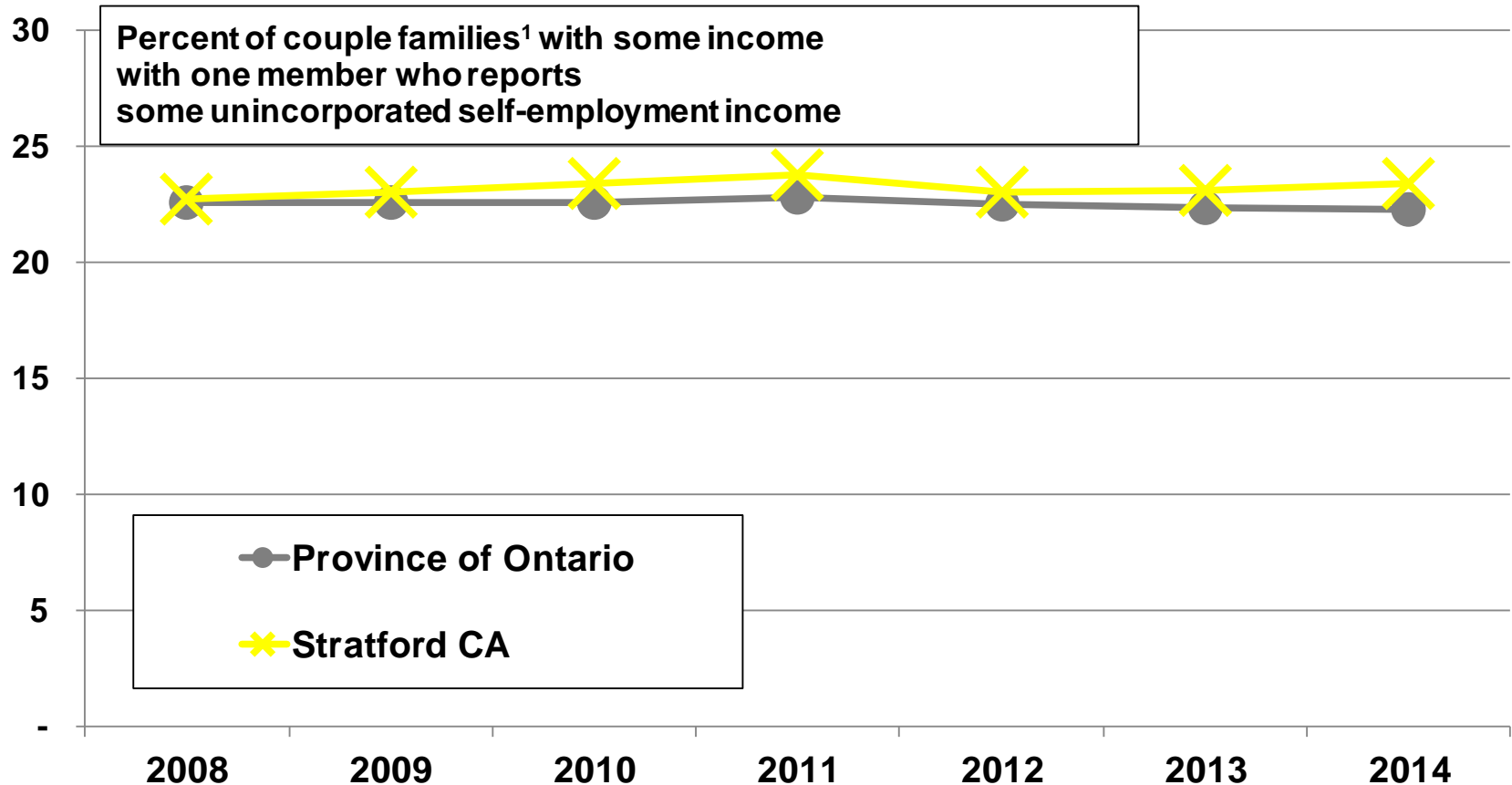

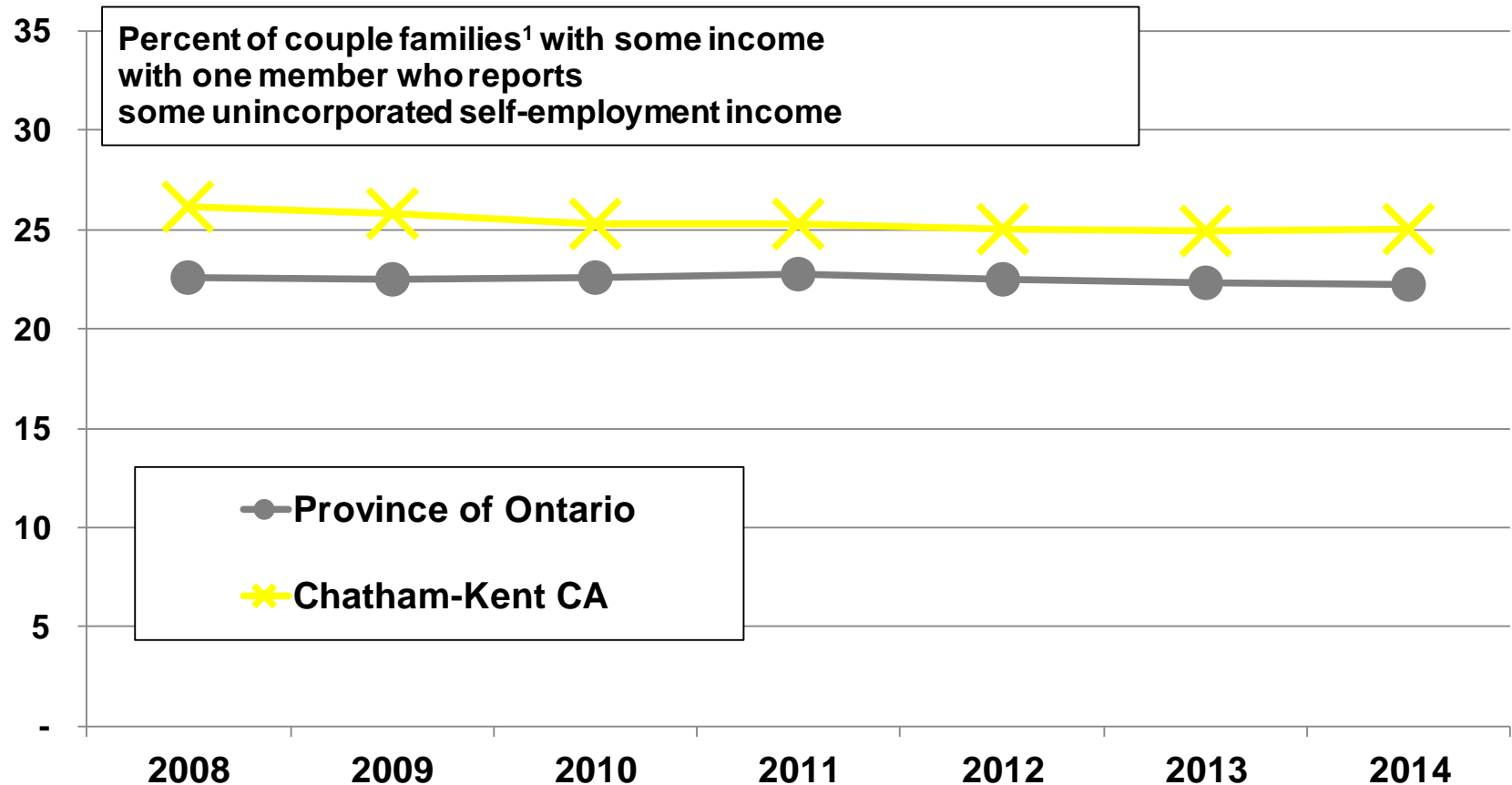

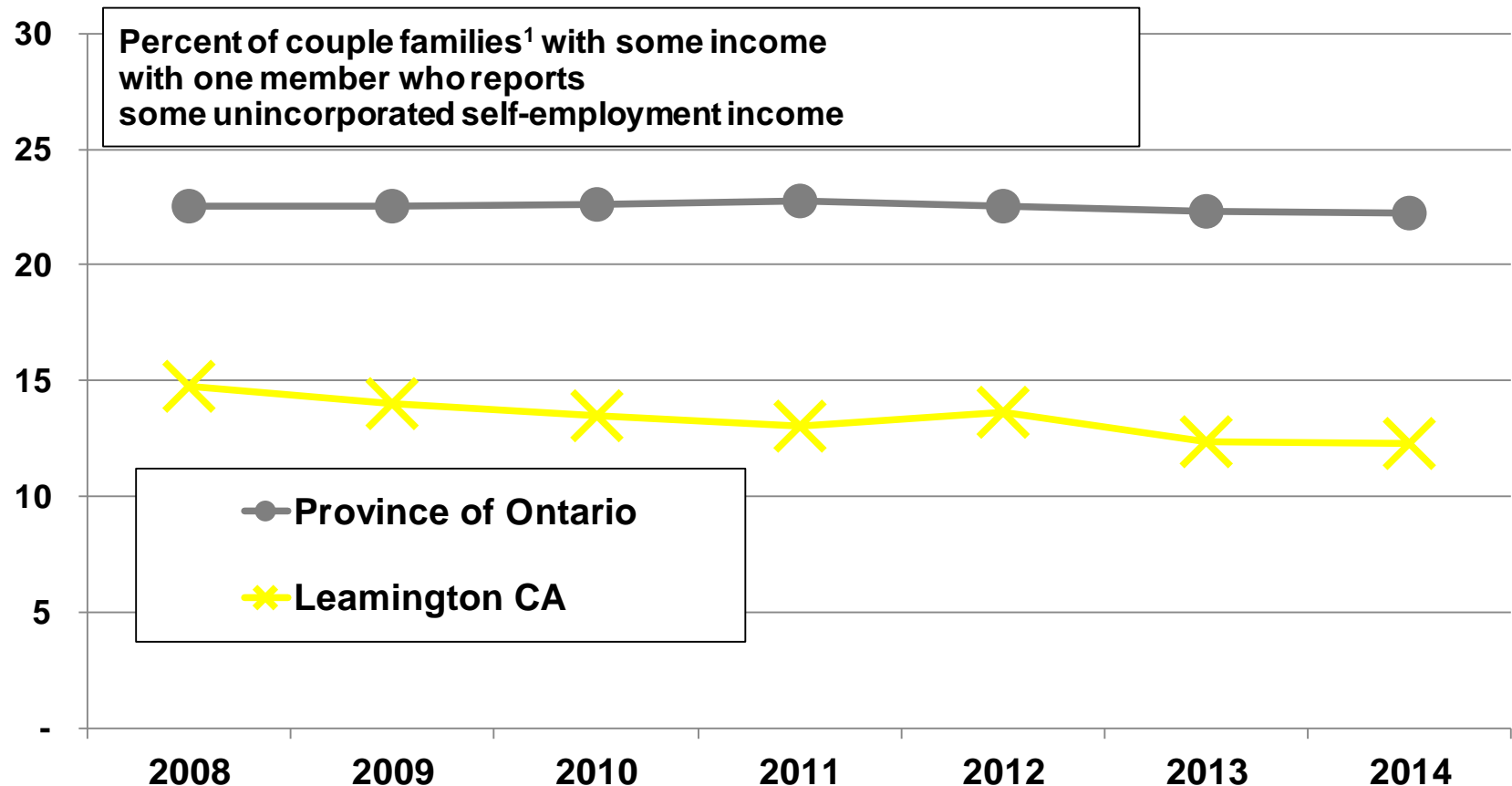

