opportunities

» Increased personal wealth in many rural regions

» Multiple assets of value in rural communities (land, equipment, rights)

» Strong sense of community and attachment among rural residents, both current and former





challenges

» Lack of familiarity with philanthropy

» Endowment building is not a short-term initiative

» limited connection between foundations and local community leaders and organizations

» Administration and operation of a foundations is not necessarily straight forward

» Some communities in 'survival mode'





place-based endowments in the periphery

» 4 year applied research initiative to examine how community endowments can be utilized to support, revitalize, and sustain rural places

» Key activities

» work with 4-6 rural communities/regions

» build transfer of wealth formula for rural Canada

key messages

- Rural communities are sites of considerable wealth, although we don't truly know how much nor for how long.
- 2. Philanthropy, through community foundations, represents a critical mechanism that can support rural community revitalization and sustainability.
- 3. There is a disconnect between public policy, philanthropy, and rural communities. Further work is required for rural communities to maximize the benefits of philanthropy.
