Announcing AALP Class 17

Guelph, ON, July 10, 2017 – Eighteen current and emerging leaders in agriculture, agrifood and rural sectors have been selected to participate in the 17th class of the Advanced Agricultural Leadership Program (AALP). Class 17 will begin their leadership journey on October 1, 2017 at their first seminar in Guelph, Ontario.

"AALP is one of the longest-running agricultural leadership programs in the world. The 18 participants of Class 17 bring an interesting variety of backgrounds and occupational experience to the program. The mix of sectors in the group will provide a variety of perspectives and will allow the class to learn from each other, as well as from seminar speakers throughout AALP," said Teresa van Raay, an AALP alumnus and chair of the AALP advisory committee.

Seven class members are primary producers or involved in family-run farming operations. The remaining eleven come from agri-business and agri-food and legal sectors, non-government and commodity associations, the provincial government and various agencies. The class ranges in age from 26 to 63.