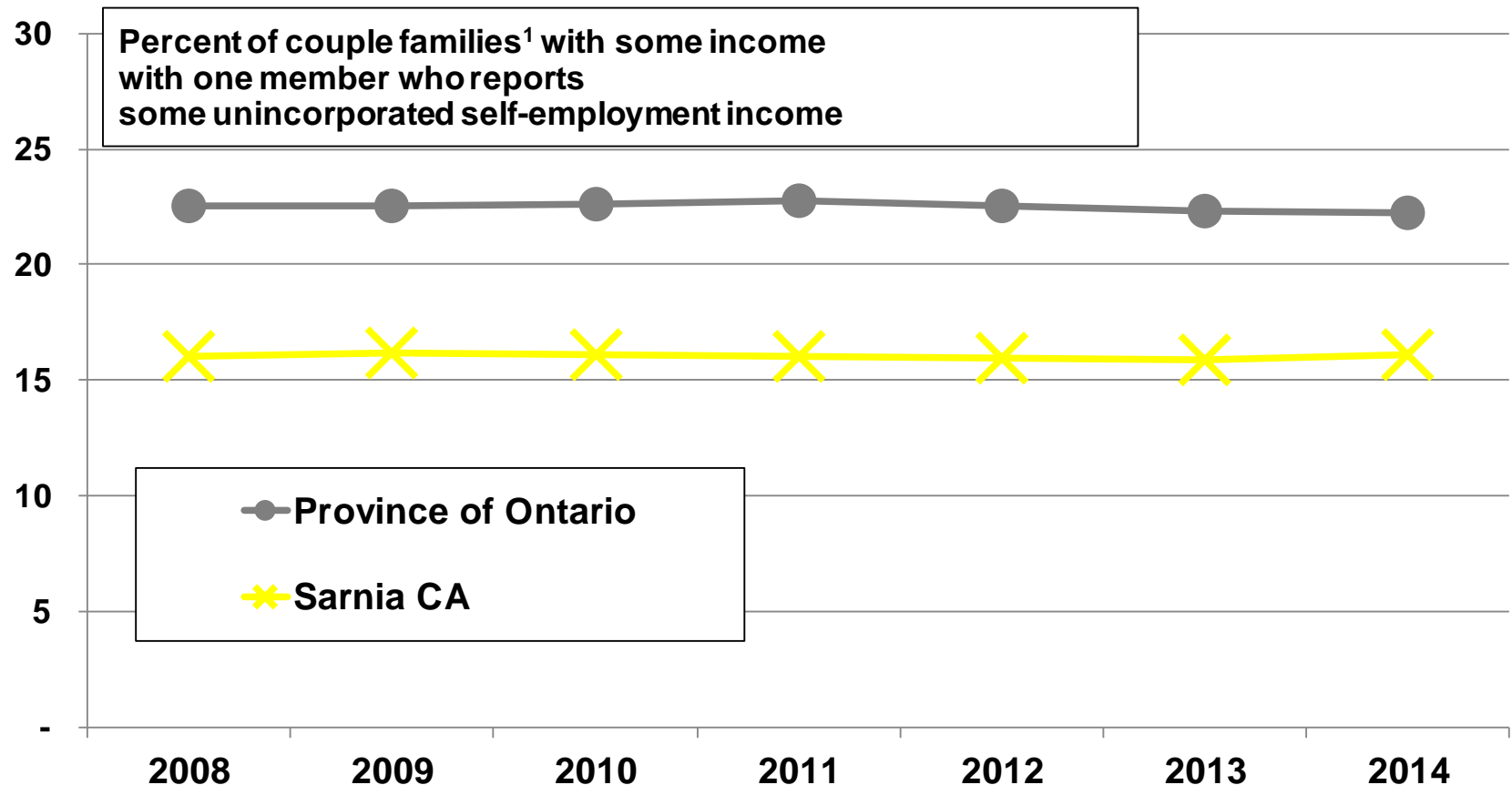

The percent of couple families¹ reporting some self-employment income: Sarnia CA²

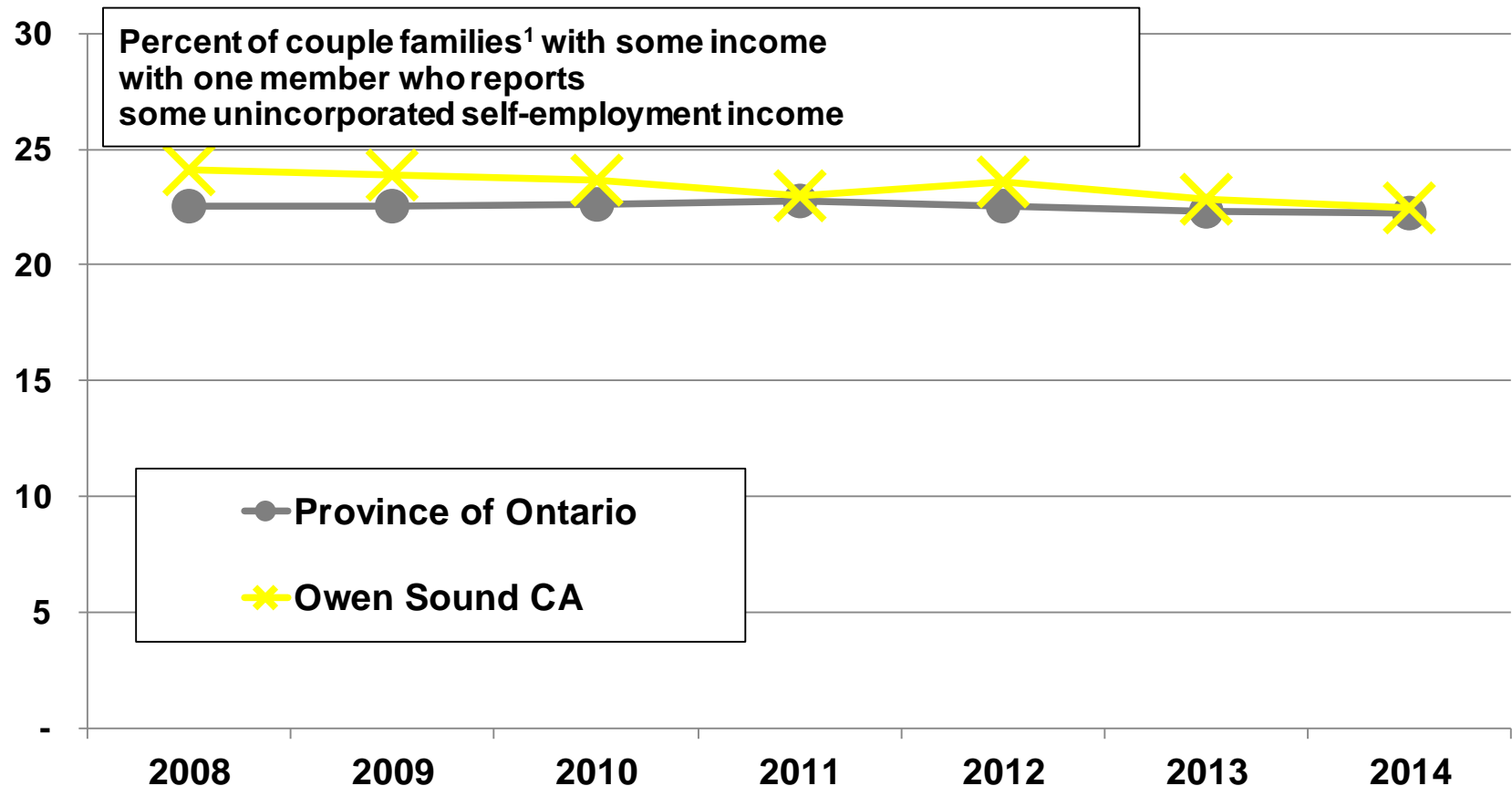

The percent of couple families¹ reporting some self-employment income: Owen Sound CA²

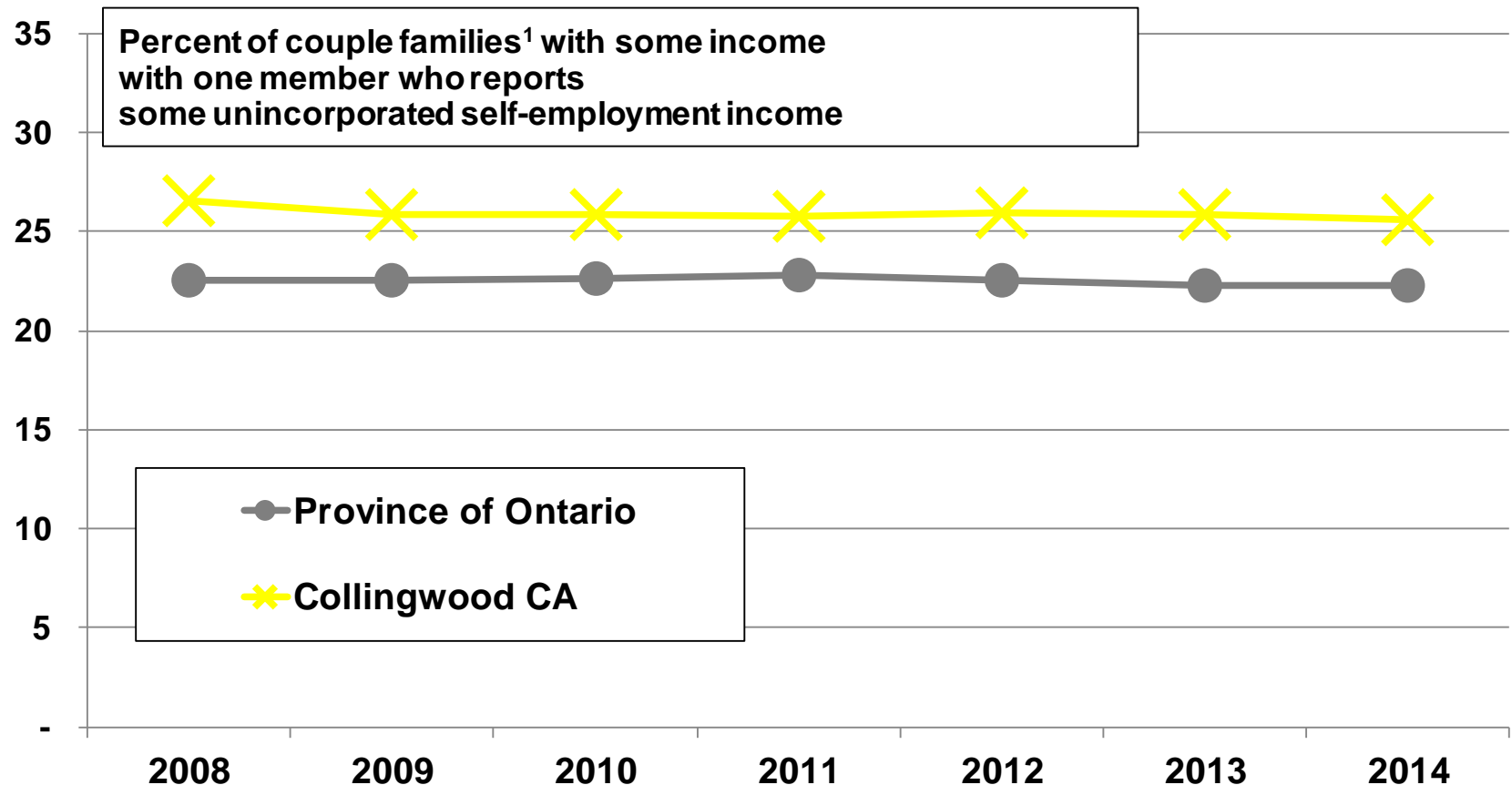

The percent of couple families¹ reporting some self-employment income: Collingwood CA²

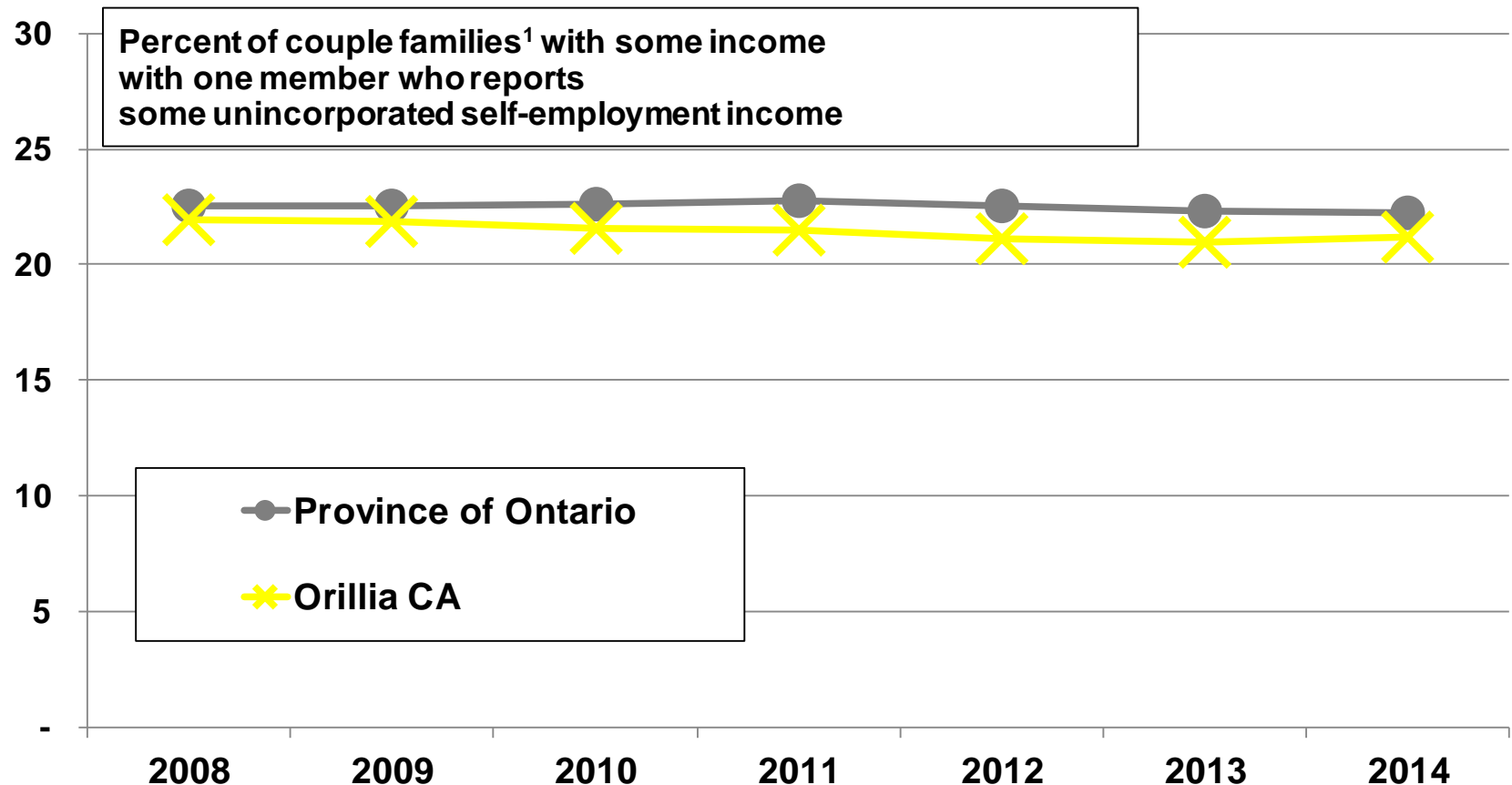

The percent of couple families¹ reporting some self-employment income: Orillia CA²

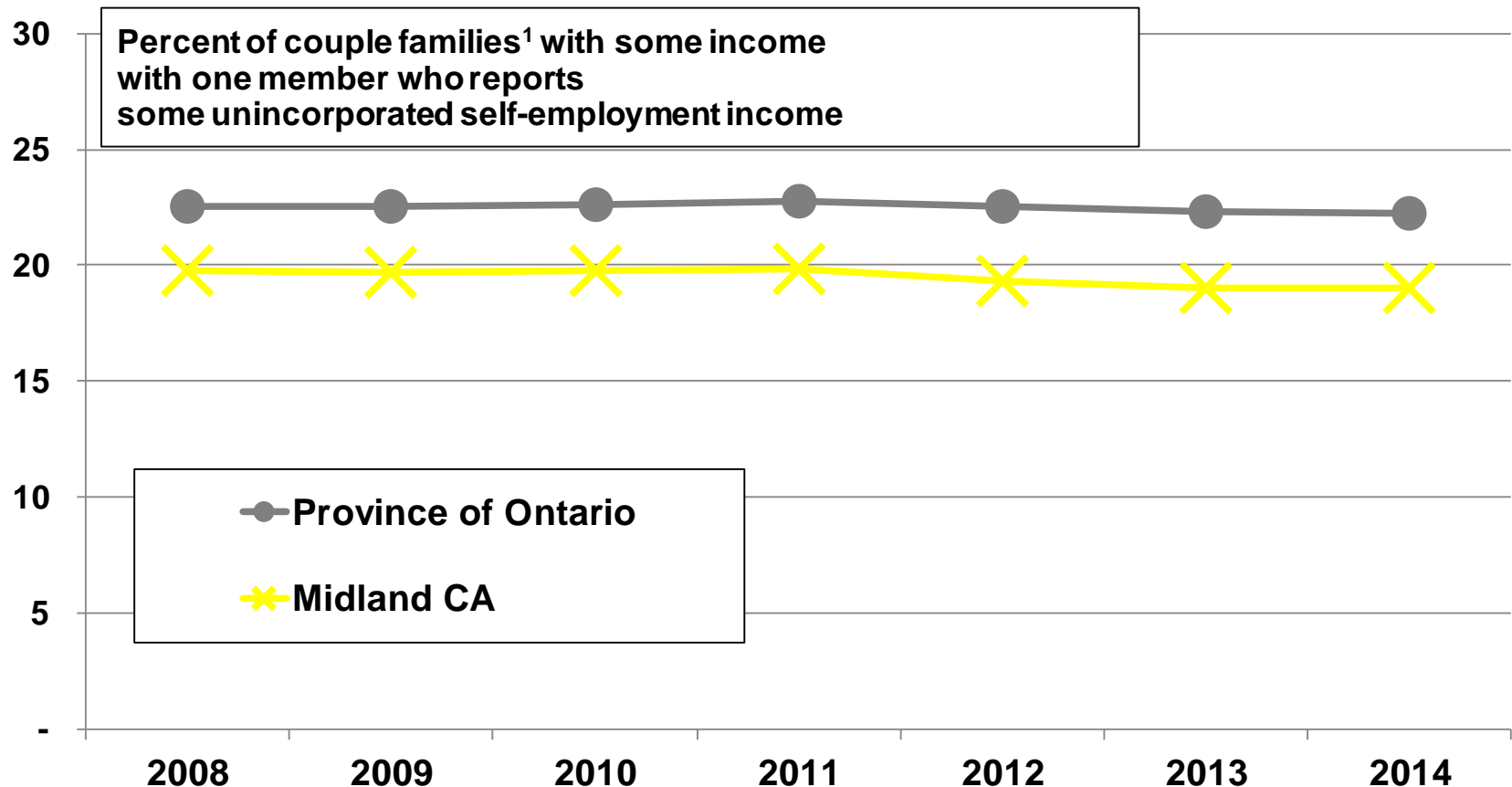

The percent of couple families¹ reporting some self-employment income: Midland CA²

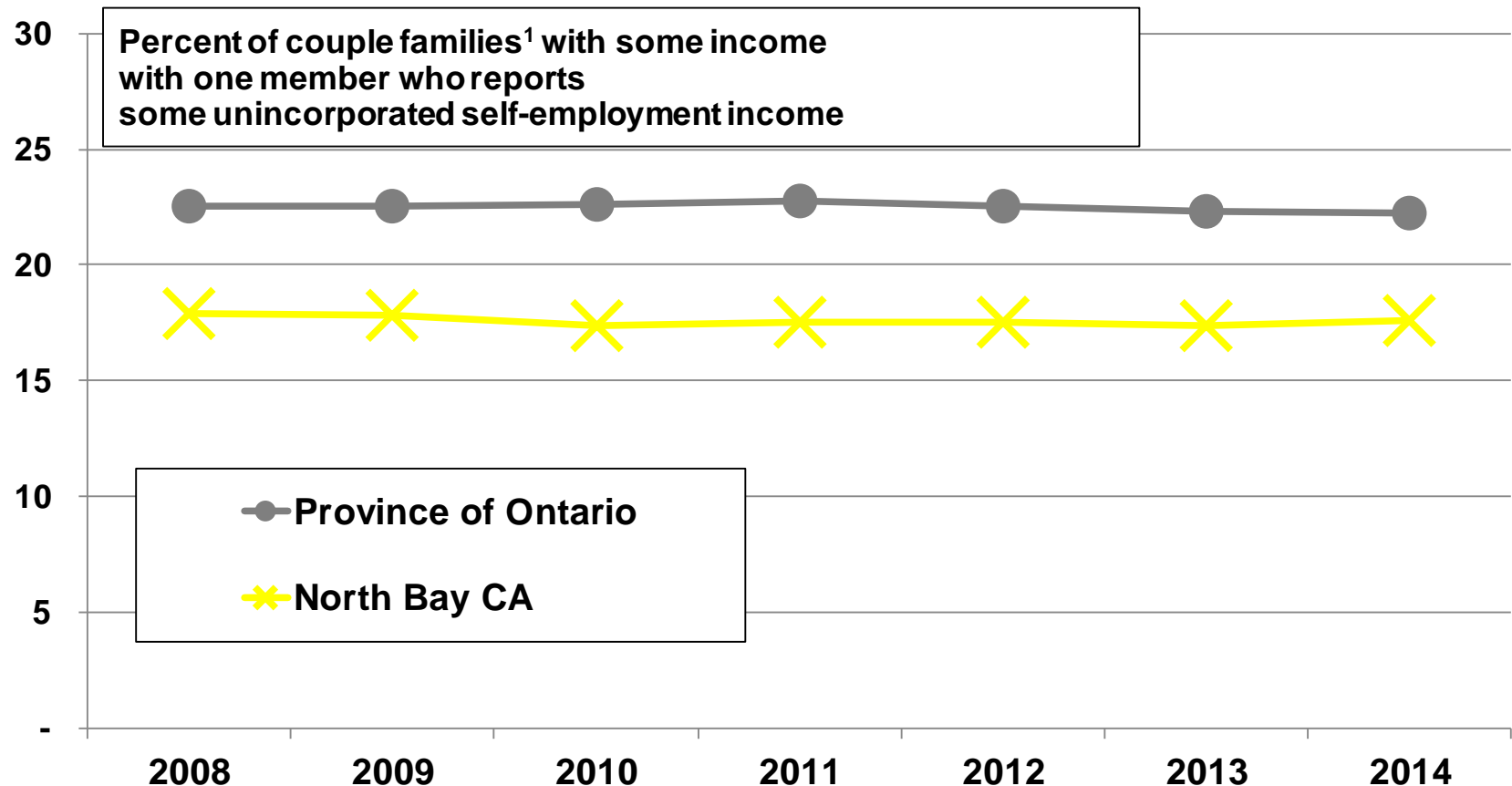

The percent of couple families¹ reporting some self-employment income: North Bay CA²

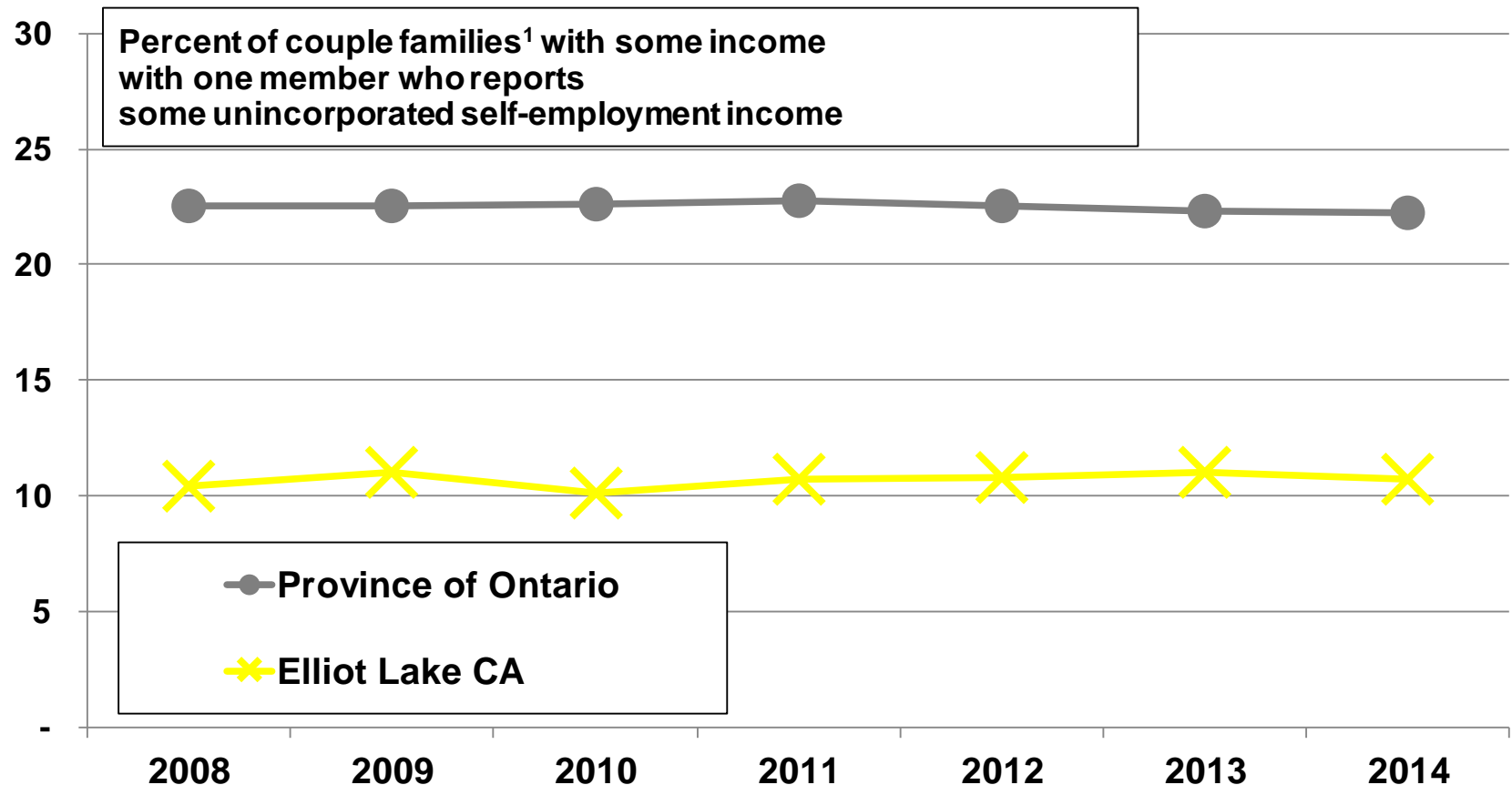

The percent of couple families¹ reporting some self-employment income: Elliot Lake CA²

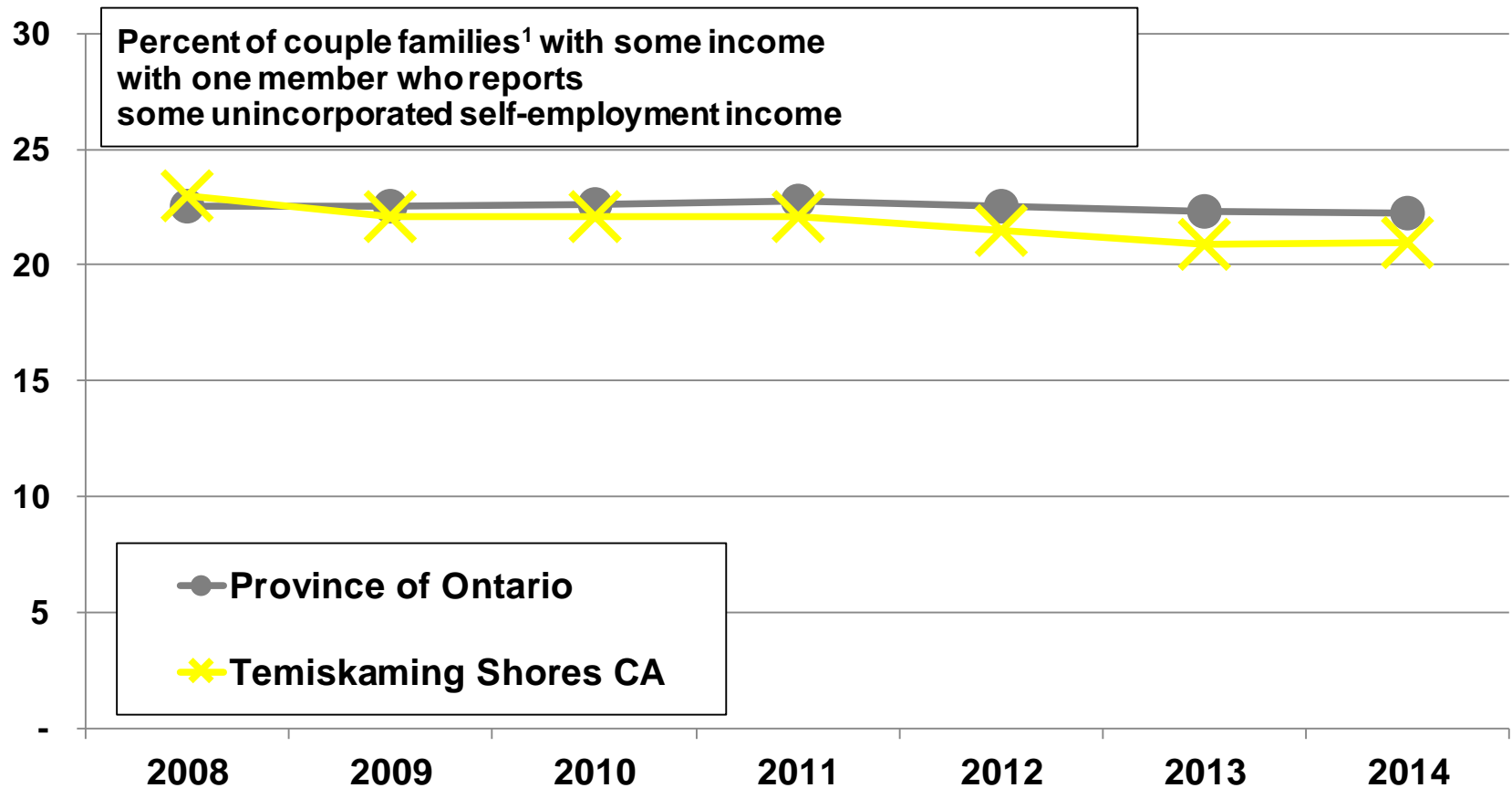

The percent of couple families¹ reporting some self-employment income: Temiskaming Shores CA²

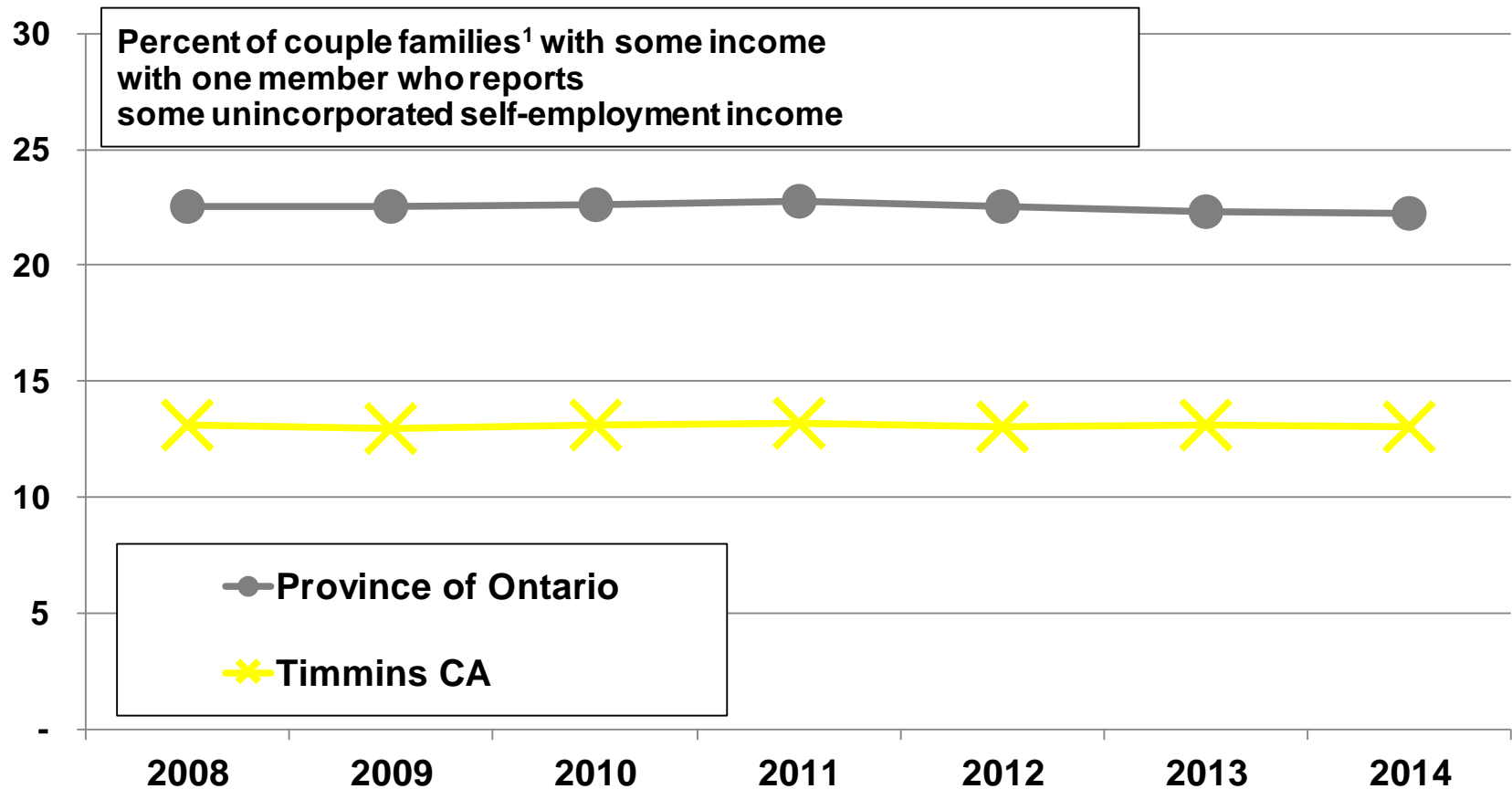

The percent of couple families¹ reporting some self-employment income: Timmins CA²

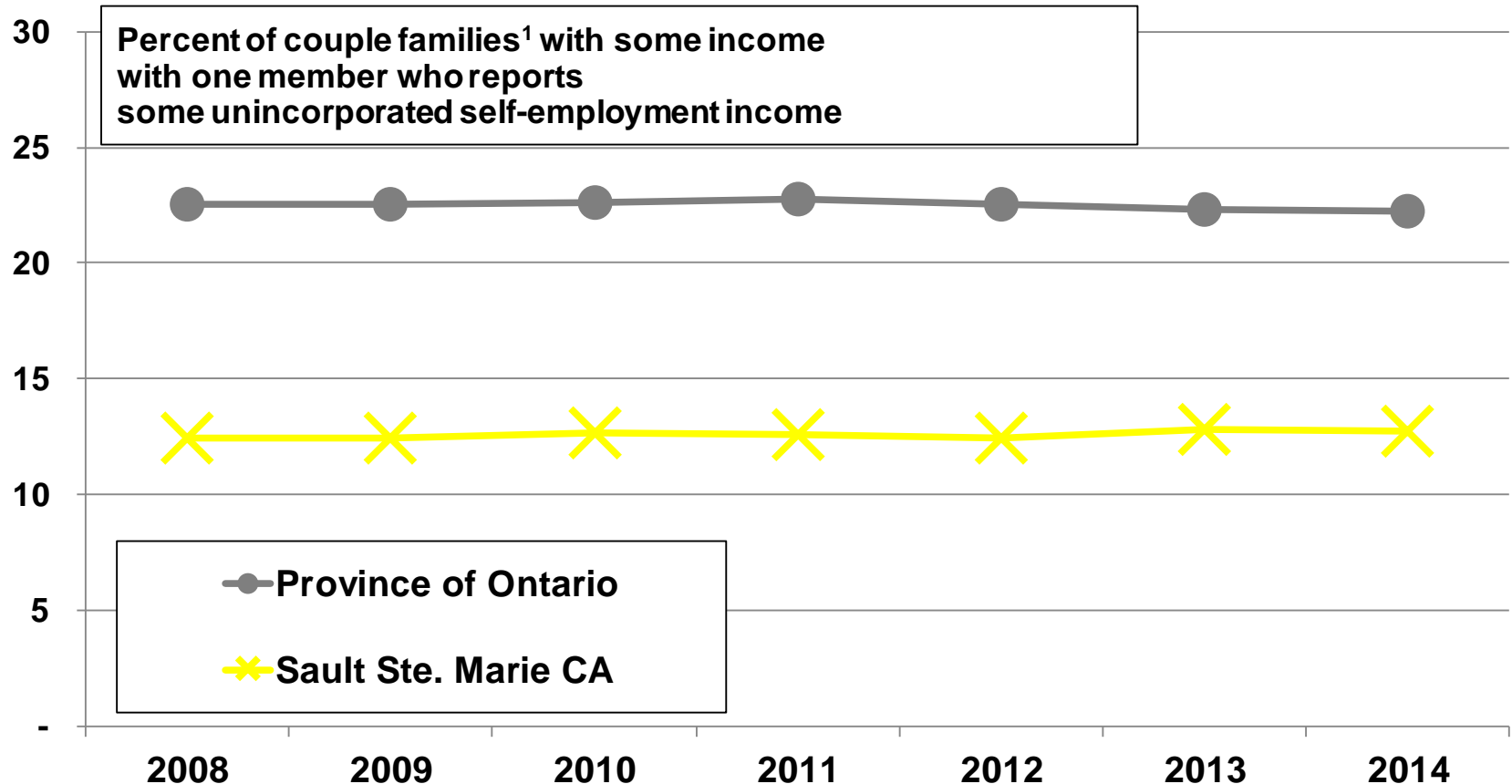

The percent of couple families¹ reporting some self-employment income: Sault Ste. Marie CA²

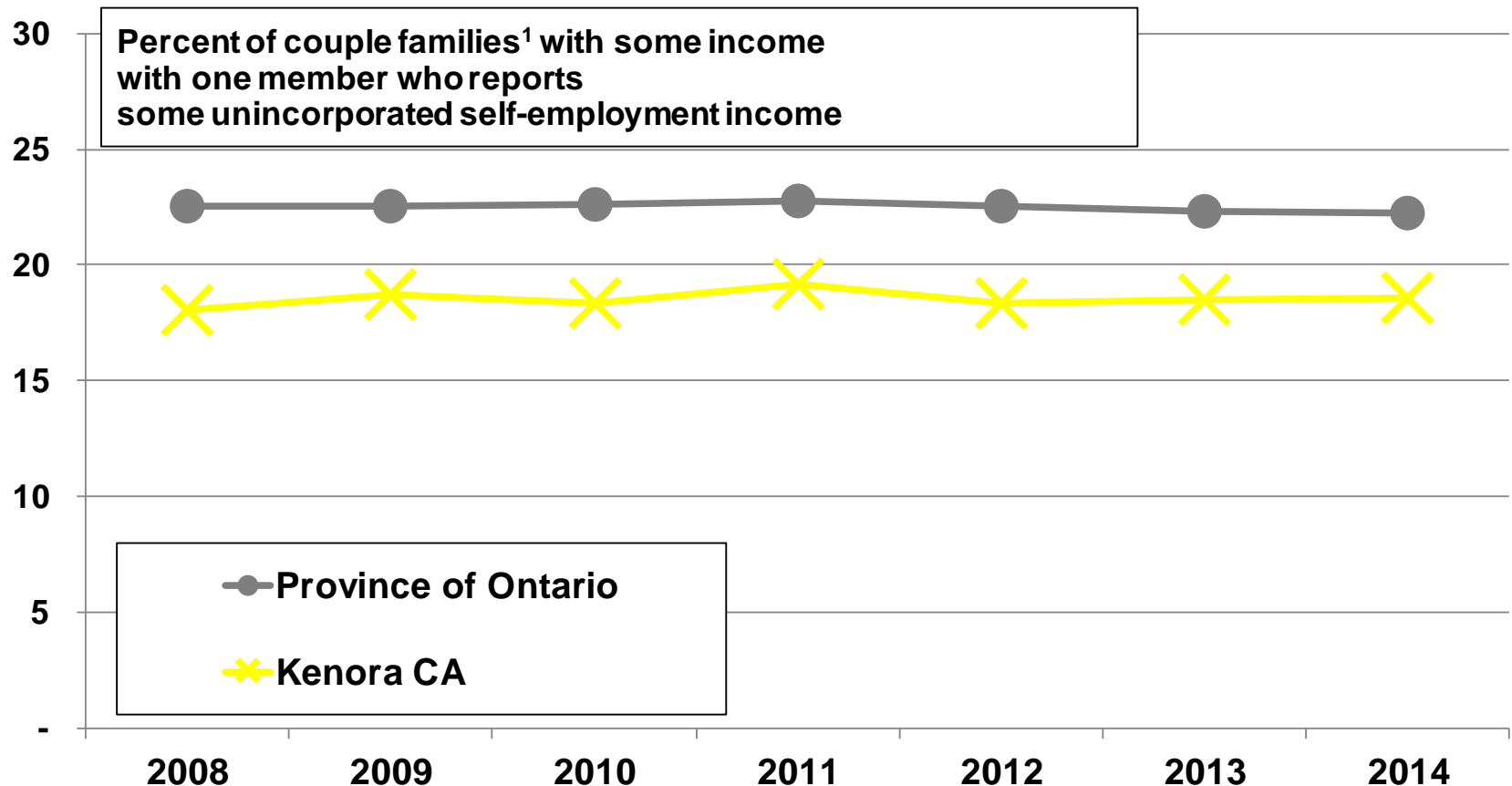

The percent of couple families¹ reporting some self-employment income: Kenora CA²

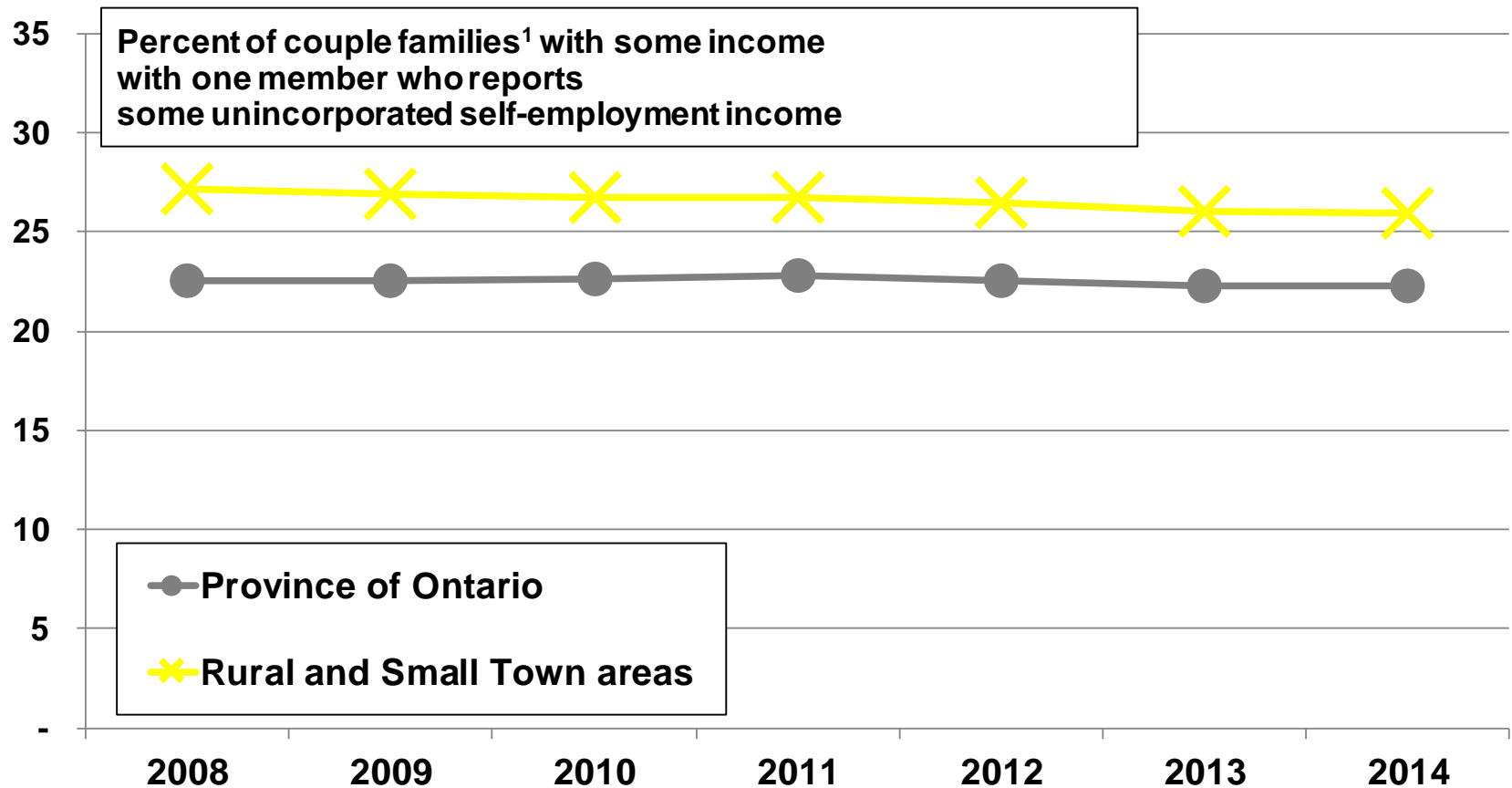
